### The Non-Anniversary Date

September 21st was the 21st Armenia's of Independence, which, compared to the previous year, was celebrated less solemnly as the date was nonanniversary.

Which events were more noticeable during the National Holiday?

In our opinion, there were not many, just a few of them.

First of all, "Cooperation - 2012" Collective Rapid Reaction Force (CRRF) of the Collective Security Treaty Organization (CSTO) maneuver took place in Armenia from 14 to 19 September.

After the year of 2005, this was the first maneuver which involved a large number of soldiers from Russia and Armenia, while the maneuver was attended by the representatives of all the country-members of the military political bloc (Belarus, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan Tajikistan), also MOE, the police and the international Red Cross. The final phase of the exercise was held at Marshal Baghramyan polygon.

The maneuver involved about

two thousand power structures of six countries, and approximately 500 pieces of equipment, including armored vehicles - tanks and armored personnel carriers, 50 artillery pieces, 200 cars, 1,500 small arms. For the first time unmanned aerial vehicles were used in the maneuver of Collective Rapid Reaction Force.

The executed maneuver demonstrated the following:

- This military-political structure, which had previously been semi-virtual, got a more serious image in the eyes of the expert community.

For the preparation of the "Cooperation - 2012" maneuver, the Armenian experience, gained during the NATO maneuvers in 2008 and 2010 was used.

- The Armenian-American expert Richard Giragosian noted that this maneuver was more important for Russia than for Armenia. Apparently, this point of view is due to the fact that the Greater Middle East has still a high level of militarypolitical confrontation with Iran and Syria. The situation hasn't reached to an open confrontation, but the Syrian continued on page 11

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## Armenia is considering several ways of legal actions: Artak Zakaryan



Armenia's National Assembly Standing Committee head on Foreign Affairs Artak Zakarian responded to the letter sent by Hungarian prestigious ATV News Channel atv.hu internet site News Channel . Armenpress presents the interview:

First of all, please comment us, what is your opinion on Hungarian Foreign Minister's latest letter, where he argues, that the transfer of Ramil Sahib Safarov to Azerbaijan was not aimed against Armenia and it CANNOT be considered as an insult to the Armenian people. In this letter he added that the transfer of Safarov was "in line with effective international regulations" and Hungary's practice in similar cases. Martonyi insisted that the transaction had been "purely of a legal

nature.

"Honourable Mr. Molnar, I would like thank you for the interview request on such a sensitive topic not only in Hungary and Armenia, but matter of concern for the whole international community. Unfortunately what happened on the last day of the summer as a result of a disgraceful secret deal of authorities of Hungarian and Azerbaijani authorities, you see yourself what kind of unpleasant surprise was made for the civilised world. In democratic countries you can never meet such a hoorible glorification a murderer. From the legal point of view the trasnfer might be in accordance of international regulations, but the Hungarian authorities had also a responsibility not to do that under their promises to Armenia. As it was revelaed later, Prime Minister Orban - the troublemaker knew in advance that Safarov was going to be released and glorified. And what he got? Condemning statements, criticisim of international community and one prove that he is not a reliable partner, his step caused anger not only in Armenia and Hungary, but all over the world, he caused suspension of relations with Armenia, a country sons of

which fought and lost their lives for Hungary. Martonyi's stance could not be different from the PM's one. But the reality is different.

His comments seem to contradict the PM's stance, though, since Viktor Orban said this week (on Tuesday) that he himself had made the decision to hand over the Azeri axe murderer to his native Azerbaijan, and the ensuring events had NOT been UNexpected. Orban told a press conference that `nothing happened after our decision we did NOT expect.'

That is what I'm saying. PM Orban admitted he knew what was going to happen and, never the less, they did it, and are sharing their part of responsability. The worst thing is that the Hungarian government violated and trampled the decision of judicial power by setting a brutal murderer free.

Also, the Armenian lobby is one of the most powerful lobbies in the United States. There are Hungarian experts who say, this can affect and affect seriously the American-Hungarian relations, since the Armenians are more active in the US. Do you think, or do you see it a real possibility, that they would start a campaign against Hungary to

revenge the Safarov case? Under Prime Minister Orban, Hungary had and has serious problems with the civilized world, its own allies, and this step is another one that is witnessing the unadequate behavior of PM Orban the troublemaker As for the Hungarian - American relations, I'm not in a position to comment on them, but certainly the strong condemning messages form President Obama and State department that came up on the same day are speaking for theirselves. By this step Hungarian Government had contributed to the destructive efforts of Azerbaijani authorities, aimed at harming and impeding the efforts of OSCE Minsk Group Co-chair countries (US, Russia and France) on the peaceful resolution of conflict between Azerbaijan and Nagorno-Karabakh. And this destructive approach must have consequences for these who initiated and perpetrated it. And the last, but probably the most important question: by the comments of our MFA and PM it seems Hungary is `not prepared' to apologize the Armenian people. Do you believe the conflict between our two nations can quit down without a formal apology from our side?

For centuries Armenian people had warmest feelings towards Hungary and its people, which give a shelter became second home for a number of my compatriots, who fleed form the Genocide in the beginning of 20th century, as I told earlier a number of Armenians were prominent figures in Hungary, and now Armenian Diaspora is contributing to the development of Hungary. After this outrageous act, the Armenian Embassy received thousand support and regret letters from Hungarians, and we appreciate that very much. I believe that sooner or later we will reestablish full fledge relations, but better sooner than later, but for this we expect concrete steps from the Hungarian Government in order to rebuild trust, which was lost after shameful step Hungarian PM. Apology could be one of those steps.

Do you have any new legal, political steps in your mind to confront Budapest's decision?

We are considering several ways of legal actions, and after careful examination, I guess Armenian side will initiate them.

## U.S. Claims `Not Satisfied' with Baku, Budapest over Safarov Case

Philip Gordon, the U.S. Assistant Secretary of State for European and Eurasian Affairs

WASHINGTON (RFE/RL) - The United States is `not satisfied' with explanations from Baku and Budapest concerning the case of an Azerbaijani officer who brutally murdered an Armenian soldier at a NATO seminar in Hungary eight years ago.

