Serzh Sargsyan calls for immigration, investments from Armenian Diaspora

Armenia's government will encourage ethnic Armenians living abroad to relocate to their historical homeland in an effort to address its demographic problems, President Serzh Sargsyan said on September 18.

Sargsyan urged Armenian Diaspora organizations to assist in that endeavor as he addressed hundreds of their representatives attending a government-organized conference in Yerevan. He also renewed his calls for greater Diaspora investments in the struggling Armenian economy.

"We note that demographic trends in our country are extremely concerning and result from many objective and subjective factors of the last 25 years," he said in a long speech delivered at the Sixth Armenia-Diaspora Conference. "In the coming years, our efforts will be aimed at speeding up the natural growth of Armenia's population and substantially changing the emigration-to-immigration ratio.

"We have declared that our goal is to ensure that Armenia has at least 4 million residents by 2040. Obviously we would have trouble attaining that goal only by increasing the birth rate, prolonging life expectancy and taking other steps to improve the demographic picture."

The ambitious goal, he went on, also requires "achieving serious indicators of immigration into Armenia" in the next 25 years. "In my view, the realization of this objective will be the main subject of the next Armenia-Diaspora conferences," he said

"I believe that we are ripe for seriously discussing the issue of organizing repatriation," declared Sargsyan.

There are an estimated 8 million to 9 million ethnic Armenians around the world. Only up to 3 million of them live in Armenia. Most of the others reside in Russia, the United States, Europe and the Middle East.

Throughout Sargsyan's nearly decade-long rule, scores of Armenia's citizens have continued to leave their country for primarily economic reasons. Opposition politicians and other critics of the Armenian government blame the emigration on what they see as the Sargsyan administration's failed economic policies and unwillingness to enforce the rule of law in the country.

Some participants of the forum were skeptical about Sargsyan's statement,

saying that the authorities in Yerevan should ease socioeconomic hardship in Armenia and stop people leaving the country before setting such demographic targets.

"I don't believe in utopias," said Stepan Hovakimian, a representative of the Armenian labor unions in Los Angeles. "I only believe in real work."

"Thirty thousand Syrian Armenians came to Armenia. How many of them stayed here?" said Vasken Kasemjian, head of the Social Democrat Hnchakian Party in Britain. "There are still problems in Gyumri. More than 25 years have passed since the [1988] earthquake but there are still homeless people there."

"Let them solve those problems before speaking of grandiose programs," he added

In his speech, Serzh Sargsyan again called on wealthy entrepreneurs from the Diaspora to invest in Armenia. "All necessary conditions for doing that and the right business environment have been created in Armenia," he claimed.

Greater Diaspora investments in the Armenian economy have been hampered by the country's flawed business environment. While some wealthy ethnic Armenian entrepreneurs from Russia, the United States and other parts of the world have set up shop in the country, many others have been scared away by government corruption and a lack of judicial independence.

Those problems are apparently not on the agenda of the Diaspora-Armenia conference that got underway on Monday. Representatives of Armenia's main opposition groups were not invited to participate in the forum.

Nikol Pashinian, a leader of the opposition Yelk bloc, condemned the snub. "This and several other facts prove that the event is meant to be a PR stunt by Serzh Sargsyan," he claimed.

Foreign Minister of Armenia bids farewell to Ambassador of France

Foreign Minister of Armenia Edward Nalbandyan received Jean-François Charpentier, Ambassador of France to Armenia on September 11, on the occasion of completion of his diplomatic mission in Yerevan, Press Service of the Ministry of For-

Edward Nalbandyan highly appreciated the input of the Ambassador Charpentier in further strengthening of the privileged Armenian-French relations during his tenure.

For his significant contribution, Edward

Nalbandyan awarded Ambassador Charpentier with the Foreign Ministry's Medal of Honor.

Edward Nalbandyan wished success to the Ambassador of France in his future endeavors.

French, German Envoys see no hurdles to EU-Armenia accord

A landmark agreement to deepen the European Union's relations with Armenia will most likely be signed as planned in November, Germany's and France's ambassadors in Yerevan said on September 12. "At the moment there are no circumstances that could hamper that process," the German envoy, Matthias Kiesler, told a joint news conference with his outgoing French counterpart, Jean-Francois Charpentier.

"I consider the new agreement a great success and believe that if signed, it will open up new and multiple opportunities for deepening EU-Armenia cooperation," added Kiesler.

