

Armenia celebrates Republic Day



On the occasion of the Republic Day, Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan together with President Vahagn Khachaturyan, President of the National Assembly Alen Simonyan, top leadership of the Republic of Armenia and diplomatic missions accredited in Armenia visited the Memorial Complex of Sardarapat Battle, the Office of the Prime Minister informs Noyan Tapan.

Nikol Pashinyan laid a wreath at the memorial to the heroes of the Battle of Sardarapat and paid tribute to their memory.

The Prime Minister also attended the state awards ceremony at the Sardarapat Memorial, Museum of Armenian Ethnography.

Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan has issued a statement on the occasion of the Republic Day. The message reads:

Dear compatriots, dear people. I congratulate all of us on the occasion of the Republic Day.

Today we mark one of the most important events in our history – the day of founding of the First Republic. Why is this day so important to us? For three reasons. First, because we obtained a statehood after a pause of more than 500 years. The second reason is that for the first time we had a Republic, that is, a state order, where power is formed as a result of the people’s choice. The third reason is that we were able to create the Republic, the state, which is the highest institution of organization of any nation, at a moment of despair, when the deadly wheel of the Armenian Genocide continued to spin.



Armenian PM hosts President of Montenegro Milo Đukanović

Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan hosted the delegation led by President of Montenegro Milo Đukanović, who is in Armenia on an official visit.

Welcoming the guests in Yerevan, the Prime Minister said, “We attach great importance to the relations with Montenegro, I am sure that your visit will give a new impetus to the further development of our relations. I was pleased to note that, in fact, there are long-established relations between our capitals; in 1978, a memorandum of understanding was signed between our capitals. I hope that in this new environment, when our countries have independence, we will be able to properly develop interstate relations and deepen economic relations. Admittedly, we do not have much to boast about today. Dear Mr. President, Dear colleagues, I once again welcome you in our capital and I am sure you will have a good and impressive visit.”

In his turn, Milo Đukanović thanked for the warm reception and noted, “I am very happy to be here, because as I told the Minister of Economy and the Mayor



of Yerevan, at school age I was able to come here from Belgrade in the sidelines of the exchange program between Titograd and Yerevan and spend some time in Yerevan. I have very good memories. Unfortunately, during this period I have not had the opportunity to come to your beautiful country, I am glad to be here. As you said, the first cooperation was when our countries were part of larger states, the Soviet Union and Yugoslavia. Now we are in a new political reality, we are independent states, and I believe that both of us are interested and able to deepen this cooperation. Montenegro is a small country and I think small

countries can, need it more urgently or it's more important for them to be politically active. Our main foreign policy goal is European, Euro-Atlantic integration. Of course, we are following the developments in your region, we want to have close cooperation with the Eurasian region as well, because there are already traditional relations between our countries.”

The interlocutors discussed issues related to the development of cooperation in the field of economy, in particular, information technologies, tourism, agriculture. The parties expressed readiness to make efforts to expand business ties, trade turnover and facilitate the implementation of joint investment programs.

Nikol Pashinyan and Milo Đukanović exchanged views on the processes taking place in the South Caucasus. The Prime Minister presented the position of the Armenian side on the peaceful settlement of the Nagorno Karabakh conflict. The sides also made a reference to the processes taking place in the international arena.

The Prime Minister noted with satisfaction that the Armenian-French cooperation is developing dynamically, and Armenia is interested in the continuous strengthening of the privileged relations with friendly France, both bilaterally and multilaterally. Nikol Pashinyan stressed the role of France as a Co-chair of the OSCE Minsk Group in the comprehensive settlement of the Nagorno Karabakh conflict.

Thanking the Armenian Prime Minister for the appreciation, Ambassador Louyot noted that France attaches great importance to the cooperation with friendly Armenia and is ready to continue the efforts to strengthen it.

The interlocutors discussed issues related to the Armenian-French bilateral relations, the Nagorno Karabakh conflict, the regional situation and developments.

Armenian Deputy PM describes first border commission meeting with Azerbaijan as “constructive”

Deputy Prime Minister Mher Grigoryan described as “constructive” the first meeting of the commissions on delimitation and border security between Armenia and Azerbaijan.

