

America stands with Armenia in supporting its security and democracy: Speaker Pelosi

The United States is committed to support Armenia’s democracy and stands by the Armenian people at difficult moments, Speaker of the US House of Representatives Nancy Pelosi said in her remarks at the Cafesjian Center for the Arts in Yerevan on September 18.

Mrs. Pelosi said that she is the first Speaker of the US House of Representatives to visit Armenia. “I am now standing between the flags of our two countries. It’s a great pride”, she said, stating that it shows the partnership with Armenia.

Speaker Pelosi also extended the congratulations of the US Congress to Armenia ahead of its Independence Day, celebrated on September 21.

“For us, it’s almost like a family visit. We are elected from districts where there are so many Armenian-Americans. They are patriotic Americans and are very proud of their Armenian heritage. They make that very clearly to us. We follow the Armenian challenges through their eyes”, the Speaker said.

She said that they are proud of eventually adopting the resolution on the Armenian Genocide. “Joe Biden has been the friend of Armenia, and we are proud that he signed it and also invited the Prime Minister of Armenia to the Democracy Summit which was a

very important event. I am here just to say that America is committed to Armenia’s security and Armenia’s democracy. And we stand with Armenia at any difficult time when there is a battle between democracy and autocracy. Armenia is a place where we can see those contrasts coming to play”, the Speaker of the House of Representatives said.

Nancy Pelosi said that her visit to Armenia was planned earlier, since last week. “But we came here at the moment when we can in person strongly condemn Azerbaijan’s recent attacks on Armenia. This is unacceptable and is threatening the prospects for the much needed peace agreement. As an OSCE Minsk Group Co-Chair and Armenia’s friend, the United States is committed to supporting the negotiated, comprehensive and sustainable settlement, including especially those hostilities directed towards civilians. The United States has long said that there can be no military solution to this conflict”, she said.

Nancy Pelosi said that the United States continues to watch the situation closely, adding that it is a priority direction for President Biden and the Congress.

“Our delegation visited Armenia to discuss matters of security, democracy and economy”, Nancy Pelosi said.

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Nancy Pelosi visits the Armenian Ministry of Defense

Suren Papikyan thanked Nancy Pelosi for quickly responding to the situation, for visiting Armenia, and for the appropriate assessments regarding the large-scale military aggression of Azerbaijan against the sovereign territory of Armenia on September 13.

The Minister of Defense presented the situation caused by the large-scale military aggression of Azerbaijan to the House Speaker.

Nancy Pelosi, in turn, presented the US position on the situation.

A number of issues related to the cooperation of the two countries in the defense sector were also discussed.



Expanding cooperation in Armenia-Greece-Cyprus format discussed within framework of 77th UNGA

On September 19, within the framework of the 77th session of the UN General Assembly, Foreign Minister of Armenia Ararat Mirzoyan had a meeting with Foreign Minister of Cyprus Ioannis Kasoulides, the foreign ministry said.

Minister Mirzoyan presented details regarding the consequences of the aggression unleashed by Azerbaijan in the sovereign territory of Armenia since September 13, the targeting of the civilian population and infrastructure by the Azerbaijani armed forces, as well as the gross violations of international and humanitarian law.

Ararat Mirzoyan expressed gratitude to the Cypriot side for showing solidarity to the Armenian people, as well as for the clear and targeted response to the situation.



He noted that, in terms of preserving the ceasefire regime and the withdrawal of Azerbaijani troops from the sovereign territory of the Republic of Armenia, as well as the exclusion of a new aggression, the international community's clear and unambiguous condemnation of the aggressor country and the appropriate actions are

fundamental.

During the meeting, Ministers of Foreign Affairs of Armenia and Cyprus also discussed a number of issues of the bilateral agenda and exchanged views on further expanding the cooperation within the framework of Armenia-Greece-Cyprus format and enhancing it to a new level.

The interlocutors also exchanged views on regional issues. Minister Mirzoyan briefed his counterpart on the position of the Armenian side regarding Armenia-Azerbaijan relations and the Nagorno-Karabakh peace process.

During the meeting, the sides touched upon the normalization process of relations between Armenia and Turkey.