Charpentier likewise said that "all prerequisites are in place" for the signing of the Comprehensive and Enhanced Partnership Agreement (CEPA) during an EU summit in Brussels slated for November 24. Armenia would thus become the first member of the Russian-led Eurasian Economic Union to have such an "ambitious" deal with the EU, he said.

The CEPA, which was finalized in March, is meant to deepen the EU's political and economic relations with Armenia. It reportedly contains the main political provisions of a more far-reaching Association Agreement which the two sides nearly concluded in 2013.

President Serzh Sargsyan prevented the signing of that agreement



with his unexpected decision to seek Armenia's accession to the EEU. The move was widely attributed to Russian pressure exerted on the Armenian government.

Sargsyan dismissed late last month suggestions that the CEPA may also collapse at the last minute. "We have no reason to not sign that document," he said. The head of the EU Delegation in Yerevan, Piotr Switalski, said last week that officials in Brussels are making final preparations for the signing of the accord with Armenia at the November summit. The summit will focus on the EU's Eastern Partnership program of closer partnership with six former Soviet republics. Three of them — Georgia, Moldova and Ukraine — have signed Association Agreements with the EU.

Ruling Party remains opposed to Armenia's exit from Eurasian Union

(Yerevan - RFE/RL) President Serzh Sargsyan's Republican Party (HHK) dismissed on September 12 an opposition alliance's calls for an end to Armenia's membership in the Russian-led Eurasian Economic Union (EEU).

The Yelk alliance put forward late last week a draft parliamentary statement demanding that the Armenian authorities embark on a "process" of invalidating Armenia's accession treaty with the trade bloc comprising five ex-Soviet states. The statement says that EEU membership, effective from January, 2015, has hurt the country's economy and security.

"Leaving the EEU would be fraught with very serious problems for Armenia," the HHK spokesman, Eduard Sharmazanov, told RFE/RL's Armenian service (Azatutyun.am). "It would lead to an unprecedented rise in the price of [Russian] gas. Secondly, it would change trade volumes. There are no alternative markets for products which we now sell in the EEU markets. Maybe there will be in five or ten years."


"Armenia's authorities see no need for changing the vector of Armenian foreign policy," Sharmazanov added. "We should continue deepening our relations with the EEU."

Russia is Armenia's number one trading partner, having accounted for 26 percent of its foreign trade in January-July 2017, according to official Armenian statistics. Armenian exports to Russia — most of them foodstuffs and alcoholic beverages — rose by almost 31 percent.

By comparison, the European Union's share in the total stood at 24.3 percent. Armenia's trade with EEU member states also grew strongly in the seven-month period.

Yelk blames the EEU for the fact that Armenia Gross Domestic Product has shrunk in U.S. dollar terms while public debt increased since 2015. The authorities in Yerevan recorded a real GDP growth of just 0.2 percent last year.

"Had we not joined the EEU that negative dynamic would have been deeper," insisted Sharmazanov.



Sharmazanov also brushed aside Yelk claims that EEU membership has not strengthened Armenia's security as evidenced by continued Russian arms sales to Azerbaijan and the April 2016 fighting in Nagorno-Karabakh.

"Armenia has received [since 2015] many modern weapons and ammunition that ensure, along with the Armenian armed forces, its security. Armenia's security system has grown stronger since we joined the EEU," said the HHK spokesman, who is also a deputy speaker of the Armenian parliament.

Russia's ambassador in Yerevan, Ivan Volynkin, also scoffed at the Yelk initiative. "If they want to come up with such an initiative, no problem, nobody is hindering them," Volynkin told reporters. "The question is how necessary it is for Armenia."

"I think that the majority of Armenia's population disagrees with that initiative because they can see the obvious advantages of Armenia's membership in the EEU," he said.

Yelk holds 9 seats in the 105-member parliament. None of the other political groups represented in the National Assembly has voiced support for its initiative.

Switalski: We hope for peace, business likes peace and stability



"We encourage the Armenian Government to be more active in involving foreign capital", the Head of the European Union Delegation to Armenia, Ambassa-

dor Piotr Switalski told on September 15 at a briefing, Panorama.am reports.

According to him, Prime Minister Karen Karapetyan's Government has implemented a number of initiatives to improve the business environment.

"It concerns also custom authorities and rating authorities. I hear positive opinions from many European business companies. This is a right way but it is also necessary to find other resources. I think measures that are taken towards independence of the State legal system and fighting against corruption, are very important. States, nations compete with each other to involve investments and only very active participation and policy can bring more European investments to Armenia. We hope for peace. And, of course, business likes peace and stability", the Ambassador said.