Grigoryan, who is the head of the Armenian commission, told TASS News Agency that organizational issues relating exclusively to the future joint work were discussed at the first meeting.

“We met on the border on May 24. I

consider the meeting to be constructive. There is no agreement yet on the date of the next meeting of the commissions, but there is a confirmation that the meeting will take place in Moscow,” Deputy PM Grigoryan said.

Grigoryan added that next week Moscow will host the meeting of the Armenia-Russia-Azerbaijan trilateral deputy prime-ministerial working group on unblocking of transport and economic con-

nections.



page 1 ➔ The First Republic of Armenia was proclaimed on May 28, 1918 after the heroic battles of Sardarapat, Bash-Aparan, Gharakilisa. It was the period when it seemed to be the end, that it was impossible to not only have a statehood, but also to preserve our identity, language and culture.

However, our people were able to act as one fist at a crucial moment, building the First Republic by uniting forces, consolidation. The role of Aram Manukyan, Tovmas Nazarbekyan, Movses Silikyan, Dro, Nzhdeh, Daniel and Poghos Bek Pirumyans, the commander of the Yazidi cavalry division Jhangir Agha, the clergymen with weapons in hands is undeniable.

The sacred independence gained through the efforts of these great men and thousands of other compatriots was lost



in just two and a half years. This was preceded by war, tragic territorial and human losses. This happened because for two years the First Republic of Armenia failed, did not manage to achieve political, international, regional institutional resilience, to establish peace around itself.

lenges. The founding fathers of the First Republic did not even have time to make the newborn state resilient to global challenges. We have sadly wasted a lot of time during the Third Republic.

But the heroes of Sardarapat, the founding fathers of the First Republic, inspire us continuously. And the state, independence, sovereignty is another inseparable part of our national self-consciousness. The state, the statehood must become the subject of our daily work, adoration, respect, peace must become the environment in the conditions of which we must pass on the statehood received from the founding fathers of the First Republic to our generations for centuries.

Congratulations on May 28. Happy Armenian state revival day.

PM Pashinyan receives US Ambassador to Armenia

Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan received the Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the United States of America to the Republic of Armenia Lynne Tracy.

The Prime Minister emphasized the intensification of the Armenian-American cooperation and strategic dialogue, attaching great importance to the clear position of the United States, as an OSCE Minsk Group Co-chair country, on the settlement of the Nagorno Karabakh conflict, which contributes to regional stability. Nikol Pashinyan noted that the Armenian government is guided by the peace agenda and

highly appreciates the continuous support of international partners, including the United States to that process.

Lynne Tracy thanked the Prime Minister for appreciation, reaffirmed the US readiness to continue supporting our country's democratic reforms, the settlement of the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict, and the establishment of regional stability. In this context, Lynne Tracy mentioned the telephone conversation of the Armenian Prime Minister with US Secretary of State Antony Blinken a few days ago, as well as expressed the satisfaction of the US side with the efforts of the Armenian Ambassador to



the USA Lilit Makunts aimed at intensifying bilateral relations.

The interlocutors exchanged views on the agenda of the Armenian-American relations.

Armenian PM emphasizes the role of the Minsk Group Co-Chairmanship in the settlement of the Karabakh conflict

Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan received Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the Russian Federation to Armenia Sergey Kopirkin.

The Prime Minister noted that the Armenian-Russian allied relations have been developing dynamically in recent years, emphasizing the contribution of the Russian Embassy in Armenia.

According to Nikol Pashinyan, there are close contacts between the partners of the two countries, which is important in giving a new impetus to the cooperation.

At the same time, the Prime Minister attached importance to the regular meetings with the Ambassadors of the OSCE Minsk Group Co-Chair countries and stressed the importance of the above-mentioned format in the settlement of the Nagorno Karabakh conflict.

Sergey Kopirkin thanked the Prime Minister for highly appreciating the activities of the Embassy, emphasizing that their goal is to do everything possible to contribute to the further development of bilateral allied and fraternal relations.

The interlocutors discussed issues related to the agenda of Armenian-Russian cooperation, the settlement of the Nagorno Karabakh conflict and the processes taking place in the South Caucasus region.



Opposition wants parliament declaration on Artsakh

The two opposition blocs represented in Armenia's parliament have demanded that it officially speak out against any peace accord that would restore Azerbaijan's control over Nagorno-Karabakh.