Shrapnel from Azeri bombardments found in Armenian village of Ltchavan

During the September 13 attack on Armenia the Azerbaijani armed forces also bombarded the southern parts of the village of Ltchavan in Gegharkunik Province, with shrapnel from shell explosions spreading very close to residential houses.

Ltchavan school principal Norik Gevorgyan told ARMENPRESS that fortunately no one was harmed from the shrapnel.

"The Azerbaijani strikes hit the nearby cliff and the shrapnel



from the blasts spread very close to houses in Ltchavan. There are numerous shrapnel here. I can't say for sure what kind of weapons they used that the shells reached the outskirts of our village from tens of kilometers away, but military experts will be able to give information upon studying the shrapnel. Villager Martik Hovhannisyan collected many shrapnel and is keeping it as evidence of bombardments of Ltchavan and Makenis," Gevorgyan said.

Armenia says 207 killed or missing as a result of Azerbaijani aggression

The number of those killed or missing as a result of the latest Azerbaijani aggression reaches 207, the Armenian Security Council said in a statement after a sitting chaired by Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan.

The number includes the three civilians killed as a result of a large-scale aggression Azerbaijan launched against the sovereign territory of the Republic of Armenia shortly after midnight on September 13, using large-caliber weapons, artillery, missile systems, and UAVs.

Two civilians are still missing. Twenty servicemen have been taken captive. There are evidences of cases of torture, mutilation of captured or already dead servicemen.

The armed forces of Azerbaijan targeted 36 settlements, including Goris, Sisian, Kapan, Jermuk, Vardenis, Tegg, Geghamasar communities, as a result of which 192 houses, 3 hotels, 2 schools, 1 medical facility, 1 banquet hall were partially or completely destroyed. 4 cattle yards. Seven power transmission plants, 5 water supply stations, three gas pipelines, one bridge, two highways, one street were



damaged. Two ambulances and four private cars were targeted.

“The armed forces of Azerbaijan invaded the sovereign territory of the Republic of Armenia in several directions. Thanks to the persistent and heroic resistance of the Armed Forces of Armenia and the involvement of the international community, the attack of Azerbaijan was stopped, but the military-political situation remains tense,” the statement reads.

According to the Security Council, the aggressive policy pursued by Azerbaijan is aimed at aborting the efforts towards establishment of peace in the region, opening of regional communications, and comprehensive settlement of the Nagorno-Karabakh

issue and imposing military solutions on the Republic of Armenia.

“Having adopted the agenda of establishing peace and opening regional communications, the Republic of Armenia considers unacceptable the policy of threat and coercion conducted by Azerbaijan,” the Council said.

The Security Council declared that the Republic of Armenia will protect its independence, sovereignty, and territorial integrity by all available means and emphasized that the Azerbaijani troops must withdraw from the occupied territories of Armenia.

It called on the international community to continuously put pressure on Azerbaijan to end the occupation of the sovereign territories of the Republic of Armenia and to withdraw the troops, and we welcome all those countries and organizations that have taken a clear position.

At the same time, the Security Council reaffirmed the commitment of the Republic of Armenia to adhere to its obligations as a responsible member of the international community.



Armenia requests the European Court to apply interim measures against Azerbaijan

Armenia has appealed to the European Court of Human Rights requesting to apply interim measures against Azerbaijan. The request seeks to protect fundamental rights of the civilian population of Armenia, as well as prisoners of war.

In its submission Armenia also requested the Court to apply Rule 39.2 of the Rules of Court and immediately notify Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe of its decision.

Blinken urges Aliyev to adhere to ceasefire, disengage military forces

US Secretary of State Antony Blinken urged President of Azerbaijan Ilham Aliyev to adhere to the ceasefire and disengage military forces, State Department Spokesperson Ned Price said in a statement.

“Secretary of State Antony J. Blinken spoke today with Azerbaijani President

Ilham Aliyev. Secretary Blinken welcomed a halt to recent hostilities between Armenia and Azerbaijan. He urged President Aliyev to adhere to the ceasefire, disengage military forces, and work to resolve all outstanding issues between Armenia and Azerbaijan through peaceful negotiations”,

the statement says.