Switalski has insured that they have firm grounds in cooperating with Armenia.

Trade envoys engage with one or more emerging markets where substantial trade and investment opportunities have been identified by UK government. They support the drive for economic growth by building on the UK's existing relations with these markets and maximising bilateral trade.

Mr Pritchard said: "I am honoured to have been asked by the Prime Minister to be the UK's first Trade Envoy



to Georgia and Armenia. My appointment underscores the importance of in-

WB Vice President: I am confident that we can be successful in our cooperation with the Government of Armenia

Prime Minister Karen Karapetyan received a delegation headed by World Bank Vice President for Europe and Central Asia Cyril Muller on September 11, the Press Service of the RA Government reports.

Once again felicitating the participants of the meeting on the 25th anniversary of partnership between the Republic of Armenia and the World Bank, the Prime Minister highlighted the need for further development and deepening of bilateral cooperation.

Karen Karapetyan congratulated newly appointed Head of WB Armenia Office Silvie Bosoutro, wishing her productive work in our country. The head of the Armenian government expressed conviction that she would build on the already established and traditionally close ties of partnership.

Pleased with the ongoing cooperation with the Government of Armenia, Cyril Muller assessed it as effective. He noted that the World Bank wishes to further strengthen the cooperation with Armenia.

During the meeting, the WB delegation presented a report entitled "The Future of Armenia," which describes the country's problems,



capacities, advantages. Reference is made to the Government's activities.

It was noted that the WB activities program with Armenia will be elaborated based on the findings of this report. Cyril Muller emphasized that the recommendations contained in the report coincide with the Government's 2017-2022 Action Plan and Reform Agenda.

"During this time, you have demonstrated your ability to implement excellent programs, therefore, I am confident that we can be successful in our cooperation with the Government of Armenia," the WB Vice President said. A number of other issues related to bilateral cooperation were discussed at the meeting.

The amount of commodity circulation between Armenia and the US increases



Strengthening of economic and trade ties between Armenia and the US was the priority of the Us Ambassador in Armenia Richard Mills' mission in RA, the Ambassador said at the press conference organized by Armenian-American Chamber of Commerce and the Embassy of the USA in Armenia.

The Ambassador mentioned that representatives of the United States De-

partment of Commerce visited Armenia this week to present the opportunities offered by GPS system which Armenia may take advantage of.

Answering a question on the timeframe of signing of a convention for avoiding double taxation, the Ambassador said that this question was brought up by the Government of Armenia and that signing of such a convention will be discussed if it becomes necessary for trade stimulation.

According to him, the document on double taxation adopted in 1970's is enough for the development of trade between the countries.

The Ambassador mentioned that they are waiting for the Armenian Government's arguments for the necessity of a new convention.

In turn, the first Deputy of the Minister of Economic Development and Investments of RA Garegin Melkonyan informed that the commodity circulation between Armenia and the US was \$91 mln during January-July period of 2017 which is 38% more than the index of the same period of last year.

He mentioned that thanks to the GSP tariff system commodities produced in Armenia are imported to the US with a zero interest rate and that the products that could take advantage of the system, in fact, took it for 100%.

ANCA and Marriott Armenia make case for U.S.-Armenia Double Tax Treaty

Leading U.S. investors in Yerevan's landmark Marriott Hotel made the case this week in Washington, DC for a U.S.-Armenia Double Tax Treaty during a series of Capitol Hill and State Department meetings, reported the Armenian National Committee of America (ANCA), according to Asbarez.

"We were pleased to have this opportunity to share with U.S. legislators and our Department of State the real-world benefits of a Double Tax Treaty for U.S. investors, the Armenian economy, and – perhaps most importantly – the future growth of mutually beneficial bilateral U.S. – Armenia commercial relations," said Paul Korian, Chairman and Managing Partner of the Armenia Marriott Hotel Complex.

"By eliminating the threat of double taxation, this long overdue treaty would remove a meaningful barrier to the expansion of the U.S.-Armenia economic relationship, opening the door to a new wave of investment opportunities," said investor Peklar Pilavjian

Among the legislators that the group spoke with on Capitol Hill were Armenian Caucus Co-Chairs Jackie Speier (D-CA) and David Trott (R-MI), senior House Foreign Affairs Committee member Brad Sherman (D-CA), who is widely respected as the leading



Congressional expert on international tax law, and U.S. Representatives Anna Eshoo (D-CA), Joseph Kennedy (D-MA) and Grace Napolitano (D-CA). Korian and Pilavjian also took part in a State Department meeting on the mutual benefits of a Double Tax Treaty.

