Armavia launches extra flights to Aleppo

Armavia Air Company is launching additional Yerevan-Aleppo-Yerevan flights to enable more Syrian-Armenians to leave the war-stricken country as soon as possible.

"Despite the ongoing clashes in Syria, and especially in Aleppo, the national air carrier is extending the helping hand to our Syrian-Armenian compatriots to take them away from war zone. The Armavia air company plans to operate an additional Yerevan-Aleppo-Yerevan flight starting from August 1. The additional flights will be operated by 108-seat Boeing on August 8, 15, 22 and 29," the statement reads.

Repeated chance

The fifth regular presidential election was held on July 19 in the Nagorno Karabakh Republic (NKR, the Republic of Artsakh), unrecognized by the international community. According to official data of the Central Election Commission (CEC), 72,958 out of nearly 100,000 (to be more precise, 99,227) registered voters received ballot papers. 47,095 voters or 66.7% of those who received ballot papers have voted for the incumbent President Bako Sahakyan. Former Deputy Minister of Defense, Major General Vitaly Balasanyan gained 22,967 votes or 32.5%, and the third presidential candidate, Deputy Chancellor of the Stepanakert Branch of the Armenian State Agrarian University Arkady Soghmonyan received 593 votes or 0.8%.

It is the first time in the history of the NKR that a runner-up in the presidential election or a "silver medalist" has received one third of the votes. This is an extremely high index in the political history of the NKR. It highlights the circumstance

that one third of the voters support changes or are more or less discontented with the state of affairs in some sphere or other in the country.

On the other hand, the outcome of the election shows that two thirds of voters back the incumbent president's course, which allows him to adhere to his previous policy, especially as all the parliamentary parties without exception (the ARF-Dashnaktsutyun, the Democratic Party of Artsakh, and Free Fatherland) backed him in the last election.


It should be mentioned that in partially recognized states of the South Caucasus such as Abkhazia and South Ossetia, it is not uncommon for a "silver medalist" to poll more than one third of votes in a presidential election. The matter concerns first of all the 2004 presidential election in Abkhazia and the presidential elections held in South Ossetia in 2001 and 2011-2012. As regards the recognized states in the South Caucasus such as Azerbaijan and Georgia, according to official data of the elections, the "silver

Briefing of Hovik Abrahamyan and Sergey Narishkin in the National Assembly

On July 24 National Assembly President Hovik Abrahamyan and Speaker of the RF Federal Assembly State Duma Sergey Narishkin, who arrived in Armenia on official visit, had a joint briefing.

Summing up the results of the visit, Hovik Abrahamyan noted that numerous issues relating to bilateral relations were discussed, which were connected with economy, science, education and partnership in humanitarian and other spheres, the intensification and development of inter-parliamentary cooperation had been emphasized. "Taking into consideration the allied and strategic relations of Armenia and Russia, we also underlined the need of deepening the cooperation in international parliamentary structures. The necessity of unified position in the issues of mutual importance and the role of parliamentary diplomacy in strengthening the inner-state relations was especially stressed,"



the Head of the Armenian Parliament noted.

Talking about effective cooperation in the Parliamentary Assembly of the Collective Security Treaty Organization (CSTO PA) he also said that in September the first consultation of the Committees on Security and Defense of the parliaments of the CSTO member countries will be held in Yerevan.

In Hovik Abrahamyan's word, taking into consideration the close

cooperation shaped between the two parliaments and the necessity of deepening the partnership, the Armenian side has proposed to discuss the possibility of forming the Institute of the representatives of the two parliaments in the National Assembly of the Republic of Armenia and the State Duma of the Russian Federation.

As the RA National Assembly President noted, during the meeting with the Head of the RF Federal


The parties highly appreciated the role of the inter-parliamentary diplomacy in the further development of relations and deepening of cooperation.

Russian-Armenian "unshakeable relations" are the cornerstone of Armenia's security, Armenian President says

On July 24, President Serzh Sargsyan received the Speaker of the Federal Assembly of the State Duma of the Russian Federation Sergey Naryshkin and his delegation.

The President expressed hope that the visit of the Speaker of the Federal Assembly of the State Duma of the Russian Federation would give a new impetus to the steadily developing Armenian-Russian strategic partnership. Serzh Sargsyan praised the personal contribution of Mr. Naryshkin to the strengthening of friendly relations between the two countries. He also underscored that Armenia was interested in the further deepening of its relations with Russia which have solid historical grounds and which develop in the spirit of allied partnership. According to Serzh Sargsyan, these unshakeable relations are a cornerstone of Armenia's security.

In his turn, Speaker of the Federal Assembly of the State Duma of the Russian Federation also expressed satisfaction with the high level of the strategic partnership of the two countries and stressed that Russia highly values development of relations and cooperation



with Armenia, which according to Sergey Naryshkin, have become even more dynamic in the last ten years. S. Naryshkin highlighted the importance of interparliamentary diplomacy in the strengthening the relations between Armenia and Russia and assured that together with the colleagues from the Armenian parliament they would do their best to ensure further deepening of the relations between the two friendly peoples and states.

The Armenian Minister of Foreign Affairs participated in the EU and EaP Ministerial meeting

On July 23 in Brussels Foreign Minister Edward Nalbandian participated in the meeting of the Foreign Ministers of the European Union and Eastern Partnership.

Catherine Ashton, the High Representative of the Union for Foreign Affairs & Security Policy/Vice-President of the European Commission and Štefan Füle, the Commissioner for Enlargement and European Neighbourhood Policy attended the meeting, as well. Addressing at the meeting, the Armenian Minister of Foreign Affairs said that the passed road of the Eastern Partnership from Prague founding summit to Warsaw summit, including the activities implemented ahead of upcoming Vilnius summit are the proof of the viability of the project.

"The EaP Ministerial meetings give a good opportunity to exchange views on various issues related to the promotion of the cooperation, to sum up completed works and to present expectations, as well as to undertake new steps. It is a pleasure for me to note that after two years since the launching of the Association Agreement, Armenia has achieved significant progress-so far 28 Chapters of the Association Agreement from 29 have been closed and there is just a Chapter left in one sphere to agree upon. Based on a positive experience accumulated during the negotiations over the Associations Agreement, Armenia expects to have a smooth progress in the negotiations over the creation of a Deep and Comprehensive Free Trade Area. We intend to come to the final stage of the negotiations until the Vilnius summit.

Fostering mobility and people-to-people contacts is another important element of the cooperation. I am pleased to note that the agreements on visa regime facilitation and readmission are now about to be finalized and in the near



future we are looking forward to sign and ratify them,' said Minister Nalbandian.

In the course of the Ministerial meeting a joint declaration was adopted where the sides stressed that the road map presented by the EU High Representative and Vice-President of the European Commission is a good basis ahead of the Vilnius summit to guide with the goals elaborated at the Prague and Warsaw summits.

It was mentioned that the next EaP Ministerial meeting to be held in 2013 would be a good opportunity to review and outline the further steps to be undertaken.

Ahead of the meeting Edward Nalbandian met with Štefan Füle, the Commissioner for Enlargement and European Neighbourhood Policy. During the meeting the sides had a thorough talk on the organization issues related to the convening of the donors' conference providing support to the reforms in Armenia, as well as the schedule of upcoming high-level visits. The interlocutors touched upon the negotiations over the Association Agreement, visa regime facilitation, readmission and the creation of a Deep and Comprehensive Free Trade Area, as well as discussed a number of issues related to the interaction

between Armenia and the European Union. In the evening of the same day the Armenian Minister of Foreign Affairs met with Didier Reynders, the Belgian Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Foreign Affairs.

The Ministers of Foreign Affairs of Armenia and Belgium had a thorough talk on a wide range of bilateral issues, touched upon the intensification of political dialogue between the two countries, the expansion of legal framework, the holding of regular consultations between the MFAs of the two countries, the promotion of economic cooperation and the steps to be undertaken for the intensification of inter-parliamentary ties. During the talks the sides exchanged views on the Armenia-EU relations.

In the course of the talk between Edward Nalbandian and Didier Reynders the cooperation in the frames of the International Organization of the Francophonie were touched upon. Upon the request of the Belgian Minister of Foreign Affairs, the Armenian Minister of Foreign Affairs presented the efforts exerted towards the settlement of the Nagorno-Karabakh issue.

Edward Nalbandian invited his Belgian counterpart Didier Reynders to pay a visit to Armenia.

Political intrigue in Gyumri: Long-time mayor's return is in question



The Mayor of Gyumri has resigned his post as head of Shirak regional branch of the ruling Republican Party of Armenia (RPA), sparking speculation that without his party's support he will not run for the mayor of Armenia's "second city" during the local government elections slated for September 9.