US Congress strongly condemns Azerbaijan's attacks against Armenia - House Speaker



The US Congress strongly condemns the illegal and deadly attacks by Azerbaijan against Armenia, Speaker of the US House of Representatives Nancy Pelosi said during a joint press conference with Speaker of Parliament of Armenia Alen Simonyan in Yerevan.

In her remarks Nancy Pelosi firstly thanked the Armenian Speaker of Parliament for hosting the US Congressional delegation and for the commitment to strengthen the cooperation between the two countries and the two parliaments.

"It was my honor to host the Speaker in

the United States capital earlier this year, during which we discussed issues relating to strengthening democracy and security in Armenia. Now it's a great honor to be the first Speaker of the House, a highest-ranking American ever, to visit Armenia where we are continuing our dialogue. We just had a very productive meeting during which we reaffirmed our commitment, the commitment of the United States Congress to advancing security, economic development and democratic institutions in Armenia and in the region. We discussed with pride that Congress took in leading way to secure the US formal recognition of the Armenian Genocide, which we did in legislation in 2019 which President Biden made official last year. "We are grateful to President Biden for that and for inviting the Prime Minister to participate in the Democracy Summit", she said.

The US House Speaker said that their meetings always have a particular focus on security. "Our meeting again had a particular importance to us because the focus was on security following the illegal and deadly attacks by Azerbaijan on the Armenian territory.

We strongly condemn those attacks, we in our delegation on behalf of Congress, which threatens prospects for much needed peace agreement.

The United States as an OSCE Minsk Group Co-Chair has clearly and has long stated that there can be no military solution to the conflict. We continue to watch the situation closely and we continue supporting a negotiated, comprehensive and sustainable solution to all issues relating to the Nagorno Karabakh conflict", the US House Speaker said.

Iran reiterates it will not accept any geopolitical change in region

Iran's Foreign Ministry spokesman Nasser Kanaani has commented on the latest military operations on the Armenian-Azerbaijani border which started as a result of the attack of Azerbaijan on Armenia.

The spokesperson said Iran believes that the political will of the two countries to start negotiations, the regional framework and the joint efforts of the neighbors will help to solve the conflicts in Caucasus.

"The Islamic Republic of Iran has repeatedly expressed its sincere position

over the developments happening in the South Caucasus. Unfortunately, we again witnessed a new stage of conflict between Azerbaijan and Armenia, which resulted in losses and wounded on both sides. Iran, based on its friendly policy and the principled policy aimed at contributing constructively to the quick settlement of regional crises, has made political efforts", the foreign ministry spokesperson said.

Nasser Kanaani said Tehran believes that it is necessary to apply political approaches and solutions to stop the con-



flicts, reduce tension and enter a political dialogue for solving the border disputes between the two countries. "Iran will also not accept any geopolitical change in the region", he added.

There are credible evidences that Azerbaijan prepares for new attack: Vice Speaker of Parliament tells Japan's Ambassador



Vice Speaker of Parliament of Armenia Hakob Arshakyan received on September 19 Ambassador of Japan Masanori Fukushima, the Parliament's press service said.

The meeting was also attended by members of the Armenia-Japan parliamentary friendship group Tsovinar Vardanyan, Heriknaz Tigranyan and Lusine Badalyan.

Welcoming the Ambassador, Hakob Arshakyan offered his congratulations on the occasion of the 30th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic relations between Armenia and Japan.

"Armenia and Japan have managed to

develop close friendly ties, high-level political dialogue and cooperation based on common values. We are hopeful that the 30th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic relations will further strengthen our bilateral ties in political, cultural and other areas", the Vice Speaker said.

He briefed the Ambassador on the latest Azerbaijani attacks on Armenia. Mr. Arshakyan said that there is credible evidence that Azerbaijan is preparing for a new attack, by expanding the geography, including from Nakhijevan, conducting an encroachment against Armenia's territorial integrity.

Hakob Arshakyan expressed his concerns over the Namadol typhoon, as a result of which around 4 million people were evacuated, and expressed hope that the situation will be solved soon.

The Ambassador of Japan thanked for

the reception and for the detailed information. He said that he will transfer the information about the situation of Armenia and Nagorno Karabakh presented by the Vice Speaker to the Japanese government.