"It's time to get this done. The absence of a working, modern tax treaty has – for far too long – deprived both U.S. and Armenian investors of a clear legal framework, creating unnecessary uncertainty that diverts investment flows and materially disadvantages businesses," said ANCA Executive Director Aram Hamparian. "Inaction on a Double Tax Treaty, more than 25 years after Armenia's independence, sends the wrong message to potential investors and other economic stakeholders."

Following the meetings, Korian and Pilavjian talked to H1 Television's Haykaram Nahabetyan about the benefits of a U.S.-Armenia Double Tax Treaty in the ongoing efforts to expand bilateral economic ties. The group also visited with Library of Congress Armenian Specialist, Dr. Levon Avdoyan, for a first-hand view of the Libraries' over 40,000 Armenian holdings.

Armenian pavilion named the best at "WorldFood Moscow 2017" international expo

The pavilion, created by the Development Foundation of Armenia, has been named the best during the "WorldFood Moscow 2017" International Exhibition, held from September 11-14 in Moscow. Sixteen Armenian companies represent the Armenian food industry at Moscow expo with the support of the Development Foundation of Armenia.

The organizers of "WorldFood Moscow 2017" awarded the prize to the event manager of the Marketing Department of DFA Lusine Balayan during the tasting session arranged for international buyers and distributors at the Armenian pavilion. The selection was jointly made by the expert committee and visitors of the Exhibition.

"I see this as a good marketing result achieved by our team, and consequently expect more fruitful negotiations and larger export contracts from the companies attending the Exhibition", noted the CEO of the Development Foundation of Armenia Armen Avak Avakian, who is currently in Moscow with the Armenian producers. The Armenian companies returned from the previous Exhibition with 12 export contracts with value of 570 million AMD.

The Minister of Agriculture of Armenia Ignati Arakelyan and the



Ambassador of the Republic of Armenia to the Russian Federation Vardan Toghanyan have also visited the Armenian pavilion. To remind, the DevelopmentFoundation of Armenia supports the local companies within the scope of the Export Promotion Strategy of the Government of RA.

Freed Russian-Israeli blogger tells Armenians to "Hold Firm" on Karabakh

Just one day after leaving Azerbaijan, a Russian-Israeli blogger who was jailed in Baku for travelling to Nagorno-Karabakh called on Friday for continued Armenian control over the territory.

Aleksandr Lapshin also strongly denied the Azerbaijani authorities claims that he tried to commit suicide the day before receiving a pardon from President Ilham Aliyev on Monday. He said that in fact he was brutally assaulted in his prison cell.

Lapshin, who has Israeli, Russian and Ukrainian citizenships, flew from Baku to Tel Aviv on Thursday nine months after being detained in Belarus on an Azerbaijani arrest warrant. He was extradited to Azerbaijani in February.

An Azerbaijani court sentenced the 41-year-old to three years in prison in July. It said he illegally crossed Azerbaijan's internationally recognized borders when he visited Karabakh via Armenia in 2011 and 2012. Lapshin gave detailed accounts of those trips on his Rus-

sian-language travel blog.

Announcing Aliyev's decision to pardon the blogger, the authorities in Baku said that he is receiving medical assistance after he tried to kill himself in Azerbaijani custody.

"I categorically deny the official Azerbaijani lie about my suicide attempt in a Baku prison," Lapshin wrote on his blog. He claimed that in reality he was beaten unconscious by two unknown men who burst into his prison cell on the night from Sunday to Monday.

Lapshin said he regained consciousness in a Baku hospital. He called the alleged attack a murder attempt.

In a separate Facebook post, the blogger reflected on the Karabakh conflict and made an emotional appeal to Armenians.

"I am ashamed of admitting that before I found myself in the Azerbaijani prison I sincerely believed that the Karabakh conflict is a very disputed one and should be resolved on the basis of respect for Azerbaijan's national borders," he wrote. "What an idiot I was! Already in 1988 Azerbaijan began [a campaign of] terror against Armenians in [the Azerbaijani city of] Sumgait, Baku and Karabakh."

"Armenians, hold firm!" he said. "These people want to see you dead full stop. And if you lose Karabakh as a result of negotiations or a weakening of Armenia's position, be aware that they will come to slaughter you. Just like the Turks did 100 years ago."