Leaders of the Hayastan and Pativ Unem blocs announced on May 25 plans to push a relevant resolution through the National Assembly as they continued daily demonstrations in Yerevan demanding Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan's resignation.

Hayastan's Artsvik Minasyan said on Thursday that they will try to force an emergency session of the parliament for that purpose on June 3.

"The purpose of this statement is to clarify whether we are going to protect our interests or serve the interests of the Turkish-Azerbaijani duo," said Armen Rustamyan, another senior Hayastan par-



liamentarian. "If they [the parliament's pro-government majority] don't accept this resolution it will mean that they serve the interests of the Turkish-Azerbaijani duo."

Lawmakers representing Pashinyan's Civil Contract party would not say whether the parliamentary majority will back the resolution or at least agree to discuss it on the parliament floor.

"Let them come [to the parliament] and

we'll figure out," one of them, Artur Hovannisyan, told reporters.

Opposition lawmakers have been boycotting regular sessions of the National Assembly since the start of the anti-government protests in Yerevan on May 1.

The protests began two weeks after Pashinyan signaled his readiness to "lower the bar" on Artsakh's status acceptable to Armenia. Critics claim that

he pledged to recognize Azerbaijani sovereignty over the Armenian-populated territory in ongoing peace talks mediated by the European Union.

Pashinyan's political allies deny such claims. But they have not publicly clarified whether Yerevan will insist on the Karabakh Armenians' right to self-determination in planned negotiations on a peace treaty with Baku.

Iran reiterates support for Armenia's territorial integrity

(RL/RFE) - Following further progress made towards the opening of Armenian-Azerbaijani transport links, a senior Iranian diplomat reaffirmed on Friday his country's opposition to any extraterritorial corridors that would pass through Armenia.

"All that should be done by respecting the internationally recognized borders of the countries," said Abbas Badakhshan Zohouri, Iran's ambassador to Armenia. "Iran will support all initiatives corresponding to international law and norms."

Armenian Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan and Azerbaijani President Ilham Aliyev reportedly reached major understandings on the issue at their May 22 talks in Brussels hosted by European Council President Charles Michel. The latter said they agreed on "principles of border administration, security, land fees but also customs in the context of international transport."

Aliyev told his Turkish counterpart Recep Tayyip Erdogan afterwards that he and Pashinyan agreed to open a "Zangezur corridor" that will connect Azerbaijan to its

Nakhichevan exclave through Armenia's southeastern Syunik province bordering Iran. Armenian officials denied that, saying that Yerevan and Baku are discussing conventional transport links between the two South Caucasus states.

Aliyev had publicly demanded earlier that people and cargo using the corridor be exempt from Armenian border controls. Armenian leaders rejected his demands.

Iranian President Ebrahim Raisi backed Yerevan's position in January, telling Pashinyan that Tehran supports Armenian sovereignty over all roads passing through Armenia. Zohouri reaffirmed that stance when he visited Syunik early this month.

Syunik is the only Armenian province that borders Iran. Some Iranian lawmakers accused Aliyev last fall of seeking to effectively strip Iran of a common border with Armenia.

Zohouri on Friday called for stronger economic ties between Syunik and Iran's East Azerbaijan province bordering Armenia.

"It is obvious that very close cooperation between the two border provinces can

have great advantages," he told reporters in Yerevan.

The Iranian ambassador also emphasized Russia's involvement in the efforts to open the Armenian-Azerbaijani border to trade and other cargo shipments. He pointed to the work of a Russian-Armenian-Azerbaijani task force dealing with practical modalities of the planned transport links.

Zohouri did not mention the European Union's separate peace efforts criticized by Moscow.

Paris Mayor Anne Hidalgo arrives in Yerevan for official visit



Mayor of Paris Anne Hidalgo has ar-

rived in Armenia on an official visit. At Zvartnots International Airport she was welcomed by First Deputy Mayor of Yerevan Levon Hovhannisyan. The latter voice hope that during the forthcoming meetings in Yerevan Municipality, the parties will not only discuss the programs already implemented, but will also reach agreements on new areas of cooperation.