Masanori Fukushima said Japan and Armenia have warm partnering relations, but there is a major potential for cooperation which is still not utilized, adding that practical steps should be taken on this direction.

He said that it's time to boost the cooperation in political, economic, educational, cultural and other areas.

Both sides attached importance to strengthening the Armenian-Japanese cultural and scientific ties.

A number of agreements were reached over the upcoming visit of Vice Speaker of Parliament Hakob Arshakyan to Japan.

Armenian servicewoman's body mutilated: Foreign diplomats briefed on war crimes committed by Azerbaijan



On a visit to Jermuk, foreign diplomats accredited to Armenia were briefed on the atrocities committed by the Azerbaijani

armed forces after infiltrating into Armenia's territory, *Armenpress* reports.

"They committed atrocities in our combat positions against our servicemen, including women," Chief of the General Staff of the Armed Forces Eduard Asryan said.

They dismembered a female soldier, cut off her legs and fingers, stripped her naked, the army chief said, promising to show a relevant video and describing it as

"the highest level of cruelty."

He stated that no military force, unit or soldier of any country has the right to commit such atrocities and called it a gross violation of the international humanitarian law.

Asryan said that war crimes have been carried out in all directions of the attack. He assured that the Armenian Armed Forces will continue taking all measures to ensure the security of the homeland.

Adoption of resolution by UN Security Council based on results of Sep 15 meeting being discussed – Armenian deputy FM

Deputy Foreign Minister of Armenia Paruyr Hovhannisyan says the remarks of representatives of several countries made yesterday during the emergency session of the UN Security Council are mostly satisfactory.

"During the UN Security Council session representatives of a number of countries talked about the disasters, humanitarian and military consequences happening in the territory of Armenia, as well as the Nagorno Karabakh conflict. I can only say that very important messages were made for us", he told *Armenpress*.

Asked whether the UN Security Council will adopt a resolution based on the results of the discussion, the deputy FM said

During the UN Security Council meeting after the Azerbaijani attack on Armenia the Representative of India to the United

Nations Ruchira Kamboj called on the aggressor to immediately cease actions and display tolerance.

Kamboj said these actions are a serious threat to peace and stability of not only the region but the world.

"The UN Security Council can't allow itself to remain silent and let the situation worsen. The 2020 November 9 ceasefire was an effective mechanism to resolve outstanding issues through efforts of Russia,

EU and the OSCE Minsk Group," Kamboj said, calling on the parties to resolve issues diplomatically.

Kamboj said the reason behind the escalation must be determined.

"What happened in September of 2020 in Nagorno Karabakh is still fresh in our memories. The latest reports from the Armenian-Azerbaijani border, namely the strikes on civilian infrastructures, are of deep concern for us," Kamboj said.

World Bank pledges continued assistance to Armenian Government

The interlocutors expressed satisfaction with the work done within the framework of the bilateral partnership and exchanged thoughts on its development prospects. Partnership in education, infrastructure, judicial reforms, digitalization, healthcare, public administration and other directions

was mutually emphasized. The importance of programs aimed at institutional capacity building and human capital development was emphasized.

The Prime Minister emphasized the priority of making reforms in the education sector, because human capital is the most important resource, and education is the basis for the success of any reform. Iran and Armenia have signed a memorandum of cooperation in the field of mine clearance, *Tasnim* reports.



UK lawmakers call for sanctions against Azerbaijan amid renewed aggression against Armenia



The All-Party Parliamentary Group for Armenia in the UK Parliament has condemned the latest attack of Azerbaijan against Armenia and called to hold Azerbaijan's President properly accountable for its war crimes committed against the Armenian people.

Tim Loughton MP, Chairman of the All Party Parliamentary Group, published the following statement on behalf of the Group:

In the last 24 hours Azerbaijan has unleashed new brutal attacks on the sovereign territory of Armenia, stretching across the Syunik, Gegharkunik and Vayots Dzor provinces. It is not only attacking military

bases but civilian communities and infrastructure. These attacks are not targeted on the disputed Nagorno-Karabakh region but on internationally recognized sovereign boundaries of Armenia itself and were entirely unprovoked and without justification.