Years before his arrest, Lapshin was placed on an official Azerbaijani blacklist of several hundred non-Armenian foreigners who visited Karabakh without Baku's permission. Nevertheless, he was able to travel to Azerbaijan in June 2016 and post a series of detailed blog entries on his mixed impressions about the oil-rich country. In particular, Lapshin suggested that the Azerbaijani authorities have squandered their massive oil revenues.

U.S. Rep. David Valadao visits Artsakh, reviews HALO Trust's de-mining efforts

Congressional Armenian Caucus Co-Chairman David Valadao (R-CA) visited Artsakh (Nagorno Karabakh) on September 18, where, alongside government officials and ANCA Chairman Raffi Hamparian, he reviewed life-saving HALO Trust de-mining programs that he has helped fund as a leading member of the House Appropriations Committee, reported the Armenian National Committee of America (ANCA).

"It is great to be here on the ground, in Artsakh, with Representative Valadao, author of the ANCA-backed U.S. House amendment funding the Artsakh aid program," said ANCA Chairman Raffi Hamparian. "Witnessing firsthand America's life-saving, peace-making contribution to the future of the Republic of Artsakh is, for sure, a proud moment for all Armenian Americans."

The trip comes just two weeks after Rep. Valadao introduced an amendment, adopted by the U.S. House of Representatives, calling for continued U.S. assistance for the HALO Trust's de-mining efforts across the interior farmlands and villages of the Artsakh Republic.

The Valadao Amendment was approved by voice vote, as part of the FY 2018 foreign aid appropriation, which, in turn, is part of a broader spending measure (H.R. 3354), approved on September 14th. Congressman David Valadao was joined in supporting this bipartisan measure by House Foreign Affairs Committee Chairman Ed Royce (R-CA), House Intelligence Committee Ranking Democrat Adam Schiff (D-CA), and his fellow Armenian Caucus Co-Chairs Frank Pallone (D-NJ) and Jackie Speier (D-CA).

The decisive move was welcomed by the ANCA, which spearheaded the launch of Artsakh aid in the 1990's and has, over the past two decades, secured tens of millions of dollars in U.S. assistance to the independent republic.

During his meeting with the HALO Trust's Regional Director Ash Boddy and local leaders, portions of which were broadcast live on their Facebook page, Rep. Valadao saw first-hand the lifesaving efforts of the organization, which, over the last 16 years, has destroyed over 8,733 anti-personnel mines, 2,584 anti-tank landmines, 180,858 small arms ammunition, 12,423 cluster bombs and 48,572 other explosive items in Artsakh. The HALO Trust looks to complete Artsakh de-mining efforts by 2020.

Participating in THE HALO Trust briefing with the Congressman were Robert Avetisyan, Permanent Representative of the Artsakh Republic to the U.S. and Maria Mehranian, President of the Armenia Fund.

The visit comes a day ahead of a Congressional delegation trip to the Republic of Armenia, marking the September 21st anniversary of independence and exploring expanded bilateral economic and political cooperation. In addition to Rep. Gladzor University: "Second Glorious Athens"...



...It was 1984 when this author, a graduate year student, heard about solemn celebration – at the unprecedented for Soviet era – state level of the 700th anniversary of the legendary Gladzor University, a real pearl of education, science and arts of the

medieval Armenia, and not only Armenia – it was not mere coincidence that Gladzor was called "Glorious Second Athens" and "Capital of Wisdom" in foreign manuscripts, the first references – since 1291. So within the scope of the events a museum dedicated to Gladzor University was opened in St.Hakob Church in the Village of Vernashen, Vayots Dzor Region, in 1984. According to a version,

ed themselves to studying and revealing of numerous intricate questions of the history and significance of this medieval Armenian educational-scientific center.

In 1970-1971 excavations were carried out in Vayots Dzor, in the surroundings of St. Stepanos Monastery on the initiative of the Chair of Archeology, Source Study and Ethnography at the Yerevan State University, under the supervision of *Igit Gharibyan*, and as a result of works, the traces of Gladzor University were found.



Prominent Armenian theologians *David Sasnetsi*, *Grigor*, *Martiros*, *Hovhannes*, *Kirakos* and *Kiuregh* were among Professors of the University.

A miniature school there deserves special words; it was founded by famous masters such as, first of all, *Momik*, and *Hov*-

hannes, Matteos and Toros Taronatsi taught here. The education at Gladzor lasted for 7-8 years, and before that the students would have completed successfully a three year school for clergy - Gladzor University prepared 350 vardapet-teachers.