The Mayor of Paris Anne Hidalgo expressed gratitude for the warm reception,

and assured that the capital of France is ready to support and assist to the best of its ability the city, which gave Paris the idea of "Tumo."

Within the framework of the visit, Anne Hidalgo will meet with the Mayor of Yerevan Hrachya Sargsyan. Issues related to further cooperation and current programs of the capitals of Armenia and France will be discussed during the meeting.

Artsakh President receives the Mayor of Paris

On May 27, President of the Artsakh Republic Arayik Harutyunyan received the delegation led by Mayor of Paris Anne Hidalgo.

During a tête-à-tête meeting, the President expressed words of satisfaction to the Mayor of Paris for the initiative and courage, emphasizing that the Artsakh authorities highly appreciate the

regular contacts with the French political circles.

Expressing gratitude for the warm re-



ception, Anne Hidalgo noted that Paris is ready to exert the necessary efforts to support the people of Artsakh within the

framework of humanitarian programs.

Thereafter, an extended meeting was held with the participation of representatives of the legislative and executive bodies of the Artsakh Republic, RA Ambassador to France Hasmik Tolmajian, members of the ARF Bureau, officials of the Coordinating Council of Armenian Organizations of France, Governor of Syunik Robert Ghukasyan and other officials. A wide range of humanitarian issues were

on the agenda.

The meeting was held in the town of Goris in Armenia's Syunik Province.

Armenian FM received the Personal Representative of the OSCE Chairperson-in-Office




Armenian Foreign Minister Ararat Mirzoyan received the Personal Representative of the OSCE Chairperson-in-Office Andrzej Kasprzyk.

He said the localization of space technologies and launching production of space equipment in the Republic of Armenia are among the primary goals.

"A space management center will be created in Armenia by the end of the year," he said, adding that the center will be tasked with managing the satellite and



getting space photos.

"The space photos will be used for border surveillance, prevention and management of emergency situations, protection of the environment, including climate change monitoring, urbanization, road construction, and other spheres," PM Pashinyan stated.

Kazakh Senate ratifies deal on duty-free supply of oil products to Armenia



The Senate (upper house) of the Parliament of Kazakhstan on May 26 ratified an intergovernmental agreement with Armenia on trade and economic cooperation in the field of supplies of oil products to the country. The agreement with Armenia was

signed in Nur-Sultan in July 2020.

"The agreement provides for: non-collection of export customs duties on goods supplied from Kazakhstan to Armenia for domestic consumption in the volumes provided for by indicative balances; a ban on the supply of specified goods that are not approved by the list, as well as not provided for by indicative balances," the committee on economic politics, innovative development and entrepreneurship of the Senate said.

At the same time, the specified goods

supplied from Kazakhstan to Armenia are not subject to export to third countries and the countries of the EAEU. If facts of violation of this obligation are revealed, the Kazakh side reserves the right to prohibit or suspend duty-free supplies of these goods.

After ratification by the Senate, the agreement on cooperation in the field of supplying oil products to Armenia will go to the signature of the President of Kazakhstan, Kassym-Jomart Tokayev.

World Bank boss warns over global recession

The head of the World Bank has warned that the war in Ukraine could cause a global recession as the price of food, energy and fertilizer jump, the BBC reports.

David Malpass told a US business event on May 25 that it is difficult to "see how we avoid a recession."

He also said a series of coronavirus lockdowns in China are adding to concerns about a slowdown.

His comments are the latest warning over the rising risk that the world economy may be set to contract.

"As we look at the global GDP... it's hard right now to see how we avoid a recession," Mr Malpass said, without giving a specific forecast.

"The idea of energy prices doubling is enough to trigger a recession by itself," he added.

Last month, the World Bank cut its

global economic growth forecast for this year by almost a full percentage point, to 3.2%.



Swiss development project worth CHF 12 million to reach most remote farmers in Armenia

On May 27, 2022, the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation SDC approved a grant worth CHF 12,000,000 for an economic development intervention in Armenia and launched an international tender process to identify an implementing partner. Titled “Sustainable and Inclusive Growth in Mountainous Armenia” SIGMA, this new SDC project will reduce poverty in mountainous areas of Armenia in an inclusive, innovative and climate-aware manner. With a duration of 10 years, SIGMA’s geographic focus will be on the poorest regions in Northern Armenia, reaching areas at an altitude of more than 1500m.