Philip Gordon, the U.S. Assistant Secretary of State for European and Eurasian Affairs, told RFE/RL at the Center for European Policy Analysis' U.S.-Central Europe Strategy Forum on September 20 that Washington continues to express `dismay and disappointment' to Budapest about its decision to release Ramil Safarov to Baku.

He said Washington is sending the same message to Azerbaijan's government, which pardoned Safarov and then promoted him after his August 31 return to the country.

'We were appalled by the glorification that we heard in some quarters of somebody who was convicted of murder' Gordon said. He called the case `a real provocation in the region.'

The European Union, the OSCE's Minsk Group, Russia, and Hungary also expressed concern about Safarov's pardon and promotion.

### **Ashot Melkonyan:** Independence was God's grace

Today we celebrate the 21st anniversary of Armenia's Independence. With an overwhelming majority of the votes, the people of Armenia decided to withdraw from the USSR and create an independent state.

The restoration of statehood and the 21 years of independence are an evidence of the fact that we have finally reached the psychology of living free, Director of the History Institute Ashot Melkonyan said in an interview with 'Radiolur.'

The process of establishment of independent statehood started on August 23, 1990 by the adoption of the Declaration of Independence at the first sitting of the Supreme Council of the Republic of Armenia. The decision of the Supreme Council was further consolidated by the referendum held on September 21, 1991.

94.99% of the voters said they would like Armenia to be an independent and democratic state outside the USSR, which marked the start of the history of the third Republic of Armenia.

According to Ashot Mekonyan, during the 21 years of independence we've not man-



aged to understand a very important thing: the independence has not been served on a tray. 'It was a hard path our people passed. Many consider we were not ready for that independence in 1991, but in reality there were forces, social layers, which managed to prepare that independence,' he said.

Ashot Melkonyan says the army has been the greatest achievement of the third republic. `The restoration of statehood and the 21 years of independence are an evidence of the fact that we have finally reached the psychology of living free.' According to him, there is a perception of the exceptional value of independence among us, especially the youth.

According to the historian, `the independence was God's grace, a chance to restore our statehood long after we lost it.'

## **Fact or Fantasy:** Contemplating Life and the Armenia Beyond

This 21st anniversary of the Republic of Armenia is my moment of ultimate truth. That moment can define and distinguish each of us or, even better, nurture common human ground. In a world of so many differences, I favor the latter.

- 1. I shall devote the next 100 days to the creation of a compelling citizens' candidacy for the presidency of ancient Armenia's modern state. Whether it is I or someone else who ultimately becomes the carrier of that quest, scheduled for the dawn of 2013, a few basic requirements apply.
- 2. Our beleaguered homeland, where I was not born but to which I returned two decades and a couple of years ago, must hold its first democratic elections since its post-Soviet independence in 1991. Armenia needs a new, de jure presi-

nomic development, environmental conscientiousness, citizen prosperity, and global statesmanship.

- 7. With humility but self-confidence, Armenia finally will forge, frame, and make relevant its vital national interests and international imperatives.
- 8. The Republic shall cherish its sovereignty and at once become a true contributor to the strategic balance in its region and the world. It will recast its unbecoming vertical relationship with the Russian Federation, achieve partnership on a mutually respectful horizontal plane, and diversify its outreach through separate but equivalent connections with NATO and CSTO, China and India, an improved Georgia, a renewed Iran and the broader Middle East.
- 9. By the midpoint of the presidency, on April 24, 2015, the centennial anniversary of the Genocide

Before overseeing the conduct of benchmark elections to usher in a new parliament, prime minister and then president, Armenia's fourth administration will recognize both Mountainous Karabagh Republic and the Azerbaijani Republic against the background of their respective, legitimate, and post-Bolshevik territorial integrities. There shall be no exceptions to supremacy of the human right.
- 5. Every person resident in the ethnically country, whether Armenian or representative of a minority, and every compatriot living in dispersion will be ensured fair access to citizenship, with all pertinent duties and entitlements, including those of suffrage, dignity in life and death, due process, and equal access to and protection under the law.
- 6. Homeland and Diaspora together will find the contemporary formula for nation-building, eco-

and Great Dispossession of the Armenian people and its patrimony, the Republic of Turkey will find the political courage and moral fortitude to surmount the Turkish-Armenian divide, to recognize that unprecedented crime against humanity, and to deliver reconciliation through truth and normalization through meaningful restitution. Overcoming its deep-seated strain of denialism, Turkey will take responsibility by rolling back its blockade of Armenia, establishing diplomatic relations without reference to outdated protocols or other conditionalities, and launching a landmark process of negotiation with the Armenian nation for closure of mankind's gaping wound, for restoration of individual and collective rights, and for a program of guaranteed return to a national home. Absent a significant change in Ankara's long-standing approach, Yerevan will release its own demands and preconditions on that day. Along with these, it will unveil a monument in honor of those righteous Turks and Kurds who saved Armenian lives, including my grandmother's, during the Genocide.

11. Armenia, an antique source of Western civilization, will become a member of the European Union, not in the instant period, but during the service of its subsequent government. Led by a promising generation of educated young brainpower and civic activism, the nation will own a Constitution that is no longer a mere documentation of dreams and declarations. It will assert mastery of a functioning parliamentary republic. It will revere its own sovereignty and interests and the birthright of its citizens.

12. And it will expect Europe, and the world, to do the same.

Fiction or finally not, these points will shape the contours of Armenia's domestic credentials and geopolitical capacities into the foreseeable future. I might have a few more to add later on, especially in light of the realities, both hard and soft, which are bound to be triggered by its most pivotal election of all time.

Raffi Hovannisian, independent Armenia's first minister of foreign affairs, currently chairs the Heritage

## **Ashot Manucharyan recalls** 1991 with anguish

The member of "Karabakh" committee Ashot Manucharvan in the meeting with journalists in Noyan Tapan News Agency stressed that as Azerbaijan creates military-political mechanisms, Armenia must seriously review its security. "We know pretty well that such mechanisms are created not by Azerbaijan as it doesn't have such opportunities or ideas. They create the atmosphere as if it is directed against Iran, and in part against Russia as well pressing Russia not to go far on that account." said Manucharyan.

According to him we cannot sit and see what great amount of weapon is accumulated in Azerbaijan. Armenia must have counteracting "Tomorrow there can be quakes in Russia. Who will support us then?" he said.