Armenia's Ministry of Defense confirmed that at 00:05 on September 13, the Azerbaijani Armed Forces began intensive shelling of Armenian positions from artillery and large-caliber guns, also utilizing UAVs. The APPG expresses its strongest condemnation of the Azerbaijan regime for this latest act of violence and extends our deep concern for the victims and their families.

These acts of aggression have clearly been timed to take advantage of the world's attention being diverted to events in Ukraine and most recently the widespread mourning for the death of Queen Elizabeth, and such aggressive opportunism needs to be condemned in the strongest terms and

met with a robust response.

There is a very urgent need for the international community, including the UK to condemn Azerbaijan and to call it to account for these latest war crimes. We urgently request the UK Government to join other nations in demanding an immediate end to the Azerbaijan aggression and bring forward sanctions for as long as it continues its unjustified actions. We also ask the UK Government to support the request to the United Nations to consider the matter in emergency session and put its weight behind an ending of this hostile action.

The Azerbaijan regime still needs to be held properly accountable for its war crimes committed against Armenia and the people of Nagorno-Karabakh a couple of years ago and it is clear that it continues to have only a passing acquaintance with the international rule of law and standards expected to qualify as a decent and responsible nation.

MEPs urge Azerbaijan to stop the offensive against Armenia

The Chair of the Committee on Foreign Affairs David McAllister (EPP, DE), the European Parliament's Standing Rapporteur on Armenia Andrey Kovatchev (EPP, BG) and the European Parliament's Standing Rapporteur on Azerbaijan Željana Zovko (EPP, HR) issued the following statement on September 13:

"We condemn in the strongest possible terms the large-scale military confrontations that erupted yesterday night in several locations on the border between Armenia and Azerbaijan and in the sovereign territory of Armenia. We deplore the high number of reported casualties.

We call on both countries to fully respect the ceasefire agreement of 9 November 2020. We particularly urge Azerbaijan to stop immediately its offensive, to move back its troops to their initial positions and



to fully respect the territorial integrity of Armenia. The reported attacks on civilian population centers and infrastructure are totally unacceptable. Any steps that could lead to further escalation should be avoided at all cost.

The resumption of military hostilities is particularly dangerous at this time as it risks unravelling the progress made by Armenia and Azerbaijan towards a peace

deal as the countries' leaders met two weeks ago in Brussels and agreed to step up work on a draft agreement.

There is a historical opportunity to achieve a durable and sustainable peace between Armenia and Azerbaijan and it should not be wasted. Therefore, we strongly urge Armenia and Azerbaijan to re-start substantive negotiations as soon as possible under the auspices and with the mediation of the EU and particularly of the President of the European Council Charles Michel.

Once again, there should be no doubt that a stable and long-lasting peace settlement between Armenia and Azerbaijan cannot be achieved through military means but needs a political settlement in accordance with international law."

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Hundreds rally in Paris to protest against Azerbaijan's attack on Armenia



Hundreds of people gathered in front of the next to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs to protest strongly against the pre-planned aggression by Azerbaijan on the sovereign territory of Armenia. The demonstrators held slogans reading “Stop Aliyev! Get out of Armenia!”, “Pan-Turkism = fascism,” etc., Jean Eckian informs.

About twenty politicians joined Armenians, including Gabriel Attal, former Spokesman of the French government, Minister Delegate in charge of Public Accounts.

Ara Toranian, co-chairman of the Coordinating Council of Armenian Organizations of France (CCAF), thanked France, which was almost the only power in the world to react diplomatically to the situation by referring the matter to the United Nations Security Council.

Joining the demonstration was Berivan Firat, Spokesperson for the Kurdish Democratic Council in France. She said “the struggle of the Armenians is the struggle of the oppressed peoples, it is my struggle.”

“Today, I am Armenian. Erdogan is a danger for the Kurds, for the Armenians, for the Syrians, but also for France, for the West, for our youth and the generations to come,” she added.

CCAF co-chairman Mourad Papazian

noted: “Today, Baku is attacking the Republic of Armenia, a sovereign territory recognized by the UN. It is not allowed to attack a territory recognized by the UN without receiving a response from the UN. [...] We fear for Armenia, its security and its people. We must find a way to ensure peace for the Armenians of the Republic of



Armenia and Nagorno-Karabakh.”