To achieve climate change-compatible and inclusive economic growth in mountainous Armenia, the SIGMA project will work with different players of local economies and the government, to the benefit of poorest rural households. With an innovative approach, SIGMA will launch and establish cooperation between the drivers of rural growth, which the project defines as “catalysts”, and the rest of mainly small businesses and farmers. “Catalysts” are rural entrepreneurs who are ready to take

additional risks for profit but eventually in favor of local economic growth as such. Those can be investors, buyers, bigger farmers, suppliers of agricultural inputs, or tourism-related enterprises. Through the project, small businesses and farms will improve their services and products, offering those for a higher value to the “catalysts” to be sold to new and expanded markets.

Working at an altitude of more than 1500m, the project will aim at leveraging growth in niche areas where mountainous regions have a comparative advantage. Sectors such as rural agriculture, wild botanicals, rural tourism, agricultural technologies, which do not harm the environment and contribute to climate change adaptation and mitigation, will be consistently pursued.

The project’s geographic focus will prioritize the poorest regions in Northern Armenia, namely Tavush, Gegharkunik, Lori, and Shirak. Starting on May 23, 2022 with a tender process, it will have a preparatory phase of 17 months. After that, the phase of implementation will last at least for 10 years (December 2023- 2033), with

Swiss funds amounting in total to CHF 12,000,000. During its first phase (2023 -2026), SIGMA will reach at least 3000 household, and further extend to 10’000 household by the end of its second phase. The project’s implementing partner will be selected through a Tender procedure, details on which are announced [here](#).

The SIGMA project is highly synergetic with other SDC development interventions in Armenia and in the wider region, as well as with a number of Armenian state policies. In Armenia, the project will draw linkages with the Swiss funded projects: “Living Landscapes for Market Development in Armenia” (LILA), including linkages promoting sustainable and inclusive rural tourism; the “Improvement of Local Self-Governance in Armenia”; “Modernizing Vocational Education and Training in Agriculture in Armenia (MAVETA); and the Regional “Women Economic Empowerment Programme” (WEE). In the wider South Caucasus region, the SDC sees a potential of upscaling SIGMA, going beyond the Armenian border, extending its synergies to the Swiss-funded Rural Development projects in Georgia.

Technologies an opportunity for economic breakthrough – PM Pashinyan participates in EAEU Forum

Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan participated in the Eurasian Economic Forum in Bishkek via video conference.

The event was also remotely attended by the President of the Russian Federation Vladimir Putin, the Prime Minister of Belarus Roman Golovchenko, the President of Kyrgyzstan Sadyr Japarov, the President of Kazakhstan Kassym-Jomart Tokayev, the Chairman of the Eurasian Economic Commission Mikhail Myasnikov. The forum was chaired by Alexander Shokhin, President of the Russian Union of Industrialists and Entrepreneurs.

In his speech, Prime Minister Pashinyan greeted the leaders of the countries participating in the forum, heads of delegations, and all those present, expressing hope that the successful holding of the event and the agreements to be reached within its framework will contribute to the further progress of Eurasian integration.

“As for the service sector, the services are really becoming a generator of new points for the development of economic cooperation between the countries of our Union. The role of this sector in the economy is constantly growing and certain types of services, as factors for production, have a significant impact on the competitiveness of goods, industries and economies. In this respect, the most important task of Eurasian integration is to ensure the free movement of services. This issue is being solved, including through the liberalization of the sector, the formation of a common market for services, which in turn expands the opportunities for business activation. We can say that the level of free movement of services is a unique indicator of integration.

The development of the trade of services is conditioned, among other things, by the development of scientific and technical progress in the field of cross-border trade, technological changes, which in it-



self is a tool for overcoming “geographical segregation” and is relevant for Armenia.

In this regard, special attention should be paid to the development of telecommunications and information technologies, guaranteeing their equal availability.

In this context, a key area of cooperation is the consolidation of the efforts of the IT communities of the Member States to actively develop the high-tech sectors of the economy and to fully implement the Union’s digital agenda. Within the framework of the implementation of the digital agenda, it is necessary to consistently promote the initiatives aimed at deepening the integration processes and receiving direct benefits for the economies and citizens of the EAEU member states.