Armenia has always abounded in young men answering by the force of their arms. "We must reach that arm force inside Armenia in order to survive." said needs nuclear weapon as a means

of suppressing.

Armenia became independent 21 years ago, without having a special holiday. Today we have a special holiday but we are not independent, says Manucharyan, a member of the Karabakh Committee.

During a meeting with journalists, Manucharyan enumerated with anguish the advantages of the newly independent Armenia.

He says there was no crime in the country in 1991.

"Everyone lived in peace, spreading peace around them," he recalled.

In 1991, Armenia became homeland for all Armenians, irrespective of their place of abode. Besides, the country had a welldeveloped foreign policy then, which we lack today.

"Today, Armenia's foreign policy is dictated by external forces,"

Mr. Manucharyan blames the country's failed policy and shortcomings on the wrong philosophy and says instincts and passions Manucharyan adding that Armenia have been pushed into the foreground.

### **SYRIAN CRISIS AND IRAN**

At the end of August Iran stated that its armed forces were participating in the civil war in Syria. "We are involved in all kinds of combat actions [in Syria]", stated general Salar Abnush - the commander of "Sahib al-Amr" unit of the Army of the Guardians of the Islamic Revolution – at his meeting with the journalists. And several days later several Iranian media brought the words of the anonymous "high-ranking AGIR officer" who said that if "the US attacks Syria Tehran will act according to the mutual defence treaty (Iranian-Syrian) which was concluded with al-Assad in 2006"1.

It is clear that the fall of the Bashar al-Assad's regime will weaken not only Iran's regional influence, thus making it more vulnerable from abroad, but it will be a serious blow for the ruling Iranian regime. Especially if we take into consideration the fact that the next presidential elections will be held in less than one year (in June 2013) and the last elections had unprecedented negative impact on ruling Islamic regime in Iran. In this aspect it seems there is no other option for Tehran and, of course, it is more profitable to fight in Syria than on its own soil.

Round the military and political situation

At the beginning of September Turkish media spread rather interesting information that in the units of the Syrian rebels operating in the north of Syria – in the regions near

the Turkish border – Turkish officers took a command. The information was published on September 3 after the visit of the CIA director David Petraeus2 to Ankara.

This information is important in the aspect that it demonstrates the dynamics of the Syrian crisis – the countries which tend to overthrow Bashar al-Assad took a decision to increase their involvement in the Syrian war which has to prove that in the near future the situation in Syria and round will aggravate even more3.

Approximately in the same period – in the second half of the summer – they began to speak actively about the chemical weapons of Syria. Both sides put it into circulation. Bashar al-Assad's regime and its allies tried to demonstrate their military potential this way. But the western powers, putting the issue in circulation, tended to impose even more pressure on Al-Assad's regime and demonstrate the whole world how dangerous it was as they spoke about the weapons of mass-distraction.

In September the issue has even developed. American sources wrote that al-Assad's chemical arsenal was deployed in different parts of the country and western coalition needed to increase its participation in the Syrian war to destroy it, otherwise after the fall of Al-Assad the arsenal may appear in the hands of the Islamist terrorists.

Generally, connecting weapons of mass-destruction element with any international crisis proves how

important it is for the global policy (North Korea, Iran, Saddam's Iraq, Kaddafi's Libya, etc.). Bringing forward this element in the Syrian issue speaks about the expected aggravation of the situation.

The fact that the Syrian crisis has a direct impact on Iran has become obvious particularly over the recent weeks. Situation in Lebanon has been escalating gradually – encounters between Shiites and Sunnites took place. There was escalation of situation at the Lebanese-Israeli border too. It is known that Tehran influ-

IAEA's new statement

In mid September unprecedented maneuvers of the US and its allies started in the Persian Gulf. On the US side three aircraft carrier groups were involved. It was stated that the main goal of the naval exercises was to prevent blockade of Strait of Hormuz and provision of oil and gas production and transportation in the Persian Gulf.

It is known that Iran stated that in case of any military aggression the Iranian forces will close the Strait of Hormuz through which approximately 1/4 of the worlds transported oil passes every day. But this time

#### On Prospects

Overwhelming majority of the experts is convinced that new developments in the region should be expected after the presidential elections in the US in November. Rather tense political infighting in the US forges Washington's actions in the direction of Syria and Iran. It is not a secret that for Barak Obama whose rating does not differ much from the rating of Mitt Romney escalation and broadening of the regional processes which may bring to a new tension on the international level and affect global (including US) economy are not desirable. In this aspect the situation may be quite different after the elections.

1. The American and European media also began speaking actively about the involvement of the Iranian military representatives in Syrian war in recent period. At the beginning of September The Times wrote with ref-

3. Let us mention that during the summer months European and American media spread information about the British, French and Qatari special operations forces' activity in Syria. As for the information spread by the Turkish media from exclusively military point of view it can indicate an imminent invasion of the Turkish troops into Syria.

4. In this regard remarkable information was published by The New York Times and The Washington Times in August-September. The first wrote that according to the Minister of Foreign Affairs of Costa Rica Enrique Castillio Iran built a secret station for "Hezbollah" at the territory of neighboring Nicaragua with which Tehran established close political and economic relations. And in approximately ten day The Washington Times informed that at the US-Mexican border three Hezbollah militants were arrested.

5. Let us remind you that Fahrizade was relieved in 2006 when there was a kind of melt down in the US-Iranian relations, and in December 2007 American intelligence made public a well-known report according to which in 2003 Iran closed its nuclear weapon programme. In this aspect Mohsen Fahrizade's return may mean that Tehran has overlooked its nuclear programme in recent years.

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
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## Nina Agavelyan:


There were 130 works presented at the exhibition, created at different time periods.