Vardan Ghukasyan, who has been in the news as much for his personal controversies as for his politics, has been running the city for 14 years. He has said that he will definitely seek re-election, saying that citizens demand his continued service.

When asked by journalists about his resignation, Ghukasyan only said: "It is what needed to be done".

Others following Armenian politics say Ghukasyan's resignation should be viewed in light of another event. Specifically, the Prosperous Armenia Party has nominated its

National Assembly Deputy, Samvel Balasanyan to run for the mayoral post. It has been reported that prior to announcing his candidacy, Balasanyan had a meeting with President Serzh Sargsyan, head of the RPA, during which he got the presidents "approval".

Further speculation is that an agreement has been struck between the PAP and the RPA, which would give the mayor's race to Balasanyan. It is noteworthy that at the past parliamentary elections the PAP got more votes than the RPA in Gyumri.

Vahan Tumasyan, head of Shirak Center NGO in Gyumri, believes that Ghukasyan's leaving is an opportunity to weed out corruption.

"The real owner and head of Gyumri during the recent decade and until now is the criminal mob, and Gyumretsis, at least 99 percent of them, are its humble servant. At this moment the most important

issue is the decriminalization of Gyumri, and now its possibility is quite nearer than ever. It could be done only this way," Tumasyan says.

Political analyst Yervand Bozoyan believes that the RPA refuses to support Ghukasyan anymore, and yields Gyumri to protect its own reputation.

"Vardanik [meaning Ghukasyan] has created a criminal zone in Gyumri during these years, and with his family has defamed himself and the RPA so much that the RPA understood he has no chances to be reelected, and if he is nominated he will disgrace the party. Meanwhile PAP has managed to capitalize Gyumretsis' protest, to become a force that would be a counterbalance to Vardanik. And the RPA has decided to sacrifice Vardanik in order to protect its own reputation," Bozoyan told ArmeniaNow, adding that at the moment the RPA has no other person in Gyumri to nominate other than Ghukasyan, and time would be needed to find such a figure.

The situation is tense in Gyumri against the background of these events. On Sunday online newspapers released an open letter, where a group of Gyumretsis have expressed their concerns over Ghukasyan's family, in particular his son - Spartak Ghukasyan - who is known for his allegedly-illegal behavior.

At the same time, according to Shirakcenter.org, the mayor's son has voiced threats and swearing near Balasanyan's house saying: "You will not enjoy it."

Justice Minister: Planned reforms will end "doubts, concerns, complaints"



Armenians will stop complaining about a lack of justice in their country as a result of sweeping reforms of the judicial and law-enforcement system planned by the government, Justice Minister Hrayr Tovmasyan said on July 24.

Tovmasyan referred to a four-year reform plan that was drafted by his ministry and approved by President Serzh Sargsyan last month. It envisages wide-ranging changes in the work of courts and law-enforcement bodies as well as legislative initiatives such as the adoption of a new Criminal Code.

"I don't know if I will be minister then, but I can assure you that as a result of the implementation of this program you will be asking totally different questions in four years from now," Tovmasyan told journalists after presenting the document at a public discussion in Yerevan. He declared that Armenians will stop having "doubts, concerns and complaints" about judicial independence and overall administration of justice.

The Armenian judiciary and security apparatus have repeatedly undergone structural changes

since the mid-1990s. Public trust in them remains low, however, with the police and other security services continuing to abuse human rights and courts rarely making decisions opposed by the government and prosecutors. Only about 2 percent of individuals charged with various crimes in Armenia were acquitted last year.

"There is a lack of justice in Armenia. The courts, including the Constitutional Court, are not independent," Felix Tokhyan, a Constitutional Court judge, publicly stated earlier this month. Tokhyan complained in particular that Armenian judges challenging the authorities run the risk of arbitrary dismissal.

The reform plan presented by Tovmasyan calls for the introduction of more objective criteria for evaluating the performance of the judges. The Justice Council, a state body overseeing the judiciary, has been accused by many lawyers of arbitrarily punishing judges.

"I can't say that our courts are the most just courts in the world," said Tovmasyan. "But we have taken many, many steps that are not visible at the moment".

medalists" there have never managed to receive over one third of votes.

As for Armenia, it was only in 1996 that the "silver medalist" gained more than one third of the votes in the presidential election (the presidential candidate in question is Vazgen Manukyan who polled about 42% of votes).

According to official data, Stepan Demirchyan - the presidential candidate who proceeded to a second-round run-off in 2003 - gained slightly more than 30% of votes, while ex-President Levon Ter-Petrosyan received 21% of votes during the 2008 presidential election.

It is noteworthy that based on the outcome of the 2003 election, the Armenian authorities refused to carry out the Constitutional Court's ruling to hold a vote of confidence in the incumbent head of state Robert Kocharyan. As far as the 2008 presidential election is concerned, it was said in the memorandum sent by acting U.S. Ambassador Joseph Pennington to the Department of State that the ex-President Levon Ter-Petrosyan actually gained up to 35% of votes and a second round of voting was to be held.

The current post-election configuration in the NKR allows us to say that there are now favorable conditions for strong political opposition to be formed in that unrecognized state of the South Caucasus.

Such an opportunity first arose in the post-war NKR in 2004 when Edward Aghabekyan won the second round of Stepanakert mayoral election and then founded Movement - 88 Party. However, strong political opposition has not formed later in the NKR for a variety of objective and subjective reasons. The outcome of the 2012 election offers a repeated chance of that.

This chance is based not only on one third of votes gained by V. Balasanyan and his charisma as a Hero of the 1991-1994 War, but also on the intellectual support given to him by former Deputy Foreign Minister of the NKR Masis Mailyan (the "silver medalist" of the 2007 presidential election) who currently serves as Chairman of the Public Council for Foreign and Security Policy of the NKR.

Besides, the abovementioned Movement - 88 Party led by Edward Aghabekyan, as well as a small party called Social Justice may become basic political organizations for opposition. Karen Ohanjanyan, the leader of Social Justice Party, is also the coordinator of Helsinki - 92 Committee in Nagorno Karabakh.

As regards V. Balasanyan, presently he is a military man, rather than a politician, which is obvious even from his election campaign videos. The transformation from a military man to a politician is a rather complex process, but the first steps taken by the general can be assessed as quite successful.

The future of the opposition in the NKR will depend to a large extent on:

- the steadiness of its financing and structural organization;
- the ability to adequately react to domestic and external situations;

- the ability to make one's positions clear to society;

- regular participation in election campaigns at all levels.

There are all prerequisites for this. Moreover, being an unaffiliated deputy of the parliament who was elected in a single-mandate constituency, V. Balasanyan stands a chance of forming a small deputy group composed of the current parliament's deputies elected in such constituencies.

The proper functioning of steadfast and strong opposition in the NKR is one of the most important conditions for the formation of the unrecognized republic's statehood.

On the whole, voting passed off peacefully and in line with the law, which was confirmed by numerous observers (including parliamentarians) from the United States, Russia, Canada, France, Germany, Austria, the Czech Republic, Ireland, Poland, Cyprus, Hungary, Bulgaria, Israel, Argentina, Uruguay, as well as from Abkhazia, South Ossetia, and Transdniestria.

V. Balasanyan recognized the election outcome with some reservations and did not congratulate the winner Bako Sahakyan.

The reaction of the international community to the presidential election in Nagorno Karabakh was, on the one hand, expected and usual. In particular, the matter concerns the negative reaction of Baku and Ankara. Particularly, Turkey's Ministry of Foreign Affairs called the presidential election in the NKR "yet another attempt to unilaterally legalize the illegal actions".

NATO, the European Union, Latvia, and Georgia issued statements about non-recognition of the election held in the NKR.

On the other hand, the statement of the Co-Chairs of the OSCE Minsk Group, namely Robert Bradtke (U.S.), Igor Popov (Russia), and Jacques Faure (France) was more adequate. They stated that they acknowledge the need for de facto authorities of Nagorno Karabakh to strive to organize social life of the population democratically by means of such procedures, adding at the same time that "like other countries, the three countries co-chairing the OSCE Minsk Group do not recognize Karabakh as an independent and sovereign state" and that the July 19 electoral procedures "in no way impact the final legal status of Nagorno Karabakh and the results of the current negotiations on a lasting and peaceful settlement of the Nagorno Karabakh conflict".

In conclusion, we should point out another important peculiarity of the last presidential election in the NKR. The fact of the matter is that this was the second national election in the NKR (the first was the 2010 parliamentary election), in which voters of the new generation took part. They were born in a state, which is de facto independent of Azerbaijan, although it is unrecognized by the international community. Also important is the circumstance that the proportion of new-generation voters in the NKR will grow with each year.