Notably, the University having three departments.— clerical (grabar) and worldly writing, manuscript art and music and khazagitutyun (old Armenian music writing system, different to European notes — **G.Kh.**) - has had







the University was founded at Tanahat (Tanadeh) Monastery, some 5 km from here.

They say its construction started with the erection of St.Stepanos Cathedral (1273-79), center of the Tanahat Monastic Complex, that was also referred as Aghberc Monastery, Glidzor or Gaylidzor. Prominent Armenian scholars of various times such as *Gh. Alishan, G. Hovsepyan, L. Khachikyan, A. Movsissyan, A. Avetisyan*,

L. Khacheryan, P.Antabyan, Em. Pivazyan, S. Barkhudaryan, A. Abrahamyan, A. Matevosyan and I. Gharibyan dedicat-



Reliable sources said that the exam program at Gladzor University was focused on the so-called "seven liberal arts", grammar,

its own charter, educational degrees and graduation defense systems. The subjects included as much as mythology, theology, philosophy, manuscript writing, bibliography, grammar, rhetoric, logic, arithmetics, astrology, chronology, geometry (!!! – **G.Kh.**). Gladzor was also an important center of calligraphy where hundreds of manuscripts were created.

The University's Founder and its first Provost was a distinguished teacher *Nerses Mshetsi* Vardapet (i.e.

from the City of Mush, Western Armenia temporarily occupied by Turkey – **G.Kh.**) (theology, calligraphy) who was replaced

by Yessavi Nchetsi (grammar, historiography, calligraphy) in 1284. After Nchetsi's passing away in 1338, the new Provost Tiratur Kiliketsi (calligraphy and miniature painting) moved the Gladzor University to Hermon Monastery in Vayots Dzor. Then it

was moved to Vorotnavank and, finally, Tatev Monastery where the University was headed by respectively by Hovhan Vorotnetsi (philosophy, theology) and (the Great) Grigor Tatevatsi (philosophy, theology, calligraphy and miniature paintings).

In 2003 "Gladzor Universi-Historical-Cultural Museum-Preservation was organized exhibition of which included

Gladzor University is said to be the first multi-faculty university, older than Oxford



and Cambridge Universities (!!! - G.Kh.)

The University of Gladzor was active for over 70 years, it was created in the 12th century and was a major learning center for social-political, religious and philosophical thought in medieval Armenia. The fact that Gladzor University and its related schools were a center for the development of creative thought, shows why this museum is

so important to visit. It was world known and respected. The museum is a joy. We spent close to 2 hours perusing the beautiful displays. A young woman from the nearby university came from the house next door and was a wealth of information. She guided us through the exhibits and pointed out out many things we would have missed or not understood. The AMD500 admission is well worth it. It is open Tuesday-Sunday 10am to 5pm. Highly recommended. See my photos that prove it is a feast for your eyes.



a) Outdoor lighting system installed in Tsovak after 25 year break

Tsovak community had not had any outdoor lighting system since the collapse of

the Soviet Union. Over time, all the infrastructures had worn out.

The main occupation of the 3500 villagers is small and large cattle farming, bird









farming, potato and grain crops, vegetable, and fodder cultivation.

Archeological finds from 8-6th centuries BC revealed in Metsamor

Armenian-Polish working group of archeologists has restarted its excavations in Metsamor at September 1 and has already registered some results, Artsakhpress reports.

New rooms have been revealed in the municipal part of the territory, as well as graves, human skeletons, metal tools which are preliminary attributed to 8-6th centuries BC.

The archeologists try to trace the changes in the territory from the Late Bronze Age to the period of Achaemenides. According to the co-pilot of the expedition, the Head of the Institute of Archeology in the University of Warsaw, professor Krzysztof Jakubiak, Metsamor has an important role among the settlements of the Ararat Valley in this aspect.

"During the Early Iron Age Metsamor had been a city and was destroyed by the Urartians. Now graves are found, other finds are revealed, evidences of demolition are registered. They enrich our understanding of the influence of Argishti the First and the later Urartians on Metsamor", Jakubiak said.

At the moment anthropological materials are being studied, while the organic materials, such as charcoal and others, will be sent abroad for a laboratory study. It will help to date the finds correctly.

Professor Jakubiak participated in many archeological expeditions in Syria, Lebanon, Egypt and Iraq. "Armenia is a country which bears Christian-European values and it is



easy to work here. My Armenian colleagues have enough experience and knowledge. Armenian people are frank and friendly", he said.