As it is known, technological innovation is also beneficial for the provision of services. The age of information and digital technologies increases the international competitiveness of countries. And this is especially true for small countries like Armenia, which have limited influence on world processes due to geographical and geopolitical constraints. Information technologies provide a level playing field for all players, regardless of their position or capabilities. This is the reason why the Armenian Government considers the IT sector one of the bases for economic development.

We aim to expand our capabilities to become a country that produces, de-

livers high-quality, intelligence-based products and services at the heart of which will be the creative human capital.

In general, new technologies are an opportunity for economic breakthrough, a challenge for those who want to keep up with the progress of humanity. This sphere is of strategic importance for Armenia, as it is one of the unique branches,

which does not require ports, access to the sea, rich mineral resources for development. It requires human capital, and that is the resource with which Armenia has always stood out. From this point of view, we also pay great attention to the development of young people’s skills through the teaching of digital technologies.”

In response to the question of moderator of the forum Alexander Shokhin, Prime Minister Pashinyan noted that the Government of our country is making all efforts to make Armenia attractive especially for investments in the sphere of information technologies, and investments in all spheres in general. “We now see that there is a certain flow of IT specialists to Armenia, we understand the context, we try to create conditions for these movements within the EAEU to serve the further development of the Union’s integration processes, since it is a common market, common area. In general, we can say that we show that we have achieved one of the main goals of the EAEU, because we are now practically implementing the principles of free movement of labor, goods and services. I hope that this will become a usual thing in the Eurasian Economic Area, which is, in fact, the goal that was set in front of the organization at the time of its creation. So, this is a very important nuance to emphasize the effectiveness of the Eurasian Economic Union.”

Mayors of Yerevan and Paris discuss implementation of joint projects



The Mayor of Yerevan Hrachya Sargsyan hosted the Mayor of Paris Anne Hidalgo, who has arrived in Armenia on an official visit.

Hrachya Sargsyan stressed that Yerevan greatly emphasizes the deepening of cooperation with French partner cities and regions, and noted that in this context Paris is of special importance.

“Mrs. Hidalgo, I am aware that you have been to Yerevan many times, which once again proves your special attitude

towards our capital and bilateral relations. We are making progress within the framework of cooperation with the International Association of Francophone Mayors (AIMF), and we plan to implement new programs in the near future,” the Yerevan Mayor said.

He expressed special gratitude for the support during the 2020 war.

“We attach great importance to holding decentralized cooperation conferences. I will also take part in the next conference to be held in Lyon in June this year,” he said.

Expressing gratitude for the warm reception, Anne Hidalgo, in turn, noted that there is a wide field for cooperation between the capitals of Armenia and France, which will allow expanding joint programs.

“The relations between Yerevan and Paris are very close, this is my third visit to Yerevan. We already have many important

plans that have become a reality. Inspired by Yerevan, we were able to open a Tumo center in Paris as well. Today we are also outlining a broader partnership, in particular on heritage protection, and Yerevan’s participation in this work will be comprehensive. I love this city very much. I am happy that today we are laying the foundations for new projects with Yerevan,” said the Mayor of Paris.

During the meeting, the parties also exchanged views on the current programs and the implementation of the planned works.



By signing the November 9 statement, Aliyev acknowledged the existence of Nagorno Karabakh – Armenian FM

By signing the statement of November 9, the President of Azerbaijan acknowledged the existence of Nagorno Karabakh and this is an irreversible fact, Armenian Foreign Minister Ararat Mirzoyan said in an interview with *Armenpress*.

The comments come after Azerbaijani President Ilham Aliyev stated on May 27 that there is no Nagorno Karabakh, the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict is resolved, and claimed there is no OSCE Minsk Group.

“We can show a valid document signed by the President of Azerbaijan, which states that there is Nagorno Karabakh, it is the trilateral statement of November 9, 2020. By signing this document, the President of Azerbaijan acknowledged the existence of Nagorno Karabakh, and this is an irreversible fact. We can show the official statements made by the OSCE Minsk Group Co-Chairs, where they reaffirm their commitment as Co-Chairs. The United States and France have made such statements just this week,” the Foreign Minister said.