The OSCE to support the expansion of the women participation in political life

The head of the OSCE Yerevan Office, Ambassador Andrey Sorokin announced a number of initiatives, which will contribute to expansion of women's participation in the political life on the eve of the Armenian 2012-2013 local and presidential elections. The Government of the Netherlands provides financial assistance for the implementation of the programme.

"The participation of women in economic and political spheres, as well as in public life is an important factor to provide a democratic progress. Women's positive impact in public life is undeniable", noted Sorokin.

A number of events will be implemented within the framework of the project, including training seminars on best practices to encourage women as leaders, decision makers and candidates, to improve



gender issues in policy development, capacities for effective advocacy and work with media.

"I am impressed by the determination and enthusiasm of civil society and believe that their work will help to provide women's high participation in the local elections," mentioned the Netherlands Ambassador Pieter Jan Langenberg after a meeting with the representatives of the public organizations, which will implement the programmes.

Georgia's neutrality in Karabakh conflict is more effective - Armenian ambassador

Georgia's neutrality in the Karabakh conflict issue is the more effective position, Armenia's Ambassador to Georgia, Hovhannes Manukyan, told News.ge.

He recalled that the OSCE Minsk Group was established to settle the conflict, and the settlement talks are conducted along its lines.

"Armenia is convinced that this format is contemporaneous, and it exerts political efforts to achieve success within its framework," noted the Ambassador, and added:

"Sadly, the cases of Azerbaijan's ceasefire violations have increased in recent times, and this resulted in a great number of human losses at the line of contact of the parties.

[But] Armenia does not leave these provocations unanswered. The number of Azerbaijan's casualties exceeds that of the Armenian



side, but our severe reaction is forced and it aims to not allow for the conflict's escalation.

The Armenian side does not respond to sporadic shots. Azerbaijan's tactic shows that this country does not wish to follow the principle of peacefully settling the conflict.

And with respect to Georgia's neutrality toward the given conflict, this is the more effective position, as of today, which could contribute to peaceful settlement of the Karabakh conflict."

Great Britain supports Nagorno-Karabakh conflict peaceful settlement within Minsk Group format

Great Britain is assisting the peaceful regulation of Nagorno Karabakh issue within the framework of OSCE Minsk Group operations. British Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to Azerbaijan Peter Bateman came forth with the statement, Armenpress reports citing Azerbaijani mass media.

"Jointly with our European partners we are ready to step up efforts for the peaceful settlement of the issue based on the principles of self-determination, territorial integrity and non-use of force" Bateman noted.

To the question how the diplomat refers to Nagorno Karabakh current

stage and whether Great Britain is for Euro Union role activation in the process, Bateman was quoted as saying, "Great Britain is not a key player in conflict settlement: it is the OSCE Minsk Group headed by Co-Chairing states to deal with the issue.

Referring to the application of Northern Ireland conflict sample in the case of Nagorno Karabakh, Bateman stated Northern Ireland conflict's emerging preconditions differ from that of the NK conflict. However, the Ambassador underscored that there were common traits between these two processes, which if necessary will be utilized in Nagorno Karabakh conflict settlement.



US congressmen continue praising Nagorno Karabakh presidential elections

Members of Congress, among them Representatives Howard Berman (D-CA), the Ranking Democrat on the House Foreign Affairs Committee, Brad Sherman (D-CA), a senior member of this influential panel, and Adam Schiff (D-CA) continue to congratulate the citizens and leaders of Nagorno Karabakh on the democratic conduct of their most recent presidential elections, reported the Armenian National Committee of America (ANCA).

The legislators join Reps. Ed Royce (R-CA) and Frank Pallone (D-NJ), the Co-Chairmen of the Armenian Caucus in welcoming Nagorno Karabakh's July 19th Presidential balloting, which resulted in the reelection of incumbent Bako Sahakian over two challengers. Some 110 international observers, including those from the U.S., Canada, EU, former Soviet republics, and Armenia gave high marks to the elections.

In a statement issued immediately after the election, Rep. Berman said: "I commend the people of Nagorno Karabakh for continuing to organize their governance on a democratic basis. I also congratulate President Sahakian on his success in the July 19 election. I wish him good luck in leading Nagorno-Karabakh toward a final settlement of the Nagorno-Karabakh issue, one that fully respects the right of Nagorno-Karabakh to self-determination."

Congressman Sherman, who led the initial charge back in the mid-1990s for direct U.S. aid to Nagorno Karabakh, said: "I congratulate President Bako Sahakian of the Republic of Nagorno Karabakh on his reelection. Since independence, Artsakh has developed a democracy and a vibrant civil society despite remarkably

difficult challenges. I also congratulate the people of Artsakh on their record of democratization. I will continue to work in the House Foreign Affairs Committee to make sure our foreign policy is supportive of the independence and prosperity of the Nagorno Karabakh Republic."

Rep. Schiff issued a statement congratulating the citizens of Nagorno Karabakh on the conduct of free and fair elections: "Last Thursday, the people of Artsakh went to their polls to elect a new president in what has been widely reported as a free and fair election. I offer my congratulations to President Bako Sahakian, and wish him well as Nagorno-Karabakh Republic continues its hard-won progress." He added that, "By their continuing devotion to freedom and democracy, despite two decades of violence and threats from its larger, richer and undemocratic neighbor, the people of Artsakh have reminded the world of their commitment to representative government. Their cause is our cause, and they will continue to have my strongest support."

"I couldn't be prouder of the highly successful free and fair presidential election in Nagorno Karabakh," said Rep. Anna Eshoo (D-CA), who, along with Rep. Jackie Speier (D-CA), is one of two Members of Congress of Armenian heritage. "Despite decades of violence and threats from overpowering, undemocratic neighbors, the people of Artsakh have maintained an unwavering commitment to freedom and democracy, and they will always have my support."

Rep. Speier concurred, noting "Democracy lives in Nagorno Karabakh! The fifth free and fair presidential election in the

Republic is a true testament to the commitment and independence of its people and proof that Democracy can bloom in an area of the world where there is little."

Congressman David Cicilline (D-RI), whose home state of Rhode Island has recognized the Republic of Nagorno Karabakh, stated: "I congratulate the Nagorno Karabakh Republic on holding another free and fair presidential election - showcasing democracy in action for the rest of the world. In addition, I would like to recognize the invaluable contributions of former Rhode Island Attorney General Patrick Lynch, who assisted as an international observer."

Rep. Jim Costa, who represents much of California's Central Valley, said: "The United States stands with the people of Nagorno Karabakh because our citizens share so many of the same foundational ideals, including a commitment to the values of freedom, human rights, self-determination and democracy. With these most recent elections, the people of the Nagorno Karabakh Republic have truly lived up to the promise of democracy,"

As reported earlier, Rep. Pallone welcomed Artsakh's elections by noting, "It is heartening to see [Nagorno Karabakh's] continued dedication to peaceful democracy," adding that, "I am pleased the Republic continues to hold regular parliamentary and presidential elections that have previously been viewed as free and fair by international observers." Rep. Royce stressed that: "These elections represent the strength of the democratic process in the Nagorno Karabakh Republic and are a testament to the commitment of the people in Artsakh to the Republic's sovereignty."

The success of anti-Armenian resolutions in Swedish Parliament is almost impossible

The possibilities of Turkish initiative to adopt resolutions on Nagorno-Karabakh in Swedish Parliament are almost impossible. Armenpress was informed about this from President of Congress of Armenians in Europe Karo Hakobyan. Hakobyan highlighted that Swedish parliamentary parties have stable formed opinions about Armenian Genocide, the Republic of Armenia, Nagorno-Karabakh and Azerbaijan.

"The possibility of success of the bill presented by Turkish deputy Mehmed Kaplan is very negligible but it does not mean that we should stop to be careful" assured Hakobyan. In his words during the discussions before the holidays the last initiative of that deputy on Artsakh was failed. In it was mentioned that Armenians have "occupied" Karabakh and it must be under the control of Azerbaijan. The Turkish deputy represented the approaches of Azerbaijani side. The deputies of



the Parliament were against this project. There even were not concrete discussions and the bill failed. The Turk Deputy represents the party of "Greens" which is against any anti-Armenian policy; it means that the initiatives of the deputy are personal" he highlighted.

"There are not any pro-Azerbaijani approaches in Sweden, just the opposite public institutions, Parliament and Media have very strict position on that country, especially after the song

contest "Eurovision 2012" mentioned Hakobyan. He informed that a Swedish deputy was implementing a lobby for Azerbaijan. And even the Prime Minister condemned it declaring that "Such work for dictatorial country like Azerbaijan is unacceptable".