## The Public Purchases Should be **Entrusted to a Reputed and Professional Operator**

According to the decision of Tigran Sargsyan, the Prime Minister of the Republic of Armenia, Hakob Beglaryan was dismissed from the office of the head of the Center for Support in Purchases nonprofit state organization today. Meanwhile at the Cabinet meeting, it was decided to dismiss officials of the Center for Support in Purchases - from head of subdivisions to directors and deputies - at the instigation of Vache Gabrielyan, the Minister of Finance.

www.aravot.am inquired of Mikayel Melkumyan, a PAP member and the chairman of the Standing Committee on Economic Affairs of the National Assembly, whether the corruption in the field of public purchases would be eliminated. `There should be a systemic change. So if something in the purchasing process is done incorrectly, it is a part of the market's imperfection. So this is not only about rules of procedure and standards, but also the status quo in the market. So if they appropriate

large amounts for a certain field and the market accepts it, it means that there is a new result in the market, which is not appropriate for a free market economy, but the market accepts them. I think that there might be some improvements by changing individuals, but systemic solutions are needed, the competition should be improved, in order that there is a free competition,' the PAP member expressed this opinion.

According to him, if the whole system is sick and the public purchases are a small part of that sick system, healing only the field of purchases will not change anything, `For example, the law allows holding contests, but the way that contest is organized is not in line with the market.'

Mr. Melkumyan offered his solution to the problems in the field of public purchases, 'I think they should entrust the field of public purchases to a professional and internationally reputed operator and the state shouldn't participate in the purchasing process.'

### First Armenian Official Sacked over `Procurement Abuse'

The head of an Armenian agency administering state procurements was sacked on Thursday just days after President Serzh Sargsyan denounced what he described as widespread corruption in the purchase of goods and services commissioned by the govern-

Hakob Beglarian, head of the government Center to Support Procurements, was fired immediately after a cabinet meeting that discussed Sargsvan's harsh criticism of the government's handling of procurements.

The president discussed with Prime Minister Tigran Sargsyan and government ministers the findings of an inquiry conducted by the presidential Oversight Service at an extraordinary meeting. According to the service, procurement contracts in Armenia are routinely awarded to private firms as result of bribery and nepotism. Serzh Sargsyan lambasted the government for failing to prevent the corrupt practices which he said have cost the state millions of dollars in losses.

Finance Minister Vache Gabrielian recommended Beglarian's dismissal on September 20 as he presented his ministry's response to the embarrassing criticism at a regular cabinet session chaired by Tigran Sarkisian. He said Beglarian's deputy and all other senior officials should also be fired for the 'numerous problems and shortcomings' in their area of responsibility.

Prime Minister Sargsyan backed the proposed ousters, instructing his staff to prepare relevant decrees. Only Beglarian's sacking was announced by his press office in the following hours.

The sacked official is the brother of the controversial Transport and Communications Minister Gagik Beglarian.

Gabrielian also reported serious abuses in the purchase of governmentsubsidized drugs for public hospitals and other medical institutions. He said the Ministry of Finance intervened last year to annul a dubious tender organized by a Ministry of Health agency

handling such procurements. Almost 500 million drams (\$1.2 million) in budgetary funds were saved as s result, he said.

That agency was headed until last week by Health Minister Derenik Dumanian's son Gurgen. The latter was appointed as chief of the Armenian parliament's staff on September 15.

Tigran Sargsyan named an interim head of the drug agency later on September 18. It was not clear if he will recommend any punishment for Gurgen Dumanian. He told ministers that 'from now on you will be personally responsible for all procurements.'

The premier reacted angrily after Urban Development Minister Samvel Tadevosian said that a construction company chosen in a supposedly competitive tender mishandled a 700 million-dram contract to refurbish a Yerevan building housing the Armenian National Library. `A considerable part of that work needs to be redone.' Tadevosian told the cabinet.

'This is simply a disgrace,' countered Prime Minister Sargsyan. He instructed his staff to scrutinize all government-funded construction projects and submit its findings to law-enforcement bodies.

President Sargsyan likewise told the National Security Service (NSS) on September 22 go after people who take kickbacks and have their cousins win tenders with twice the prices' offered by other potential suppliers.

Opposition groups and the Armenian National Congress (HAK) in particular have dismissed Sargsyan's angry outburst as a public relations stunt. Vahagn Khachatrian, a senior ANC figure, was equally scathing about the first sackings announced by the government. He said the government's resignation would be `much more logical.'

`The underlying problem is not being solved,' Khachatrian told RFE/RL's Armenian service (Azatutyun.am). `The system is not being changed.'

## **Government Rejects Sharp Rise** in Minimum Wage

The Armenian government rejected on September 20 an opposition proposal to more than double the national minimum wage, saying that the measure would be too costly for both the public and private sectors.

The minimum wage is currently set at 32,500 drams (\$80) per month, a figure equivalent to just over one-quarter of Armenia's existing average monthly pay. A bill drafted by Hrant Bagratian, a parliament deputy from the opposition Armenian National Congress drams.

Prime Minister Tigran Sargsyan's cabinet formally spoke out against the bill's passage by the parliament during a weekly meeting. Finance Minister Vache Gabrielian said the sharp wage is very desirable' but not realistic because it would require at least 28 billion drams (\$70 million) in additional government spending on public sector salaries. This would place an `unbearable burden' on the state budget, he said.

The Armenian budget for this year calls for a total of over 1 trillion drams in public expenditures.

Gabrielian said the proposed measure would also hit the private sector. He claimed that it would encourage private employers to underreport the number of their workers to tax authorities and thus expand the already sizable informal sector of the Armenian economy.

Bagratian, who served as prime minister from 1993-1996, dismissed these arguments. `Strangely enough, no extra money is necessary for raising [the minimum wage] to 72,500 drams,' he claimed. He argued that the bulk of the extra government spending required by proceeds from employee income

`Even if we assume that the government is 100 percent right, 20 billion drams is not a lot of money

given that a single oligarch posts \$200 million in profits a year,' Bagratian told a news conference. `There is too much wealth in their hands,' he said, referring to the country's wealthiest entrepreneurs linked to the government. Let them redistribute it a little. Let them do this at their own expense.'

The government itself pledged to double the minimum wage in its five-year policy program approved by the National Assembly in June. According to Gabrielian, this cannot be accomplished before 2015.

The finance minister also his bill could be financed by greater announced that the government's draft budget for 2013, which will be unveiled soon, envisages a more modest rise in the legal wage threshold. He did not give any numbers,

# Anti-American Protests Triggered by Bad Movie or Bad Policy?

An amateurish US film mocking the Prophet Muhammad and denigrating Islam unleashed massive and violent anti-American protests throughout the world last week.