“The role of the OSCE MG Co-Chairs was also stressed by the Prime Minister of the Republic of Armenia and the President of the Russian Federation, in a joint statement adopted on April 19. At the

OSCE Ministerial Council in Stockholm in December 2021, the Foreign Ministers of dozens of countries stressed the unique role of the OSCE Minsk Group Co-Chairs in the settlement of the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict,” he continued.

Minister Mirzoyan stressed that the OSCE Minsk Group was created by the international community, not Azerbaijan. Therefore, he said, Azerbaijan cannot dissolve it or consider its mission completed.

“The same international community states today that the OSCE Minsk Group exists, as I mentioned, it states that there is a Nagorno-Karabakh conflict that needs to be resolved. This is enshrined in the above-mentioned statement of the Prime Minister of Armenia and the President of the Russian Federation. The US Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to the Republic of Armenia stated this quite recently, expressing the official position of the US. Moreover, in the same statement, it was emphasized that the issue of Nagorno Karabakh status is on the agenda, the right of Artsakh Armenians to self-determination is in force,” he emphasized.

The Foreign Minister stressed that “Armenia has never had territorial claims on Azerbaijan.” “The Nagorno-Karabakh con-

flict is a matter of law and is perceived by the international community as such. And that is evident from the meeting in Brussels. We have registered that the page of the war is closed for us, but there is a problem that must be solved through political and diplomatic means,” he said.

Ilham Aliyev further stated that in Brussels an agreement had been reached on a corridor linking Azerbaijan to Nakhichevan through Meghri.

In response to that Minister Mirzoyan reiterated that the existence of any corridor in the territory of Armenia is excluded.

“This is not even debatable. Our discussions are exclusively about opening and unblocking of roads, transport and economic communications. As for the routes, we said that before clarifying the routes, we must first agree on the legal regulations for the passage of Azerbaijani citizens through our territory and the legal regulations for the passage of Armenian citizens and goods through Azerbaijan (including Nakhichevan). However, it is obvious that one branch of the railway will pass through Meghri, Ordubad, Julfa and Yersakh. There is no agreement on roads at the moment,” Ararat Mirzoyan stated.

Aliyev's statements a testament to Azerbaijan's destructive stance – Armenia MFA

The statements made by the President of Azerbaijan Ilham Aliyev on May 27 once again testify to the destructiveness of the Azerbaijani side, the arbitrary, untrue comments on the agreements, and the continuation of the aggressive, belligerent policy, the Armenian Foreign Ministry said in a statement.

“The claims on the sovereign territory of the neighboring state, the use of force to achieve these goals are nothing but contempt for the norms of international law and seriously question the sincerity of Azerbaijan's intentions to achieve peace in the region,” the Ministry said.

The Armenian Ministry of Foreign Affairs reaffirmed the principled position of the Armenian side that the talks on normalization of relations between Armenia and Azerbaijan should be held on the basis of

proposals of both sides, which should address the whole agenda, including the final settlement of the Nagorno Karabakh conflict.

“With the speculations of the Azerbaijani side, an attempt is made to present the Nagorno Karabakh issue as a territorial dispute, while it is about realization of the rights of Artsakh Armenians and excluding the threat of ethnic cleansing,” the statement reads.

In this regard, the Ministry reminds that the international mandate of the OSCE Minsk Group Co-Chairs given in 1995 to support the comprehensive settlement of the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict continues to exist.

It calls on the Azerbaijani leadership not to torpedo the discussions taking place in the existing formats with belligerent and



fanatical rhetoric.

At the same time, the Foreign Ministry draws the attention of the international community to the statements made by official Baku, expects the unequivocal attitude of international partners, noting that only then will it be possible to achieve stability and peace in the South Caucasus.

The statement comes after Azerbaijani President Ilham Aliyev once again claimed that the Nagorno Karabakh conflict had been solved and the Minsk Group had completed its activity.

Unimpeded involvement of UNESCO in Artsakh important, Armenian PM tells ALIPH Director



Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan received Valéry Freland, Executive Director of the International Alliance for the

Protection of Heritage in Conflict Areas (ALIPH).

The Prime Minister hailed the activities

of ALIPH in the field of protection of historical and cultural heritage and expressed readiness for cooperation on behalf of the Government of the Republic of Armenia.