Mehmed Kaplan already for a long time tries to provide service for the Azerbaijani authorities and to present an issue about Nagorno-Karabakh in Swedish Parliament representing the official position of Azerbaijan.



Defense Minister **Seyran Ohanyan** received General van Der Meyer on Thursday, MOD Press service informs.

During the meeting, they discussed the prospects for experience exchange, the approaches toward the challenges facing modern medical services, adjusting of work methods, and carrying out effective cooperation between the Armenian Armed Forces' Department of Military Medicine and the medical services of the armed forces of NATO member countries.

It was recorded that effective cooperation can be implemented between the Armenian Armed Forces' Department of Military

Medicine and the Kingdom of the Netherlands Armed Forces Military Medical Service, by way of making use of the opportunities for conducting professional training and holding joint military medical exercises and symposiums.



On July 23 First Deputy Defense Minister **Davit Tonoyan** had a meeting with the Head of Program Implementation Division of Swiss Foundation for Mine Action **Valery Fabroni**. Col. Mkrtumyan met with field assistants of the Personal Representatives of OSCE Chairman-in-Office Antal Herdich and Irjie Aberle on Wednesday after the monitoring held along the line of contact between the armed forces of Armenia and Azerbaijan.

"Firing at peaceful citizens is a serious violation of the Geneva Convention. Targeted fire at the peaceful citizens is equal to murder," Mkrtumyan said.

Referring to a series of provocations undertaken by Azerbaijan within the last month, the representative of the General Staff said that during the previous monitoring Armenia stated that it would be reluctant to resort to retaliatory measures.

"However, we were forced to undertake adequate actions to finally calm down the Azerbaijani side. Therefore, I am asking once again let the Azeri side know that our patience is not endless. Armenian soldiers adhere to the Geneva Convention but our patience may run out, they felt it a month ago," said Mkrtumyan.

The rep of the General Staff said that the Armenian side offered to hold direct meetings between the representatives of the commands, and representatives of local communities in the future.

"I am sure this will have a positive impact on maintaining the ceasefire. In addition, we have evidence that the Azeris, the residents of border villages, attacked with sticks the soldiers who were firing at our villages. This suggests that peaceful population of Azerbaijan does not welcome the shooting at Armenian civilians," he concluded.

Meanwhile the RA MOD disseminated an info according to which on July 26, at around 06:00 am, in the north - eastern part of the Armenian - Azerbaijani border/contact line, a serviceman of the Azerbaijani Republic Armed Forces **Firuz Farazov** has crossed the border and so has surrendered to the Armenian militaries.

The Azerbaijani has been arrested, investigation is being carried out, said **Artsrun Hovhannisyan**, the Press Secretary of Defense Minister.

Meanwhile the Azerbaijani side has issued a statement which said that the soldier had got lost that's why he was found on the Armenian side.

Commenting on the above-mentioned statement, Mr Hovhannisyan told Panorama.am that "Normally, at 06:00 am a soldier either should be asleep or should be on frontier position. A soldier crossing the border of his adversary waving a white flag doesn't seem to be lost."

At the same time, Movses village Head **Lyudvig Aperyanyan** claimed that no day passes without shots, while the Aygepar village Head **Andranik Aydinyan** added that shots targeted at peaceful residents have become more frequent.

Two civilians were wounded by the Azerbaijani bullets in June and July.

OSCE field officers, accompanied by the RA Armed Forces reps, visited also Nerqin Karmiraghbyur village where they met local resident **Gor Piloyan** who was wounded on July 21 due to shooting from Azerbaijani side when the latter was doing agricultural works.

The Armenian side is ready to remove snipers from the border, an Armenian military said.

World Vision Summer Camps are now supported by Cronimet Foundation

Amongst tough economic conditions of their families that lead to their untimely maturity and bothersome life, many of Armenian children can only share just one joyful highlight in their lives - the summer days they spent in World Vision's Christian Summer Camps. It is almost 14 years World Vision turns the summer of vulnerable children in Armenia into uninterrupted moments of enjoyment when games, food, intellectual and sports activities are all fun. Church and Government Relations Manager at World Vision Armenia Karine Harutyunyan kindly agreed to tell more about the Camps.

- 14 years on now, we can see how well established are World Vision's Christian Summer Camps. How did the programme start and was it all that easy at the beginning?

- Some 14 years ago, World Vision had less presence in Armenia, and of course the organization did not have as many staff members back then. At the beginning we initiated yard camps in three communities of Armenia and our aim was to create a somewhat different environment for children who used to spend their summers idly at home. We developed a busy schedule with games, development and recreation activities for yard campers. Also, balanced meal was provided to them several times a day. We wanted children's parents to feel secure for their kids and not worry about them during the day. With the scarce human resources, yet due to immense efforts, our experience turned to be very positive. Gradually we reached the point when the camps became full-time and currently last seven to ten days. More importantly, we recruit children from all 199 communities that World Vision works at.

- Why do you think that Summer Camps are vital for children?

- We are all aware about the statistics that every third child in Armenia is considered poor, aren't we? We are also aware that the majority of parents, especially in rural areas, often struggle because of the scarce financial means and that their children have no opportunities for an arranged holiday during the summer period. World Vision's Summer Camps proved to

be a life-changing experience for nearly 2,000 campers each year that provides an ample chance to be refreshed and to build deeper life skills - such as communication, perseverance, listening, problem-solving and teamwork. There is no



reason for kids to be bored in the camp when there is a whole world of outdoor play waiting for them. Sports activities for kids are designed for everyone there. Campers are also given classes in hygiene, nutrition, as well as, traditional forms of art such as sewing, drawing, singing, theatre-performing are also taught. All these kinds of fun is mixed with well-maintained accommodations and four-times meal a day.

- World Vision Camps are



Christian and Bible study classes are practiced there. Could you tell more about that?

- World Vision's main mandate is to stand next to the Armenian Church with the mission to support and give a hand to the most vulner-

able in communities. Bible study classes are inspiring for campers as the students for the Theological Seminary of Holy See teach them Christian values and together with them pilgrimage to ancient Armenian churches. World



Vision's aim is to promote more for the young spiritual leaders to know better their community young members, as well as children to see



that their spiritual leaders are young, very friendly, human and supportive. We wanted to break the stereotype and show the campers

involved in Summer Camps initiate visits to orphanages and homes for children. One trigger for that, amongst others, is their newly acquired skill of communicating with children during the camps.

Let me also mention that the

World Vision runs other joint projects with the Armenian Apostolic Church, with the main focus on the spiritual education. We develop handouts and educational materials for Sunday school children and teachers. Besides, depending on the community needs, we establish computer classes, illuminated manuscript, sports, singing and dancing clubs and a Puppet Theatre for children and youths.

- Who are World Vision camp leaders? How is their selection



processed by World Vision Armenia?

- World Vision's Summer Camps leaders have a very important role; they volunteer, they are very caring and devoted. We select young people - either graduates

from the Pedagogic University or those who have an experience of working with children; many of them are our ex-campers. It is a must for our organization that camp leaders are trained on child protection issues, World Vision's core values and mission, as well as acquire the first aid skills. Along with children, camp leaders have to follow the set rules and camp curriculum. Three camp leaders are attached to each group of children consisting of at most 12 campers.

- How much does World Vision spend on a child during the whole stay in the camp?

- We spend in average 4000 AMD per a child per day. Let me just mention that World Vision Summer Camps are all possible due to our donors from the UK, US, Canada, France, Germany and Taiwan. These are ordinary people that have regular jobs in their countries. Most of them even have never been in Armenia. If you ask me which part of World Vision's Summer Camps is Christian, my answer will be - everything about them, because they are done with great love.

- For how many more years World Vision is going to arrange its Christian Summer Camps?

- When you visit World Vision's Summer Camps, the smiles on the faces of children speak volumes; for them a "summer camp" is a place where creativity reigns, friendships flourish and confidence grows. Summer Camps should be ongoing; there is no doubt about that. This year we tried to organize fundraising locally, within Armenia. We appreciate very much that Cronimet Foundation listened to us and donated some 12mln. AMD. That helped to recruit more children to the camps this year. It is the culture of donation that World Vision wants to instill in Armenia. We have to care for and support each other. Just want to thank all World Vision donors both abroad and our local partner Cronimet Foundation once again and say that their support is hugely appreciated!

- Thank you Ms Harutyunyan, for your time. We wish Summer Camps to be sustainable and recruit more and more children.

Armenia's economy can grow this year significantly faster than originally forecast by the government and international lending institutions, Economy Minister Tigran Davtyan insisted on July 23.

Davtyan said an economic growth target of 7 percent set by President Serzh Sargsyan is "absolutely realistic," citing strong gains in industrial and agricultural output shown by official statistics in the first half of this year.