Azerbaijanis launch shocking social media stickers depicting mutilated bodies of killed Armenians to spread terror



Social media stickers depicting the tortured and mutilated bodies of killed Armenian troops and civilians have been created through chat bots in the Azerbaijani Telegram social media dimension, the former Ombudsman Arman Tatoyan said.

He said that these stickers were launched on September 14, 2022 – one day after Azerbaijan launched the deadly attack on Armenia – and were discovered on September 18. These stickers were widely accessible.

“We’ve separated 119 pictures, that is 119 stickers, which had more than 20,000 downloads in 5 days,” Tatoyan said.

“Through the efforts of an expert who’s been supporting us, Telegram blocked this [download], but it is obvious that the Azerbaijani platforms will use this new tool to terrorize and mock the Armenian society,” Tatoyan added, noting that photos of atrocities committed by the Azerbaijani troops against Armenians both during the 2020

war and the 2022 September 13-15 attack were used.

“Our study shows that Azerbaijani social media users who’ve downloaded these stickers were greatly excited to have the opportunity to use photos of the torture and mutilations of dead Armenian servicemen and civilians in their chats. This criminal act is new evidence that the state-sanctioned Armenophobia in Azerbaijan over many years has deep roots in the Azerbaijani society and the peace-loving calls by the Azerbaijani government are simply a veil for the eyes of the international community to cover up their real intentions,” Tatoyan said.

Allegations of war crimes need to be investigated – Toivo Klaar

After the Azerbaijani attack on Armenia, EU Special Representative for the South Caucasus and the crisis in Georgia Toivo Klaar said all allegations of human rights abuses and war crimes need to be investigated and perpetrators brought to justice.

“Back in Brussels after urgent meetings in Baku, Yerevan and also Vienna. Difficult and sometimes emotional exchanges. Lots of challenges remain but hope that

ceasefire will hold. Need to return to negotiations.

Disturbing reports of crimes & violence targeting civilians during the latest fighting. Cases from the past also need to be addressed, but can in no way be a justification. All allegations of human rights abuses & war crimes need to be investigated & perpetrators brought to justice.

The EU remains engaged at the highest level and our aim continues to be to help

Armenia and Azerbaijan achieve a comprehensive and sustainable agreement that will ensure a stable, secure and prosperous South Caucasus,” Klaar tweeted.

During the latest Azerbaijani attack on Armenia, the Azerbaijani troops committed war crimes and atrocities, such as deliberate bombings of peaceful settlements and mutilation of the bodies of killed servicemen.

California to Declare April 24, ‘Genocide Remembrance Day’ as State Holiday

California State Assemblyman Adrin Nazarian has finally succeeded in passing a legislative bill (AB 1801) he had sponsored to declare April 24, Genocide Remembrance Day, a state holiday.

The bill mandates that every year on April 24, all community colleges and public schools throughout California will close. State employees will be given time off with pay.

The text of the bill explains that: “The Legislature finds and declares that Genocide Remembrance Day would be a day for all to reflect on past and present genocides, but especially those that have felt the impact of these atrocities and groups that have found refuge in California, including, but not limited to, the Holocaust, Holodomor, and the Genocides of the Armenian, Assyrian, Greek, Cambodian, and Rwandan communities. Genocide Remembrance Day would be observed annually on April 24, also known as Armenian Genocide Remembrance Day, during the week the state of California traditionally recognizes Genocide Awareness Week.”

The text further states that on April 24 or on an alternate date “public schools and educational institutions throughout this state may include exercises, funded through existing resources, remembering and honoring the many contributions that survivors of genocide have made to this country. The State Board of Education may adopt a model curriculum guide to be available for use by public schools for exercises related to Genocide Remembrance Day.”

The State Assembly and Senate members worked tirelessly for months to have both Chambers of the California legislature adopt this bill. The odyssey started on February 7, 2022 when it was introduced in the State Assembly. The bill passed through several committees: Governmental Organization: 20 yes, 0 no; Higher Educa-



tion: 12 yes, 0 no; Appropriations: 12 yes, 0 no; and the full State Assembly on May 26, 2022 by a vote of 75 yes and 0 no.