The angry demonstrations turned deadly when unknown assailants attacked the American Consulate in Benghazi, Libya, killing US Ambassador Chris Stevens and three staff members. Security forces in several countries killed dozens of protesters as they burned American flags and scaled the walls of US Embassies.

Pouring more oil on the fire, initial reports falsely claimed that the movie was produced and financed by Israelis. In fact, it was produced in Southern California by a Christian Egyptian convict whose film was severely denounced by Bishop Serapion of the Coptic Church in Los Angeles.

The real issue, however, goes beyond the vile movie and its reckless producer. The film simply served as a pretext for protesters to express their pent up anti-American anger after decades of flawed and counter-productive US foreign policies -- none of which justifies the killing of American diplomats and attacks on US Embassies.

The list of serious missteps by successive US administrations is lengthy enough to fill many volumes. Whether it is called Arab Spring or Winter of Discontent, the down-trodden masses of third world countries have finally erupted in anti-American rage, having long-endured oppressive tyrants backed by Washington. To achieve short-term and shortsighted objectives, American policymakers often damage US interests in the long

Another regrettable US mistake is pouring billions of dollars into the pockets of corrupt foreign leaders, to prop up puppet regimes and buy their friendship. Unfortunately, very little of this US largesse has trickled down to the poor and needy. Ultimately, the masses overthrow the autocrats and take their anger on the nearest US target — the American Embassy and the flag which symbolizes to them oppression and misery.

Lengthy congressional hearings are then held in Washington, as legislators wonder why so many foreign leaders have become anti-American and what their corrupt predecessors have done with billions of dollars in US foreign aid? Instead of taking steps to ensure that the assistance provided by the United States reaches the neediest segments of society, Congress often threatens to cut off all aid to teach the new leaders a lesson, thereby antagonizing them even more!



Most problematic is the risky role the United States plays in regional conflicts. Due to misperceived interests, American officials too often throw their weight around, rushing headlong into unnecessary wars or taking one-sided positions, whereas a more balanced approach would be more productive in peacefully mediating these conflicts.

Caution is particularly necessary during an election year, when US presidential candidates make overly partisan statements to pander to the interests of diverse constituencies. A careless remark can have far-reaching consequences, tarnishing America's image and alienating millions of people around the world.

Most Arabs and Muslims are convinced that America has not been an honest broker in the Arab-Israeli conflict. As a result, they harbor great resentment and deepseated anger toward the United States. Any provocation, such as burning the Koran or making anti-Muslim movies, triggers a violent reaction. While US laws protect even the vilest forms of speech, people must realize that words have consequences; and just because it is legal to say something, it may not be prudent to do so!

However, in all fairness, not every hostile act in the world should be blamed on US foreign policies. There are extremists in every race, religion, and nation motivated by hostile ideologies with the sole aim of causing indiscriminate destruction. Regrettably, Western governments and societies often mistakenly blame everyone who shares the racial and religious affiliation of few extremists, thereby antagonizing millions of peaceful citizens.

Fortunately, there is no shortage of learned scholars in academia and experts in governmental agencies who can advise and educate US leaders, many lacking basic knowledge of world affairs. A case in point is a conversation Pres. George W. Bush had with three Iraqi-Americans. When the President was informed about the existence of different Islamic sects in Iraq, he reportedly told his guests that he did not know there were Sunnis and Shias in that country. "I thought the Iraqis were Muslims," he was quoted as saying!

While bad movies can trigger short-term outbreaks of violence, bad foreign policies can cause long-term damage to US national interests.

## Expert in Iran: USA tries to play Azerbaijani card to destabilize Iran

Washington decided to play Azerbaijani card to destabilize Iran for it is well aware of the high risks of a military attack on that country. Earlier U.S. Congressman Dane Rorabaher has introduced a legislative initiative to the House of Representatives (H. CON. RES. 137) on his return from Azerbaijan, which pursues that very goal, Vardan Voskanyan, an expert in Iran, told media in Yerevan, Wednesday.

The draft resolution says "the Azerbaijani people is divided between Azerbaijan and Iran and have the right to self-determination and to their own sovereign country if they so choose." The expert believes that the given document contains many wrong theses and is, actually, another provocation of the West against Iran.

"The point is that there is no Azerbaijani people in Iran as such. Those are Turkic-language Iranians who, by the way, behave to the Caucasian Tatars - residents of the current Republic of



Azerbaijan extremely disparagingly. They have never identified themselves with the population of today's Azerbaijan, I think that all the attempts to conduct the referendum suggested by the congressman are doomed to failure and aim to destabilize the domestic political situation in Iran by means of the ethnic factor," the expert said.

Voskanyan said that Turkey with the support of Washington tries to oust the Iranian factor from Azerbaijan fostering suppressions of Talishes - autochthonous Persian-speaking population of Azerbaijan.

"In this light, it is noteworthy that an official Consulate of Turkey has been opened in Lankaran, an actual capital of Talishstan. Never before there was a Turkish element in the territories populated by Talishes," Voskanyan said.

## Russian, Armenian DMs discuss bilateral military cooperation

Russian Defence Minister Anatoly Serdyukov met with his Armenian counterpart Seyran Ohanyan on Wednesday, September 19, to discuss bilateral military-to-military cooperation between the two countries.

"About 10 military compounds, which are being vacated as part of the optimisation of the 102nd Russian Military Base, will be handed over to Armenia," Serdyukov said.

"The plan of cooperation between our ministries has been successfully implemented in 2012. We pay a great deal of attention to the improvement of the regulatory framework and solve questions pertaining to operational planning and military-technical cooperation," he said.

"We instructed experts to prepare with a month a plan of cooperation between our ministries in 2013," he added.

Serdyukov attended a joint military exercise of the Collective Security Treaty Organisation (CSTO) code-named Vzaimodeistviye- 2012 (Cooperation -2012 ) that ended at the Marshal Baghramyan training ground in Armenia on September

The exercise involved about 2,000 troops from six CSTO countries: Russia, Armenia, Belarus, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, and Tajikistan. The participating troops will practice interoperability and use of collective security system means in the Caucasus, with the support of aviation and artillery units, including multiple rocket launchers.

The main stage of the manoeuvres on September 19 included a show for foreign diplomats and for-



eign mass media as well as a special operation to respond to a terrorist threat and deal with the consequences of an emergency situation. Interior Ministry, Emergencies Ministry and rescue service units will participate.