The government forecast late last year that economic growth in the country will slightly slow to 4.2 percent in 2012. The International Monetary Fund and the World Bank came up with virtually identical fore-

casts before slightly revising them downwards this spring.

Sargsyan announced last month that a GDP growth rate of 7 percent is his "primary expectation" from his newly reshuffled government.

"I think that the fairly high 7 percent target is absolutely realistic," Davtyan told a news conference. "Of course, one can now find few economies in the world that have such programs for this year, and we will do everything to achieve such a pace of growth. Our indicators for the first six months make us optimistic."

According to first-half government data cited by Davtyan, industrial production in the country rose by

13.5 percent. The Armenian agricultural sector similarly expanded by 8 percent in this period.

The government's most recent growth data is for the first quarter of the year. It shows a 4.7 percent GDP increase.

"We can now conclude that there are quite positive economic developments," said Davtyan. "Structural changes are underway within the economy. I would call those changes positive."

The minister cautioned at the same time that faster growth targeted by the Armenian authorities could be hampered by a weak global economic environment resulting, in large measure, from Europe's sovereign debt crisis.

Asad Alam, a senior World Bank official, said last month that external factors will influence the country's macroeconomic performance. "I think the 7 percent growth rate is achievable but it is very much based upon what the government is able to do in the remaining parts of the year and also the global economic environment," Alam said in Yerevan.

8-9% growth expected in Armenia's agriculture - Minister



An 8-9-percent agricultural growth is expected in Armenia by the year's end, Agriculture Minister Sergo Karapetyan stated during a press conference on July 26.

Presenting the results for the first six months of this year, Karapetyan said there are significant improvements. Specifically, the agricultural products increased

by 8.1 percent in January-June 2012, as compared with the same time period in the year past.

Also, crops increased by 28 percent, livestock grew by 2 percent, and pisciculture went up by 25.2 percent.

There is a particularly great success in apricot collection. A total of 13,300 tons of apricot are already exported, as compared with the 7,300 tons of last year. And they will still be collected for 10-15 days. The local purchasing companies have already bought 6,150 tons of apricot, as compared with the 2,830 tons of the year past.

A high number of grapes, peach and apple crops are expected, too. And the sole problem is connected with the grain crops, yet gross harvest is up by 4-5 percent.

"Rosagrolizing" Russian subsidiary company enterprise in Armenia

"Rosagrolizing" Russian subsidiary company should be set up in Armenia in the near future. As "Armenpress" reports Minister of Agriculture Sergo Karapetyan mentioned at a news conference followed by the government session, that the company is going to take up agricultural technology, greenhouse farm equipment sales with long-term and low rates.

This year, significant changes in the agricultural sector are registered. The highest growth was registered in the field of plant-growing-28%, 25.2% growth is registered in fish-breeding and 2% in livestock sectors. "Armenia is in the leading position with the growth of livestock in the whole CIS

area. These developments will continue till the end of the year: we expect to have 8-9% growth: we have all the prerequisites for it", mentioned the minister.

To his word, there are great achievements in the fruit-growing sphere: if last year 7300 tons of apricots were exported, then in the first half of this year the amount was 12 thousand 130 tons. Storage volumes have also grown, and the harvest is still going on. There are some certain difficulties in terms of grain plants. Compared to last year, per hectare crop yield may reduce, although the total volume of gross domestic product will increase by 4-5%. "Our greatest achievement is the increase of the sowing areas

with 25 thousand 300 hectares, and the main task is the sale of the product which is provided by export", noted Sergo Karapetyan.

The minister also highlighted the harvesting process. Activities are being carried out and all the purveyor organizations operate for it.

"One of the unresolved problems is the reduction of the fertilizer prices, supply of diesel fuel and machinery-tractor parks modernization", mentioned Sergo Karapetyan.

According to the National Statistical Service in the first half of this year the volume of gross agricultural output increased by 8.1% amounting to 203 billion 575 million drams.



Government to assist Argentinean-Armenian businessman's viticulture program

The Government of Armenia on July 26 made a change in one of its previous decisions, whereby the

list of grape varieties permitted to produce Armenian brandy was specified.

And with the Government's decision, several new grape varieties are included in this list.

To note, the *Tierras de Armenia* Company started its operations in Armenia in November 2004, and it acquired a 2,300-hectare brown land. And with the Company's fifteen-year development program, at least 80 percent of this land is envisioned to become cultivable.

Around 300 hectares of vineyards are planted along the lines of this program.

Sergo Karapetyan hosted the Iranian Ambassador to Armenia

During the meeting with the newly-appointed Ambassador of the Islamic Republic of Iran Mohammad Reisi, the Armenian Agriculture Minister Sergo Karapetyan attached importance to the further expansion of bilateral connections, especially in the spheres of plant growing and cattle-breeding. "Armenpress" was informed about this in the Ministry of Agriculture.

"Here there are great unused opportunities. Last year I was in the Islamic Republic of Iran on official visit and signed a memorandum of mutual understanding on bilateral cooperation. Unfortunately, the required work on this important document is still not enough. I wish that with the ambassador's support we

fulfill the obtained agreements, as a first step creating a slaughterhouse complex with "Halal" trademark in Armenia", noted the minister.

Expressing his gratitude for the warm reception, the Ambassador expressed readiness to continue the consistent implementation of the agreements reached in the past and contribute to the further deepening of bilateral cooperation. Minister Sergo Karapetyan reminded that in the Armenian-Iranian intergovernmental commission meeting on trade-economic issues to be held in Yerevan, issues related to agriculture are included, so the Armenian side suggested to invite the Minister of Agriculture of the Islamic Republic.

"Foreign Investors Want Predictability in Armenia" Thoughts Spoken Aloud by Anthony (Tony) Moroyan, a Veteran of Silicon Valley...

Tony Moroyan is a man of a really unique life and extremely diverse professional experience. These have enabled him and people he has motivated and worked with to leave a lasting imprint on Armenia's High Tech Industry. It seems to us it wouldn't be a very big exaggeration to say that his exemplary devotion and efforts of many years has set a benchmark in Armenia for other High Tech investors.

In spite of the fact that Tony Moroyan is very well known and respected in Armenia as a top High Tech businessman and executive from the US Silicon Valley, many really do not know the extent of his expertise and achievements in the global high tech industry.

Tony has started his journey helping Armenia since 1991. Spending dedicated hours every week to help build the high tech industry in Armenia, successfully evangelizing Armenia as a preferred high tech destination for foreign investments and operations. The reason he has been able to succeed in his efforts is because of his rich and diverse hands-on experience and his extensive network in the world. Tony not only has evangelized and helped, he has also implemented much of what he had evangelized and preached about investing in Armenia both financially as well as with his time.

Many of us do not know also that Tony Moroyan's achievements and imprints are already on the High Tech industry worldwide. An industry, which has been to surpass all other industries in the world in size within 60-70 years of its debut with the invention of the electronic transistor and the integrated circuit.

It is very difficult to cover all aspects of Tony Moroyan's multidimensional achievements and capabilities as one of the influential high tech executive in the Silicon Valley, or his dedication to the Armenian community and, since 1991, his dedication to Armenia.

(Moroyan's short CV is included at the end of this story for our readers to be exposed to Tony's keen knowledge of the High Tech Industry and his achievements to give him the well deserved authority to answer the questions below about Armenia's High Tech Industry).

In this interview, I try to ask Tony Moroyan some thoughts provoking questions about Armenia's high tech industry during the last 20 years that he had been instrumental in helping to forge and some of the challenges he sees for the future relating to the high tech industry in Armenia. I am only publishing a part of our conversations during several sessions I had with him. I hope there will be the right opportunity in the near future to publish other parts of our discussions.

Gourgen James Khazhakian (G.Kh.) - Tony, what makes you tick when you hear the word "Armenia" and "Armenian"? It looks like these two words have very high priority in your life?

Tony Moroyan (T.M.) - I was brought up with strong Armenian culture and Armenian history. These further were enhanced and punctuated by my visit to Armenia in 1991. As a high tech professional all thru my life, I was lucky and blessed being right in the middle of the most exciting, dynamic and ever-changing high tech industry. I was further blessed to have extensive technical background and given the chance to have very strategic roles during my career. I had to have keen understanding of all industries and the underlying and enabling technologies all the way to the semiconductor also understand the changes that were coming faster and faster

and their impact on these industries. This is a very serious undertaking and I was in the middle of these. I and some of my teams were responsible for setting 5 to 10 years and sometimes 20 years of strategic plan for trend setting American, Japanese and European corporations. The costs for mistakes and wrong analysis were very expensive, some were over \$100 million. Having these as background, it was very natural the **topics** relating to "Armenia" and "Armenian" had very high priority for me and I devoted much time and efforts using systematic methodology that I was expert of analyzing and formulating long range outlook and vision.