Nikol Pashinyan noted that one of Armenia's priorities is to protect the Armenian cultural and religious heritage in the territories under the control of Azerbaijan after the 44-day war from destruction and attached importance to the unhindered involvement of UNESCO to preserve the Armenian monuments in Nagorno Karabakh and prevent the reoccurring cases of vandalism.

The interlocutors also discussed issues of cooperation in the preservation and restoration of historical and cultural monuments in Armenia. They exchanged views on strengthening, digitization, development of necessary infrastructure, exchange of experience, training opportunities for specialists.

A large aluminum extrusion plant to be established in Armenia

The Government of the Republic of Armenia has approved the application submitted by Solara Company, taking into account that the company is going to import technological equipment and components for them within the framework of the investment program implemented in the priority sphere. The Government has granted a tax incentive to the company for the purchase of equipment and raw materials.

Solara is one of the leading companies in the field of solar energy in Armenia, specializing in the installation of private, business or industrial scale solar photovoltaic stations.

The company established the “Konstal” aluminum extrusion plant in Abovyan community, for which it acquired 23 thousand square meters of land for carrying out production activities.

The main directions of activity are the production of aluminum frames for solar photovoltaic panels, the production of aluminum constructions for the installation of solar stations. The factory will also produce frames for aluminum doors and windows.

According to the CEO of the company Hayk Petrosyan, this decision of the Government is a strong impetus to increase the attractiveness of organizing production in Armenia and making investments.

“The Government of Armenia has al-



ways supported the development of renewable energy and the works done in the field. We have repeatedly stated that in order to further stabilize Armenia’s economic growth and make further progress, it is necessary to direct the vectors of economic development to the producers. We, for our part, have adopted this important direction and will continue to work in that direction. The investment budget for the construction of the aluminum extrusion plant is \$ 15 million, as a result of which we will not only have sustainable production, but also create about 200 jobs,” said the CEO of Solara.

Most of the products will be exported to the USA, Europe and EEU member states.

The opening of the aluminum extrusion plant is scheduled for November 2022, and will operate with a monthly production capacity of 600-800 tons.

“*SOLARA*” company was established in 2019. It specializes in installation of solar stations.

The company is the Armenia-based strategic partner of LA SOLAR GROUP, a company that installs solar stations, established in the USA in 2008.

“*SOLARA*” provides comprehensive services in the field of solar energy: design, installation, operation, monitoring and maintenance of solar stations.

SOLARA solar stations use the panels of the largest domestic company that produces solar photovoltaic modules, “*La Solar*”, a joint initiative of *SOLARA* and *LA SOLAR GROUP*. *LA Solar*’s products are certified with the most prestigious certificates in the world, and more than 70% of the products are exported to the USA, Europe, EEU and other countries. The solar panel factory is located in the “*ALLIANCE*” free economic zone, has an annual production capacity of 90 MW. The capacity will reach 200 MW in 2022. All panels use the most efficient and latest generation Mono-PERC type photovoltaic cells.

In addition to its head office, *SOLARA* also has branches in Gyumri, a store in the *Garage Masters* mall, and in May 2022, the company established a branch in Tashkent.

Political consultations held between the Foreign Ministries of Armenia and Bulgaria



On May 27, political consultations were held in Yerevan between the Foreign Ministries of Armenia and Bulgaria. The Armenian delegation was led by the Deputy Foreign Minister Paruyr Hovhannisyan, and the Bulgarian delegation was headed by Irena Dimitrova, Deputy For-

eign Minister of Bulgaria.

During the consultations, the interlocutors discussed a wide range of issues concerning the Armenian-Bulgarian bilateral political agenda, as well as commended the high-level bilateral political dialogue. The sides touched upon the upcoming high-level visits.

In the course of consultations, the views were exchanged on a number of issues of mutual interest concerning regional and international agenda.

At the end of consultations Foreign Minister Ararat Mirzoyan received Irena Dimitrova. The interlocutors discussed Armenian-Bulgarian both on bilateral and

multilateral levels.

The interlocutors touched upon the Armenian-Bulgarian bilateral cooperation, particularly in the economic and cultural spheres, as well as the collaboration on multilateral platforms.