"The philosophy of the exercise is to respond to a situation quickly and effectively using the smallest possible number of troops," Armenian Defence Ministry spokesperson Artsrun Oganesyan said.

The Russian contingent was represented by units of the 98th Airborne Division stationed in Ivanovo. They have been provided with arms and military equipment by the 102nd Russian Military Base which is deployed in Armenia in accordance with an interstate treaty.

Armenia hosted the CSTO rapid reaction force exercise to show the capability of the Armed Forces, secret services, emergencies ministries, and police, and the high level of their interoperability among the 7 CSTO member states, Security Council Secretary Artur Bagdasaryan said earlier.

He reiterated that Armenia plans to increase the role of the Collective Security Treaty Organisation (CSTO) as a key element of its national defence.

"We plan to increase the role of the CSTO as one of the key elements of Armenia's security. The CSTO is evolving, and Armenia, as one of the most active members of the organisation, is actively involved in this process," he said.

According to Bagdasaryan, "a new strategy and a new CSTO planning concept ... makes it possible to increase the role, weight and importance of this international organisation for ensuring the security of its member states."

The CSTO is a military-political alliance of seven countries: Armenia, Belarus, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Russia, Tajikistan, and Uzbekistan. It was created on the basis of the Collective Security Treaty of the May 15, 1992, which was turned into an international organisation on May 14, 2002. The CSTO received the status of observer at the U.N. General Assembly on December 2, 2004.

## Political Scapegoats?: President Sargsyan Scolds Government For 'Kickbacks'

Social networks over the past weekend were actively discussing information about a government meeting where President Serzh Sargsyan sharply criticized the government and made some serious accusations.

The head of the Control Service under the President, Hovhannes Hovsepyan, presented the results of audits in the system of procurement during which the service concluded that serious violations are committed in the sphere. In particular, state agencies squander budget money by holding non-transparent tenders and buying goods at prices higher than elsewhere in the market.

Sargsyan said that in a number of areas, such as urban development, transportation and communications, defense, health, and especially in the market of medicines, there are many problems associated with the procurement and disposal of public funds. The head of state instructed the National Security Service and the Prosecutor General's Office to seriously address this issue. "I want you all to become not only formal, but real, allies who are interested in solving these problems," Sargsyan underscored.

This attitude drew skeptical comments from many who remembered similar statements by the president that remain without legal consequences.

The opposition has already described it as a "theatrical show". On the other hand, it led some

experts to assume that Sargsyan is going to dismiss his government in order to comply with the demand of the Prosperous Armenia Party (PAP) and ex-president Robert Kocharyan, who stands behind it. The PAP and Kocharyan apparently want to see "their" man as prime

Commenting on such assumptions, spokesman for the ruling Republican Party of Armenia (RPA), Deputy Seaker of parliament Edward Sharmazanov said that the statement of President Sargsyan simply means that those in the upper echelons of power do know what is really going on.

"Yes, there are problems. We say that there is corruption in the country. But we also say that the RPA has not discussed the issue of changing the prime minister and the party trusts the political course of its government," he said.

Prime Minister Tigran Sargsvan assured President Sargsyan that the government will discuss in detail the issues raised and will provide a schedule of its activities to address them. "All of these estimations that you gave have sobered us and force us to make major adjustments in our activities, and we will do it by all means," said Prime Minister Sargsyan.

The sphere of procurements has always been considered one of the most corrupt in Armenia. Under the guise of tenders deals are concluded as a result of which businessmen receive government contracts at overestimated prices, and in return responsible government



officials receive "kickbacks".

This is a corrupt practice typical of Russia where many foreign investors say kickbacks are a usual phenomenon.

A few years ago more than 400 foreign companies operating in Russia wrote a petition agreeing not to pay bribes and kickbacks. But after a few months, many admitted that without such kickbacks it was simply impossible to obtain government contracts.

Businessmen say the same thing about Armenia, and recipients of government contracts are usually large oligarchs who are represented both in power and in business.

A few days ago information appeared in the Armenian press

that a U.S. federal court in New York ordered Armenia's ex-minister of environment and current MP Vardan Ayvazyan to pay more than \$37 million in damages to a U.S. mining company that has accused him of corruption.

The Global Gold Corporation publicly accused Ayvazyan in 2006 of demanding a \$3 million bribe from its top executives after the Armenian Ministry of Environment terminated the company's license to carry out exploratory and mining operations at a small gold deposit in Hankavan.

A new Facebook group, "Fighting Oligarchs", has emerged online, with hundreds of users already joining it. This matter became particularly topical after last summer's deadly beating of military doctor Vahe Avetyan at a restaurant belonging to Ruben Hayrapetyan, a government-connected MP and affluent business-

Vahe Avetyan's sister and the 'Vahe Avetyan' civil movement appealed to the international community and foreign states with a demand to block entry to their countries to Armenian officials involved in the violations of laws and human rights. They suggest creating a so-called "Avetyan list" like the famous "Magnitsky list" created by the U.S.

Congress that prohibits entry to the United States for officials who violate the law and human rights in

Crisis has reached a phase of a national war and has already caused thousands of deaths, including Armenians.

So the estimation of R. Giragosian is correct, though not entirely. In the bilateral blockade by Azerbaijan and Turkey, as well as in the condition of military confrontation with Baku and the insecurity in the Greater Middle East, it was important for Armenia to demonstrate that it is a part of the significant military and political bloc, the head of which is a country (Russia) that has a powerful strategic arsenal. This demonstration was also very important, as NATO refused to take responsibility for the security of Armenia.

The second important event on the eve of the celebrations was a government meeting conducted on September 15th. During the meeting, a part of which was aired on television, President Serzh Sargsyan expressed his open, though soft dissatisfaction connected to the government actions. Particularly, the Ministry of Health was criticized, which was headed by the representatives of the Prosperous Armenia party till the last elections. The President suddenly mentioned most of his pre-election campaign promises in 2008, spoke about fighting

against the corruption. The President also expressed his dissatisfaction in the process of the public procurement and the lack of control over the budget expenditures.