G. Kh. - Can you give some examples of some of these topics?

T. M. - Here are the major topics that have my share of mind:

- Free and independent Armenia was a gift from God that happened during our live times. We have a country, we have very educated and high energy Armenians inside Armenia and outside and we have a flag that is recognized by the world. But, where are we taking Armenia next 50 or 100 years? What legacy we plan to leave for the next generations of Armenians and mankind? What projectile are we setting for Armenia? One of the most critical Core and all enabling industry that is already recognized but may not be well understood yet by everyone is the High Tech industry. Since its

birth just 20 years ago, Armenia progressed quite fast and with the hard work of many of us both from Armenia and outside Armenia, Armenia is already recognized as one of the leading high tech centers in the world in several high tech fields. But how do we keep the momentum going? I would say how do we enhance the current momentum to enable Armenia to achieve the next higher phase? Next phase is more difficult and complex. It requires more preparedness, planning and strategy. One of the key ingredients is the Outside ("Foreign") High Tech Investments. We better understand how we will be able to succeed in attracting these. My comments are based on my 20 years of extensive involvement in trying to help build this core industry in Armenia and at the same time being aware of the levels and the intensity of the efforts of other

countries as well as Armenia's neighbors.

-A real case study about Viasphere Technopark, an internationally Award winning entity that houses the highest number of high tech professionals in Yerevan, Armenia. This is the first and successful commercial High Tech Technopark and Incubator in Armenia. This is a USA investment in consultation with the USA Embassy in Armenia by a privately held corporation named Viasphere International, Inc., located at the heart of the Silicon Valley, California. At the time of acquisition in 2000-2001, the facility was a dilapidated and money loosing enterprise that was a burden on the state who owned all real estate at the collapse of the Soviet Union. Today Viasphere Technopark houses over 800 of some of the best high tech professionals in Armenia and 18 high tech entities that includes several leading edge foreign multinationals as well as foreign headquartered start-ups and domestic start-ups. The parent company, Viasphere International, Inc and its investor's vast network in the Silicon Valley, USA and other countries in Europe, South America and Japan have been very effective and instrumental in helping to build the high tech industry of Armenia. This of course has brought leading edge Multinationals and foreign investments, leading edge technologies, rich and advance

tools to the industry and universities in Armenia, recognition and testimony that Armenia has the ingredients to deliver and meet expectations in technology development. Today, Viasphere International, Inc. is taking steps to elevate the Armenia operations to new heights and closer to its original objectives and vision armed with new management in Armenia. This is in spite of obstacles the Armenia operations had encountered. Viasphere International objectives includes effective cooperation with other entities and centers in Armenia as well as multinationals and start ups inside the Viasphere Technopark or other locations in Armenia

- How do we fuel the international efforts to promote and attract foreign investments at the same time mobilize the high tech professionals of world wide Armenian Communities. Among many activities and events in Armenia and outside, is ArmTech Congress that we have founded in 2006 in collaboration with our high tech friends in the high tech industry in Armenia as well as the government and the universities of Armenia. We have delivered unprecedented Global High Tech Business Forum and Conference in 2007 and 2009 in the Silicon Valley, CA in Nov 2012. All the previous ArmTech Congresses were made possible by the generous sponsorship of **VivaCell-MTS and Synopsys Corporation as Diamond and Partner Sponsors**. Also we have to thank other category sponsors and all the volunteers both in USA, France, Armenia, Middle East, South America and other locations that spent gigantic efforts to enable top level and unparalleled such Global Events. This includes the Government of Armenia and the universities.

- An Ultimate Vision that I and few others have started to evangelize is **The PAN Armenian Vision**. We have to think daringly. We have to think and it is about time to plan for 10 years, 20 years and why not for 100 years. Vision for 50 or 100 years with objectives, strategies and tactics how to get us there starting short term (1-2 years), Mid tem, and long term and very long term (50-100 years) targeting as far as our imagination takes us to forge the Pan Armenian Vision. We have the tools and the technologies, we should have the proper efforts and methodology how to go about to build this Pan Armenian Layered Network and Armenian Centers that will act as intelligent nodes and house different layers of the Armenian communities. This is a very major undertaking and requires special discourse."

G. Kh. - How important is high

tech for Armenia and why?

T. M. - In history, Empires have been built and destroyed for many reasons. One of the most important reasons is the capability and competitive advantage of advance weapons which are the product of the advance technologies. Today more than ever in the history of the human kind the advance technology plays a very critical role. This includes materials, architecture, but above all the electronics and the power of communications and networking. It is said that Information is the ultimate wealth and weapon. Countries very fast are being differentiated as "Information Poor" and "Information Rich". The countries that cannot keep up and become "Information Poor" will lose to "Information Rich" countries. This will happen if we choose or not. If we do not choose, i.e. plan to make efforts to be "Information Rich" our faith will be decided for us and we might not like the results of the choice's.

If we analyze both the technology and Information, we see that the enabling layers are heavy dependent on High Tech which includes Information Technology.

Everything we touch at home, at work, on the road, in any vehicle, in the sea, on land, in the air or in the space is driven by High Tech. Let us take a look at Armenia and where high tech is playing a key role: Not only computers, tablet PC's but also appliances in the kitchen (Microwave oven, refrigerator, espresso makers, even knives, etc.), Entertainment systems (TV, HI FI, Cameras, projectors, any equipment), communications (cell phones, land lines, networking, IP telephony, satellite communications, etc.) Transportation (Navigations, GPS, tracking, control systems in the city, e.g. the traffic lights, etc.) banking (networking, all the terminals, ATMs, cash payment terminals, international funds transfer, credit cards, ATM card, loans, credits, etc.), Government (taxes, communications, weapons, monetary systems, laws, courts sessions, archives, etc.) and everything. Of course, the confidentiality and security measures, reliability, back ups, power grids and systems, etc. etc...

How can any country not make the High Tech (which includes the IT industry as a core) as one of the very core strategic industries? Without this, the country is destined to be "Information Poor" and subservient. The concerning and the scary part is that the rate of change and new technologies are being introduced and being obsolete is getting faster and faster. Catching up in the future will be harder and harder. Armenia has to choose: to be "Information Rich" or "Information Poor". I say Armenia has to be "Information Rich".

G. Kh. -You have been continuously engaged in helping build Armenia's high tech industry

When did this start and why?

T. M. - I was invited to the first Conference in 1991. We had newly created free Armenia at the fall of Soviet Union. My interest was high tech industry. Being somewhat familiar to the High Tech activities of Armenia during Soviet Union, I saw Armenia in ruins as far as the High Tech industry was concerned. All lines with Moscow were severed and suddenly no more funding was available from Moscow. No more technology, no more joint activities, no more outsourcing orders from Moscow and no more demands of designing or manufacturing any products from Moscow. The situation seemed desperate.

The provisional government had organized this conference to bring Armenian businessmen and executives from all businesses. The purpose was to start collaboration of receiving help in terms of funds, joint ventures, and strategic ideas.

The total who participated from the Diaspora were about 60-70 people, if I am not mistaken. Only few were from the high tech industry. As a result, the demand was very high on my time and on the time of two of my colleagues.

I was asked to have many meetings and trips to many factories, Academy of Sciences, institutes, Universities and meetings with government officials.

I was asked to give a high level High Tech related advice to this newly born country with very limited resources and aging factories, & infrastructures, unreliable telephone land lines, the Universities had aging systems, tools, etc. Although the graduates had very strong background in basic sciences and computer science.

I was very positive and coming from one of the very active high tech multinationals and being involved in Silicon Valley Strategic Policy teams and Affiliate Programs between the Universities and the government and the industry as well as very involved in the strategic teams that were very intimately involved in the short, medium and long term strategic planning of Japan, and the upcoming South East Asia countries like: Singapore, S. Korea, Taiwan, etc. (the "Tigers") and taking into consideration of Armenia's land locked, very few natural resources but small size, highly educated population and literacy rate and Armenia's achievements in high tech during the soviet Union, I was able to provide many short, medium and long term strategic advice how to bring up the high Tech industry. The government was in its infancy and trying very hard to get on its feet. There were the old soviet era managers who had operational experience and new generation with more open minds and eager to be westernized. I also realized many habits that I was told were very nor-

mal during the Soviet times but they were very strange to us westerners. I regard the creation of AUA as Joint Venture of Armenia Government, University of California (UC) system with the collaboration of AGBU as one of very important milestones to establish the first high profile Joint Venture with the West.