The bill then went to the State Senate passing through the following committees: Governmental Organization: 14 yes, 0 no; Education: 6 yes, 0 no; Appropriations: 7 yes, 0 no; and the full Senate on August 23, 2022 by a vote of 40 yes 0 no. The bill then went back to the State Assembly on August 24, 2022 in order to reconcile it with Senate amendments. It passed by a vote of 77 yes, 0 no.

The bill was then submitted to California Governor Gavin Newsom for his signature on August 31, 2022. I contacted the Governor’s office and was told that he has until September 30, 2022 to sign or veto the bill.

I spoke with the sponsor of the bill, Assemblyman Adrin Nazarian, and congratulated him on his great efforts to pass this historic bill.

Another close friend of the Armenian community, State Senator Anthony Portantino, sent me the following empathetic message: “Far too many Californian families have been tragically affected by genocide. It’s sadly something that has touched many cultures since the first genocide of the 20th Century was perpetrated against the Armenian people by the Ottoman Turks. While we learn about Native American conquest, the Holocaust and other horrific violence committed against humanity, in our schools we don’t currently have one day that speaks to all of these atrocities and brings people together to remember, to love and to care for one another across

ethnic communities. One day out of 365 for grieving and healing purposes is appropriate and I was proud to support it.”

Meanwhile, Turkish denialists are lobbying against the bill, trying to convince Gov. Newsom not to sign it into law. The Assembly of Turkish American Associations (ATAA), a notorious genocide denialist organization, issued a statement on September 5, 2022 urging “the Turkish American community and friends of Turkey to send letters, faxes, and emails to Governor Newsom in order to urge him to veto” the Genocide Remembrance Day.

Here is what the ATAA urged its supporters to do: “Please communicate to Governor Newsom and his staff today and get your voice heard! In addition, the ATAA urged its supporters to send emails to: Jim DeBoo, the Governor’s Executive Secretary: jim.deboo@gov.ca.gov; and David Sapp, the Governor’s Chief Deputy Legal Affairs Secretary: david.sapp@gov.ca.gov, with this subject line: “AB01801\State holidays: Genocide Remembrance Day,”

To counter the Turkish denialist lobbying efforts, the Armenian community should inundate Gov. Newsom’s office with emails and letters, using the above provided contacts, urging him to sign AB 1801 into law. Act quickly, because the Governor will make his decision between now and Sept. 30.

Right to education of 25,000 children in Armenia violated as a result of latest Azerbaijani attacks



The right to education of 25,000 students in Armenia’s Gegharkunik, Vayots Dzor and Syunik provinces has been violated as a result of the latest attack of Azerbaijan on Armenia’s sovereign territory.

Deputy Minister of Education, Science, Culture and Sport Zhanna Andreasyan told a press conference in Armenpress that there was such a security situation in some settlements of the aforementioned provinces that children were deprived of the right to education, the opportunity to ensure the continuation of their studies. The talk concerns both schools and pre-schools.

“In these three provinces, more than 6000 children attending a pre-school were

deprived of the opportunity to ensure the continuation of education. The educational facilities in these settlements have not operated last week as holidays were declared. But the missed classes will be made up later. Being in touch with our colleagues in provinces, I would like to state that we have a decision and the schools will start operating starting today”, she said.

The study process in schools where there is no problem with ensuring security will start offline, whereas in others it will be held online.

In Gegharkunik province, the online learning will resume in 12 schools, which are mainly located in Vardenis region, in Vayots Dzor province, it will start in 3 schools and in Syunik province – 112 schools. The offline learning here will resume only in 5 schools. The deputy minister said that decisions will be made every day based on the developments.

“Schools have accumulated a great experience in online learning, unfortunately, not only during the pandemic. From the

very first days of the war in autumn 2020 we switched the study process in border communities to a remote learning and provided the necessary equipment. We think that the capacities of schools to organize remote learning are sufficient enough”, she said.

Two educational facilities in Gegharkunik provinces were hit by the Azerbaijani shelling. The deputy minister said that the renovation works will be organized very quickly. She expressed her concerns over the targeting of educational institutions, calling it a violation of international law.

graph the explosions from a hotel room.

"I am extremely concerned. We sympathize with the Armenian people," Tintrup sums up.