The most interesting thing in this situation is that the uncontrolled administration editions of S. Sargsyan are filled with reports of numerous violations in this area. Even the official report of the Control Chamber is full of disturbing facts about the merging of business and government agencies. Note also the fact, that the Republican Party of Armenia (RPA) controls the head of the government for 13 years. It has decided to decentralize the public procurement budgetary programs. Previously, the entire process was carried out by the Procurement Agency, which now provides only a general inspection.

At the same time, there's an impression that the law enforcement agencies do not pay attention to the reports of corruption and their "efficiency" occurs only during the struggle with the opposition.

The remarks by President Serzh Sargsyan on the mentioned meeting of the government is seen as a PRelection campaign, which is to show the citizens the traditional Russian-Byzantine political strategy, which is "Good, caring about the people, the king and the bad boyars".

At the same time, the fact, that

the same king (the President) could appoint other boyars at the end of the last parliamentary elections, is somehow silenced.

Why?

Because President Serzh Sargsyan is completely satisfied with the economic policy pursued by the Government of Tigran Sargsyan, and the philosophy of this government policy, when the capital flight and the citizens' emigration from the country reached such a level, that we can talk about the threat to the national security of Armenia.

The third significant event on the of the anniversary of Independence was the publication of the decision of the Court of the as well as in WikiLeaks, confirming Southern District of New York, at the decision of the American Court. the suit of the American company "Global Gold Mining" against the former Minister of Nature Protection, Vardan Ayvazyan, who, as a member of the ruling Republican Party, after the last elections in May 2012, is head of one of the leading committees.

According to the Court, the Judgment Processing Service of the Southern District of New York ordered a writ of execution in favor of "Global Gold Mining", according to which V. Ayvazyan will have to pay a penalty to the plaintiff an amount of more than U.S. \$ 37.5 million.

What is the case? In the mid-2000s, one of the subsidiaries of the company "Global Gold Mining", which holds the license to operate a gold mine in Hankavan, was subjected to corruptible and improper requirements by the then Minister of Nature Protection Vardan Ayvazyan. The company has informed the authorities of Armenia and the United States about this.

As a result, due to V. Ayzavyan, the company has lost its control over the mine in Hankavan.

Numerous publications on the subject (where, in particular, was discussed that Ayvazyan demanded a bribe of U.S. \$ 3 million) were published in the uncontrolled media,

In this process, the following should be noted:

- The owner of "Global Gold Mining" is Van Krikorian - a famous Armenian lawyer in the United States and a famous Armenian lobbyist of the Armenian Assembly of America, who is also a part of the "Turkish-Armenian Reconciliation Commission"

- It is possible that the decision on the claim of "Global Gold Mining" can be transferred to the U.S. State Department, which automatically will transform into a political issue.

It's not a secret in Armenia that the top officials demand huge bribes from the foreign investors, including

the Diaspora, for the right to work in the country. Most of the potential investors refuse to pay the bribes and leave. The other part agrees, and thus, becomes a part of the corrupt machinations.

V.Krikorian was the first foreign investor and the first representative of the Diaspora, who not only refused to pay a bribe, but decided to punish the corrupt high-ranking official. And it has been made in a very

V. Ayvazyan held a press conference, gave lengthy interviews and made statements about the meaninglessness of the aforementioned decision. He also claims that the Armenian Government must take the responsibility for his decisions and actions. But the social and journalistic response to the revelations of V. Ayvazyan is quite cool. We must assume that the President Serzh Sargsyan and the ruling Republican Party will have to make a decision on the current situation. Meanwhile, the Armenian sector of social networks already requires that V. Ayvazyan passed the parliamentary mandate.

Considering all the aforementioned, it should be noted that the celebration of the 21st Anniversary of Independence of Armenia was marked in controversial feelings, but certainly its citizens didn't lose their hope for a better future.

### Member of "Apollo 16" Moon Mission Took Part in Conference in NKR Capital



Charles Duke, a retired US Air Force brigadier general, and a former United States astronaut for NASA took part in the "Man and Space" conference in NKR capital Stepanakert on September 16.

The conference was also attended by Claude Nicollier, the first astronaut from Switzerland, who has flown on four Space Shuttle missions.

"Man and Space" conference was dedicated to U.S. astronaut Neil Armstrong who passed away this August. The conference was organized by Garik Israelian, Armenian astrophysicist, who lives and works in Spain.

As lunar module pilot for Apollo 16 in 1972 Charles Duke became the tenth and youngest of the 12 people who have walked on the Moon. A resident of New Braunfels, Texas, he is currently chairman of the board of directors of the Astronaut Scholarship Foundation.

Claude Nicollier has flown on four Space Shuttle missions. His first spaceflight (STS-46) was in 1992, and his final spaceflight (STS-103) was in 1999. He took part in two servicing missions to the Hubble Space Telescope (called STS-61 and STS-103). During his final spaceflight he participated in a spacewalk, becoming the first European Space Agency astronaut to do so during a Space Shuttle mission.

## Ismail Besikçi from Turkey and "Memorial" from Russia receive 2012 International **Hrant Dink Award**

Prominent scholar and sociologist Dr. Ismail Besikçi has received the fourth International Hrant Dink Award for his work on Kurds, the foundation of the Republic of Turkey and the singleparty era in Turkey.

Besikçi received the award for his tireless efforts towards a social and political solution of the Kurdish Issue, refusing to be silenced despite being subjected to threats and maltreatment throughout his life. Besikçi has continued to carry out research, write books and by sustaining his struggle he has allowed society to confront its problems, and made real transformation possible.

Thirty-two of the 36 books the scholar has written are currently forbidden in Turkey. For many years, he was the only non-Kurdish person in Turkey to speak out loud and clearly in defense of the rights of the Kurds. He has been described as "modern Turkey's pioneer of Kurdish stud-



ies". At the ceremony he said he was honored by the jury's selec-

The second laureate this year was the International Memorial Society, a Russian human rights organization founded by the mothers of Russian soldiers who stood against the Russian-Chechen war.

Alexander Cherkasov, the chairman of the Memorial Human Rights Center received the 2012 International Human Rights Award on behalf of the International Memorial Society. Memorial received the award for their systematic effort to form an archive of state terrorism, and to reveal human rights violations.

The Jury of the International Hrant Dink Award 2012 consists of Ahmet Altan, Tim Garton Ash, Emma Bonino, Lydia Cacho, Rakel Dink, Costa Gavras, Nilüfer Göle, Alexander Iskandaryan and Etyen Mahçupyan.