I was asked to create a high tech

joint venture under the name of Armenian Technology Group (ATG) - this is not the same ATG operating today which is mainly in agriculture, etc.). Our ATG included High Tech manufacturing plant (Mars), Computer group, Power semiconductor group, Ministry of Telecommunications, and a newly formed Silicon Valley based high tech start up to focus on Armenia.

G. Kh. - What are your impressions and observations for the first several years from 1991 to 1999?

T.M. - Armenia had survived major down-turns that included energy crisis, all telecommunication and networks monopoly, not well planned start and stops by some high tech companies that included outsourcing services, currency fluctuations, slow growth and country going thru embryonic phase in building up the government, the legislation, the systems, etc. Much migration to the west.

Being in the Silicon Valley, I tried to help several High Tech professionals that somehow made it to the USA. Even helped several individuals to locate to USA and helped to find jobs with leading edge high tech companies with the clear understanding that they will return to Armenia and help in building the High Tech Industry. Many have returned and doing exactly that.

Towards the end of the energy crisis, some start ups start to show up. I and my colleagues in the Si Valley helped bring up several start ups in the USA with subsidiaries in Armenia. These few start ups had the influence to motivate the Armenian Government to be aware of and start taking steps to fix the copyright, trademark and patent laws which are vital to any High Tech company operations and protection of Intellectual property. Also, the government started realizing the need to effective telecommunication infrastructure and affordable pricing.

Our experience from the Silicon Valley which was very intense in devoting our efforts and time for Armenia were very mixed. Mentally

we had to come to the understanding that things were very different between us and the people in Armenia. This included: the values, the working ethics, etc. Many from Diaspora received scars and difficulties. There were some bright spots though.

G.Kh. - How about during 2000 to 2010?

T.M. - I was invited to come to Armenia after few short years of absence. The country was going thru changes and there was new way of thinking. My meetings with the government were interesting in the sense that they realized much more the importance of the High Tech industry as one of the most important cores to build future Armenia on.

Start ups were growing. The Government paid serious attention to what we were saying regarding freeing Armenia from exclusive agreement that Armenia tied to with a Greek entity on all the telecommunications of Armenia. They have locked the country in a non-functioning and producing monopoly. Without competitive and effective telecommunications infrastructure and both cellular and internet competing providers it was for sure there was going to be no High Tech industry. Our monthly fees were astronomical (over \$20,000 per month for what we needed) compared to US or what we can get today in Armenia.

But with the encouragement of the top officials of the Armenian government and promising intents, I

impressive since it took place within 6 months of our acquisition of the facility. It was also impressive because at the opening we had already done many renovations and have located two subsidiaries of two of our start ups in Silicon Valley both related to advance semiconductors: Mosaic Systems, Inc which was in very super fast SRAM memories and Arset Logic which was in Semiconductor design tools.

Here are the very revealing questions and answers and presentation that were given by me as the Chairman of Viasphere International, Inc. During the ribbon cutting ceremony in July, 2001 by the then current president of Armenia and in the presence of the diplomats, academia officials, and industry executives. All that was said is applicable today for a foreign investor. The following questions were raised:

Question: What is Viasphere International, Inc vision?

Answer: Tony Moroyan
- Shared Vision with the vision of the Government of Armenia to make High Tech Industry a core and very successful industry.

- To achieve Commercially Sustainable Operation (Technopark and Incubator) and on going collaboration between foreign investors and the government of Armenia to solve problems in a speedy manner.

- ROI- Viasphere International, Inc. is a USA corporation and this is an American Investment and must have Return On Investment ("ROI") and protected by USA. The USA Embassy was very involved in the acquisition of the facility from the

or locate subsidiaries in Armenia. Armenia was doing this during the Soviet era very successfully.

-Promised continued government support and initiatives to help the foreign Investor to achieve its visions and objectives. Taking away obstacles that come up.

-Move towards Democracy and Stability.

Question: What are the benefits to Armenia?

Answer: Tony Moroyan

- Help in realization of Armenian's Vision re high tech

- Help demonstrate start up model and template for others to replicate

- Create sustainable and stable jobs

- Attract the leading edge technology developments and new ones for global markets

- Help modernize the university programs, tools and collaboration with the industry

- Achieve recognition for Armenia as the Powerhouse of technology and talent and destination for investments

Question: What do you need from Armenia and the Armenian Government?

Answer: Tony Moroyan

- Predictability - The laws and legislations (tax, IP related, foreign investor protection and assistant, holidays, currency) and behavior. Not only setting up the laws but the proper and fair execution of the laws set.

- Sensitivity to the Investor Needs. Keep the finger on the pulse what the foreign investor needs, what are his problems, how to help increase the efforts and investments from the foreign investors. Manage the expectations.

- Short term conducive legislation:

- Protecting Company Intellectual Property (IP): Copyright, Patent, Trademark, etc. at USA and international levels.

- Providing cost effective and competitive Internet and telephone (cellular and land line) rate and availability. Must have multiple providers and competitors. Without his there will be no high tech industry - this is the backbone of high tech industry.

- Sensitivity to the need of Start ups- Have your finger on the pulse. Start ups are the ones that will push the technologies and creation of new technologies and diversification. Acquisition of start ups could be the main reason that will bring the multinationals to Armenia.

G.Kh. - Have you seen the realization of the above points that were made during last 10 years or so?

T. M. - I have seen much progress in many areas. Many of the points that we made and or answers we gave to the audience at the opening in July, 2001 were realized with the cooperation of the Government, Universities and the High Tech industry. The reader can find the sta-

The entity, Viasphere International, Inc. a USA Corporation was set up to establish off shore high tech facility to help to support the subsidiaries of Silicon Valley start ups and corporations. Viasphere Technopark was the first one that was created in 2001.

tistics from many sources in Armenia, including the Ministry of Economy, Armenian Development Agency, EIF, UITE and other non-governmental sources.

The industry flourished and number of start ups went up drastically, I was even able to bring leading Multinational companies. One example is Synopsys, Inc., the leading EDA (Electronic Design Automation) Company in the world that acquired first two companies several years ago then the thirds one and the fourth one was acquired in 2010. This is a Silicon Valley based company with operations in numerous countries including countries that provide talents, e.g. India and China. However, the operation in Armenia which is located at the Viasphere Technopark, in Yerevan, Armenia represents the largest single R & D facility outside the Silicon Valley campus of Synopsys. Other select high tech multinational companies have entered Armenia as well that include National Instruments (USA), Mentor Graphics (USA), Cubic Corporation (USA), Damaris (French), SCDM (Austrian). These all have engineering and development teams. Other companies also have presence for various reasons, e.g. market access, collaborations, etc., e.g. Microsoft (USA).

Actually we saw interesting trend of high tech professionals returning to Armenia to set up start ups and presence.

Competitive rates and The Telecommunication and Internet access have been achieved and the on going competition is doing its job of providing better and better solutions and rates. The creation of Vivacell had set high bars as they entered market in terms of driving the reliability and functionality and rates. These are being further enhanced by all three cellular providers that include Orange (France Telecom- French) and Bee Line (Russian).

There legislation also moving forward. The IP laws are good and par with the west.

Recognition of Armenia as Preferred High Tech Destination has been achieved in the Silicon Valley and other countries. These were the result of 20 years of evangelizing Armenia, doing real leading

edge high tech successful start ups with subsidiaries in Armenia, and Global events and conferences, e.g. ArmTech Congress 2007 in SF and 2009 in the Silicon Valley as well as in Yerevan in 2008 and 2011. Also shows and conferences in Armenia, e.g. Digitec, the industry exhibition annually in Yerevan Armenia. AUA, the American University in Armenia (as joint venture) has been very successful forging intimate links with US campuses, including UC Berkeley. Other collaborations with other universities in Armenia and USA and other countries have accelerated. E.g. Stanford (Silicon Valley) and French institutions.

G. Kh. - You listed the successes and realizations during the last 10 years. How about failures, deficiencies, not realized points? What do we have to do better to be competitive and attract foreign investment for the next 5-10 years?

T. M. - The country is a small country with limited resources and with few natural resources. The international melt-down in recent years have not helped. Armenia was also impacted and is trying to recover. The advances to date have been enormous under the given circumstances.

G. Kh. - What are some of the challenges facing Armenia and things that have not yet achieved?

T. M. - Special focus and sensitivity to High tech Foreign Investments by the Government of Armenia. High tech investments have not accelerating at a rate to fuel the new growth and development to meet the next phase in High Tech industry development. Next phase will be more challenging than the last few phases that we were able to help Armenia move thru with great success and become the envy of the region. Foreign Investment cannot be taken for granted. The reason the next phase will be more difficult is because:

THE COMPETITIVENESS

The neighbors in the region are awake and trying to enhance and develop their high tech industries. Competitiveness is getting much more aggressive from many countries. These include even competitiveness within traditionally developed economies. Within these countries there are pockets or regions or states or cities that are very compet-

itive. This is very true in the USA, Italy and many other countries. Also traditionally lower wage countries in Middle East, North Africa, CIS countries, S America, etc. One should not just look at the salaries. This is one of the obvious indicators.