## Who Gave 20 Thousand Dollars to the **Governor as a Present?**

The governor's written response reads, 'We would like to inform you that the data that can be made public and are included in a high-ranking official?s tax, property and income



statement are clearly and fully enumerated in the decision no. 1835-N of the Cabinet of the Republic of Armenia dated December 15, 2011. Giving information beyond that is not provided for by the decision, which mentions the data to be made public?

## The European Wushu Federation is engaged in fraud

This idea was expressed by Tigran Chobanyan, the president of the Armenian Wushu Federation, during a press conference in Noyan Tapan News Agency at 17 September. He also informed the journalists that the relations between the European and Armenian Federations had deteriorated because of the deliberate fraud against Armenia at the 2010 2012 European Championships.

"This story started in 2010 when the U.S. Congress recognized the Armenian Genocide," Tigran Chobanyan said. "The news reached Turkey when we were crossing that country's border heading for the European Championship. Once we reached the destination, we felt on our own skin that everything was done at the state level, in order that our flag was not raised and our anthem was not played in Turkey. And the tool in this whole story was Alexander Raduntsev, the chief referee of the championship who was an ambitious, unfair and revengeful person residing in Kazakhstan, but for some reason being a member of the German Federation. He did whatever he could, in order that representatives of Armenia were not among the referees, although Raymond Smith, the president of the European Wushu Federation (EWuF), had personally invited our referees. Consequently, we had serious problems with obviously biased refereeing. Our federation filed a complaint regarding one fight and the referee and technical committees satisfied our complaint finding the Armenian fighter the winner. However, at the meeting, Peter Warr, the chairman of the technical committee, literally asked the people present, 'But the opponent is a Turk, is it OK?'

"Anyway, the decision was already made, but we found out later that grossly violating the rules, they had maintained the former decision in our absence. The Armenian Federation stated that if

the justice was not restored, our national team would boycott the opening ceremony to take place on the same day. They convinced us at the time that the decision of the referee and technical committees was illegal and they would necessarily change it. Raymond Smith, in turn, expressed discontent that there had been no such gross violation in the history of the European Federation and that it was a disgrace. However, as it turned out later, he was lying to us too.

"The very same thing happened this March at the European Championship in Tallinn, after which the Armenian Federation made a demand to dismiss Alexander Raduntsev from the office of the chief referee and in case of not satisfying the demand, the Armenian national team would refuse to participate in the European Championships as long as that person was the chief referee. That letter-demand was sent also to the other national federations. Almost all teams complained about Radutsev's activities in Tallinn. Belgian Patrick Copenhaut, the senior secretary of the EWuF, members of the EWuF executive committee, Petru Grindeanu (Romania) and Henk Verschuur (Holland), promised that we would not be alone in this struggle... they also lied to us.

"And the worst thing is that after all this, instead of punishing that Alexander Raduntsev, the EWuF imposed a punishment on the Armenian Federation forbidding us to participate in the European Championships until 2014. Admittedly, they mentioned in their response to our official letter that they had ostensibly imposed sanctions on Raduntsev too, but there is nothing said about the sanctions, what kind of sanctions they are. And I allow myself not to believe. The response reads that the European Federation forbids us to participate in the championships under its aegis, whereas, as I have already said, we boythe cotted European Championship, in the first place."

## Song mentioning Armenian Genocide in top five in US

The phrase on the Armenian Genocide promoted in the song by Derek Barbosa, who is known as the rapper Chino XL, appears in the top five of the week in the U.S. charts, occupying the third place. The American rapper wrote the following phrase 'Got a love for hip-hop that could never be lost/Even if it ignores me like the media ignored slavery and Armenian holocaust' in his song Eye (Stomp), The Grio.com reports. 'We especially appreciated the note of the early twentieth century Armenian genocide, a terrible and not-officially-acknowledged incident that the U.S. power structure only ever sees fit to bring up when it's trying to score political points against Turkey,' The Grio.com claimed.



### Here's a weight loss tip for you: Get some sleep!

In common weight-loss advice, "get more sleep," should figure just as prominently as "eat less" and "move more," two researchers in Canada argue.

There is strong evidence that lack of sleep is contributing to the obesity epidemic, they said, and factors that contribute to obesity that have been given less attention than diet and exercise may at least partly explain why weight-loss efforts fail, according to the researchers.

"Among the behavioural factors that have been shown to impede weight loss, insufficient sleep is gaining attention and recognition," the researchers write in their editorial published today (Sept. 17) in the Canadian Medical Association Journal.

The researchers pointed to a 2010 study in which participants were randomly assigned to sleep either 5.5 hours or 8.5 hours every night for 14 days. They all cut their daily calorie intake by 680 calories, and slept in a lab. Participants who slept for 5.5 hours lost 55 percent less body fat, and 60 percent more of their lean body mass than those who slept for longer.

In other words, the sleep-deprived people held onto their fat tissue, and instead lost muscle.

In another study, published in July, researchers looked at 245 women in a six-month weight loss program and found that those who slept more than seven hours a night, and those who reported better quality sleep, were 33 percent more likely to succeed in their weight-loss efforts.

In a large analysis of the link, researchers looked at 36 studies, including 635,000 people around the world, and found that adults who didn't get enough sleep were 50 percent more likely to be obese, an children who didn't get enough sleep were 90 percent more likely to be obese, compared with those who got

People's success in weight-loss programs varies greatly, and

including advice about sleep in weight-loss programs could improve success rates, the researchers said.

While the exact way that losing sleep may contribute to obesity is not understood, studies have shown that lack of sleep affects the parts of the brain that control pleasure eating. It's also been shown that levels of the hormones leptin, ghrelin, cortisol and orexin - all of which are involved in appetite or eating - are affected by lack of sleep, the researchers said.

Health care providers might be better able to help their overweight and obese patients by screening for sleep disorders, according to researchers Jean-Philippe Chaput, of the Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario Research Institute, and Angelo Tremblay, of Laval University in Quebec.

Future research should look at ways that people could get more sleep - for example, by decreasing the amount of time they spend on other activities such as watching TV in the evening and see whether getting more sleeps affects weight-loss efforts.