At the end, when all said and done, the Corporations (including the start-ups now) look at the total cost of total ownership that hits the bottom line and the profit. This is what every company looks at after initial trials. Here are some examples that might not be obvious in Armenia:

- Better Predictability (all comments relating to High Tech industry and foreign investors):

- Looking at the current laws from High Tech Foreign Investor's point of view and enhancing them

- Being very careful for new laws and legislation (forward looking laws) and their impact on Foreign Investors and Foreign Companies Operating in Armenia before formulating the laws and definitely before finalizing the laws. In general, the Predictability applies all other items that make up the total cost of ownership.

- Keeping the finger on the pulse continuously with foreign investors and foreign companies operating in Armenia.

- Wages and deductions

- taxes,

- tax holidays (as much as possible-to keep competitive)

- ease of moving in and out funds without punitive tax and other hindrances,

- Access to the Country (airlines, goods to be send in and out),

- easy and conducive customs laws and regulations and speed of operation,

- being able to have consultant and contractors outside Armenia that are absolutely key to grow the value added business in Armenia without punitive fees and taxes. Right now one has to pay 10% withholding tax and there is a limit how much one can pay to outside contractors, consultants or operations. Also, to be able to deduct these as expense at the end of the year. This one item is very severe and will not allow high tech companies to hold outside offices and operations. This will drive foreign companies not to generate and revenue in Armenia but just use the local talent to do projects and pay them salaries. This severely impacts the motivation to move up the food chain in terms of generating more revenue or even IP that brings more income and royalties.

-Finding ways to make operations from Armenia to surrounding countries easy, efficient and cost effective, Armenia as the hub.

-Tax free Zones. Since it is not feasible to move all companies who can generate more revenue to one locations, it could be possible to allow many centers to be able to effectively operate as tax free zones. The issue is that a facility like the Technopark, there will be several companies that would like to utilize this to increase

their revenue moving up the value chain. But other companies at the same time and location may not want to be under very heavy restrictions to operate. To satisfy both types, it is very feasible to create the proper acceptable laws and rules and restrictions. Guess, what, I can say with high level of confidence that the number of companies that would want to take advantage of Tax Free Zone benefits and start the proper operations, e.g. final assembly and testing will rise very fast.

- Forming a small core Advisory Group and Board that is respected by the foreign high tech community to interact with them and the government and other industry groups. The Advisory group to meet with the Prime Minister or the President. High tech Foreign Investor representatives from outside Armenia, twice per year. Or other similar interactions at high level so that things can move at a strategic level and not be under administrative layers and layers. US Embassy used to do this very successfully during Ambassador Ordway. I was on of the members of the Ambassador's Round table and we met twice per year with the Embassy and received reports on all USA agencies operating in Armenia. We even met with the president of Armenia with his ministers. There were about 6-8 of us. This kind of format will greatly enhance the communication and increase the confidence of the foreign corporations. This effort to be in addition to other industry groups that exist in Armenia.

- Global Conferences - e.g. ArmTech Congress with modified format and agenda that gets closer to Davos and involves top high tech community form abroad and the proper level of attendance form Armenia. The 2012 format will be more effective than the format of the previous years.

- Help work with the universities and the industry to prepare all levels of managers: first level, middle level and executive level. This is not easy. This requires the proper education working with universities. Besides capable managers, the foreign investor needs a manager who has high standards for ethics, values, loyalty and dependability and who will resist many bad habits. The second most important requirement after the predictability for the foreign investor is to have capable manager who are ethical, reliable, dependable and honest to help the company and the employees and the government and not be involved in unethical behavior and taking advantage of the foreign investors and their assets. The government has a major role in this to have a fast process to punish the managers, especially the top executives, e.g. The Managing Directors and make an example of him. The foreign companies that Armenia needs are the Companies that act the proper ways and pay their proper taxes, and follow legitimate laws of the country and be an example in term of ethics and management to the workforce. Bribes and devious meth-

ods cannot be encouraged and at the end everyone knows about it and when this gets in to ears of the Foreign Investor, it is a show stopper.

- Make sure that the current Foreign Investors and companies, especially the very active promoters are listened to and have been given the means to access the proper people in the government and can solve their problems or accelerate their problems to be solved so that they give good recommendations to the potential Foreign Investor. I tell you, I get many enquiries by potential investors who want to know if they should invest in Armenia, followed with 20 standard questions.

- Armenia is very fortunate to have a strong landing point in the Silicon Valley. The bridge we have built with Armenia last 20 years is an enviable asset for Armenia. This has been used last several years. We should find ways to take more advantage of this asset.

-What I think about Armenia: there is no feedback loop here. Government should be interested to go to foreign companies and meet with the foreign investor and its representative from outside the country and not just local representatives. To know what to do in order to have more investments. But, alas, there are no of such visits! None!

-Exchange rate predictability. This is a very serious one and if the variance is too big and the frequency of the fluctuations, this will effect the foreign investor to be on the cautious side in terms of the size of his investment.

I think I should say, that the progress has been phenomenal in Armenia in regards to developing the high tech industry, attract the top and leading edge players, as well as Armenia's recognition as referred high tech destination for off shore operations on leading edge technologies and products as well as for investment. With more and proper forum, the factors that will attract foreign investments can be easily formulated and discussed and I am sure find ways Armenian government can put in place the proper and very attractive and predictable environment and the flow to resolve major issues in the speediest manner.


We have to attract foreign investments and operations that are interested in long term relationship and good citizenship. I am very confidence that this can be achieved.

G. Kh. - Why do you spend much time with Armenia?

T. M. - The main reason is to build the high tech industry in Armenia. Of course, this will provide high caliber and highest paying jobs and help the country. Of course I am convinced this will have direct and indirect humanitarian and social benefits.

-For humanitarian reasons, I will do that since I am Armenian. Also, I am Christian. I do not think there is

another country that can come close to having the percentage of Christians as a percentage of total country's population. We promote being the first country. But we do not promote the point I make.

-For business- I really believe Armenia can be a high tech destination that actually realizes the expectations of foreign Investor as far as ROI and great experience. It is well known that charity does not last and a country should not depend on charity in building its industry. There must be no nonsense ROI. This is the only way industry and economy can sustain itself long term.

G.Kh. - How much time Armenia in general has taken from you last 20 years?

T.M. - I should say, when I landed in Armenia for the first meeting in 1991, I did kiss the soil when I got out of the airport. So did my fellow passengers. They say Armenia is like a very attractive and irresistible lady, once you kiss her you fall in love. That and along with the legacy: my father and mother who were orphans from 1915 and had gone thru a very hard live that I was told about it; my mother's surviving brother who had migrated to US in 1912 and escaped the Genocide but had volunteered in General Antranig Army to come to Armenia and joined with the Russian army to fight and free parts of Armenia. These combined with my upbringing in Lebanon as Armenian make it very difficult to turn my face away from Armenia. I have gone thru many difficulties last 20 years, some of them very hurtful, I am sure I am not the only one but as an important person said to me in Armenia, the people who will help to build Armenia are the very dedicated ones that people call them "Crazy". These are not the people who come to Armenia to take pictures, just talk, criticize, and shake hands. The Crazy ones are the ones with resilience and strength not to give up but try to change the country for the better. Of course a Crazy person must have a wife or a husband and children who tolerate him and support him. I give all the credit to my wife and my son and daughter who have sacrificed not having time with me.

I think the intensity of the statement is an

indication of the time I spend on Armenia whether I am in Armenia or in California. I can tell you that the hours I spend on Armenia if very major. This is on continuous basis every week.

By the way, I have met many domestic Armenian Crazy as well. This is what is encouraging to me!

G.Kh. -Armenia became free. This was a miracle! What is your ultimate dream or vision?

T.M. - MY GREATEST DREAM of all is to see a PAN Armenian global community. With creation of independent Armenia, this is even more feasible. We have to bring the Diaspora and Armenia together. Armenians should not look at each other and judge by the flag of their country where they were born, or the church they go, or the organization they have membership to. Armenians have always been loyal to the countries they live in. Armenians in the USA for example, are very American and will do everything to help the country and uphold its interests above all other interests. A sub-culture as being Armenian or French or Japanese only enriches USA and makes it stronger and ties to those countries and creates natural stable links and allies.

Anthony (Tony) Moroyan
