

President pays working visit to Aragatsotn

President of Armenia Serzh Sargsyan attended Byurakan Observatory of the National Academy of Sciences of the RA named after Victor Hambardzumyan, President's press service reports.

President Sargsyan got acquainted with the projects proposed by the Observatory for increasing the scientific and educational function of the Observatory and involvement of young workers that are aimed on stimulating also tourism in this region.

One of the propositions concerned a formation of a research and education centre the activity of which would focus on teaching astronomy by contemporary methods using a virtual observatory. The Observatory also plans to organize a visit centre that will contain a museum of astronomy history, a planetarium, a lecture centre, the lanes leading to the telescope and the surrounding territories will be improved.

During Serz Sargsyan's visit propositions of changes in the international scientific prize named after Victor Hambardzumyan were made that aim at making the prize more efficient for Armenia. According to the authors the



changes in the status of the prize will favor astronomical research in Armenia as well as will give the Armenian scientists the opportunity to integrate actively in the international scientific community.

Afterwards Serzh Sargsyan visited Ashtarak where he was present at the opening ceremony of a rebuilt and fundamentally repaired sport school for children and youth under the Armenian public sport organization "Sevan".

Accompanied by the representatives of the power structures of the city, sport community, trainers and students, President Sargsyan made an excursion in the school, got acquainted with the fulfilled work and the conditions created for training.

The reconstruction and repair of the sport school are implemented by the funds of state budget. The school will be available for about 350 sportsmen from Ashtarak and neighboring territories.

Bako Sahakyan re-elected President of Artsakh Republic



Artsakh's incumbent President Bako Sahakyan will retain office until 2020.

He was elected at a special sitting of the National Assembly with 28 votes

today.

Bako Sahakyan's candidacy was supported by Motherland, Democracy and ARF Dashnaktsutyun factions, as well as by Arsen Arstamyan – the only independent MP in the legislative body.

Four MPs cast their ballot in favor of the only other candidate –Edward Aghabekyan, nominated by Movement-88 faction.

Bako Sahakyan will remain in office until the term of the National Assembly of 6th convocation comes to an end in 2020.

According to the new Constitution adopted earlier this year, after 2020 the elections of the President and the National Assembly will be held simultaneously.

Armenia's President rules out unilateral concessions



"The OSCE Minsk Group Co-Chairs have no doubt as to which party is responsible for tension at the Line of contact," Armenian President Serzh Sargsyan said in an interview with R-Evolution program of Armenia TV.

He added, however, that "the Minsk Group is not almighty in a certain sense. "Any of the co-chairing countries is able to impose anything on Azerbaijan if it stems from its own interests. But it's hard to imagine Russia, France and the United States imposing their opinion on Azerbaijan," he added.

According to President Sargsyan, "compulsion is not always the best option, that's why the Co-Chairs oft for persuasion rather than harsh compulsion."

President Sargsyan reiterated Armenia's demand to create an investigation mechanism at the line of contact – a measure that had been agreed at Vienna and St. Petersburg summits.

"It's not only meant to reveal the party violating the ceasefire, but also investigate which officer or which soldier violated the ceasefire regime," the President said.

Serzh Sargsyan added that the mechanism

has not been implemented for the simple reason that Baku stands against it. "The refusal clearly indicates that they are the author of tension."

The President said "there has been no change in Armenia's principled stance after the four-day war in April 2016." He voiced confidence that there has not been any change in Azerbaijan's position, either."

"The April war simply showed that Azerbaijan refuses from solving the conflict on the basis of Madrid Principles," he said.

As for concessions, the President said "we have never spoken about any concessions over the past twenty years. We have always spoken and keep insisting on the resolution of the issue on the basis of mutual concessions."

President Sargsyan is confident that "the Armenian side will never think about easing the situation through unilateral concessions even if the settlement of the conflict drags out for another 20 years."

He said the targets of the Armenian side are obvious – realization of the Nagorno Karabakh Republic people's right to self-determination, land border between Nagorno Karabakh and Armenia, reliable security guarantees for the Nagorno Karabakh Republic.

Armenian FM briefs CSTO colleagues on efforts towards Karabakh peace

Armenian Foreign Minister Edward Nalbandian on July 17 briefed the Foreign Ministers of CSTO member states on the efforts of Armenia and the OSCE Minsk Group Co-Chairs towards furthering the process of settlement of the Karabakh conflict.

Armenia's top diplomat also presented Baku's actions aimed at frustrating those efforts, namely the refusal to implement the agreements reached in Vienna and St. Petersburg, military provocations and the subsequent escalation of the situation.

Edward Nalbandian presented Armenia's views on the developments in Syria, the programs of support for refugees that have found shelter in Armenia, as well as the details of provision of humanitarian aid to the people of Syria.

During the meeting the Foreign Ministers exchanged views on cooperation between CSTO and other regional and international

organizations.

The diplomats also referred to the process of implementation of provisions of the Yerevan Declaration adopted by the CSTO Collective Security Council in 2016, the priorities of the Belarusian presidency of the CSTO, issues affecting global and regional security, the situation in Central Asia and South Caucasus, as well as the developments in the Middle East and efforts towards establishing stability in Afghanistan.



Armenia to ratify new defense accord with Russia

The Armenian government paved the way on Thursday for the parliamentary ratification of an agreement with Russia to boost a joint Russian-Armenian military force that was created more than a decade ago.

Russian Defense Minister Sergey Shoygu and his Armenian counterpart Vigen Sargsyan signed the agreement on "the united group of troops of the two countries" after talks held in Moscow last November

The agreement clarifies and upgrades the mission of the joint force comprising troops from the Russian military base in Armenia and the Armenian army's Fifth Corps. In particular, it stipulates that the commander of the Russian-Armenian contingent will be appointed by the Armenian army's commander-in-chief.

Also, the commander will be subordinate to the chief of the Armenian army staff in times of peace. He may report to the head of Russia's Southern Military District in case of a war or imminent military aggression against Armenia or Russia.

"The main task of the United Group of Troops is to identify preparation of military aggression against Armenia and Russia in a timely manner and to repel it jointly with the armed forces of Armenia and Russia," Defense Minister Sargsyan said in November.

The deal was ratified by Russia's lower and upper houses of parliament on July 14 and July 19 respectively. Prime Minister Karen Karapetyan's government formally recommended its ratification by the Armenian parliament, which now seems a forgone conclusion.

Alexander Iskandarian, director of the Yerevan-based Caucasus



Institute, said that the signing of the Russian-Armenian accord was largely a formality that underscored close military ties between the two states.

"This agreement is one of the formats for comprehensive interaction between the Russian and Armenian armed forces which helps to ensure Armenia's protection against Turkey," Iskandarian told RFE/RL's Armenian service (Azatutyun.am). The Armenian military will thus be able to continue to concentrate on the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict, he said.

Another analyst, Armen Grigoryan, suggested that the deal was initiated by the Russians. He said they plan to use to increase "Russian influence in Armenia."

"Standard" International Triennial of Contemporary Art in Armenia opens for the first time

"Standard" International Triennial of Contemporary Art opens in the Republic of Armenia with the support of the RA Ministry of Culture, Arts for the World, Swiss Embassy in Armenia, and the Armenian Art Council, Ministry of Culture of Armenia's press service reports.

"Standard" emphasizes the rich historical and cultural environment in Armenia.

Standard is a Triennial art exhibition of Contemporary art that aims at involvement of broad and diverse layers of social space, creating opportunities for dialogue and collaboration among artists, writers, co-founders, scientists, local communities and visitors.

"Armenia has been a solid base for thinking and developing a project such as STANDART. The Biennial of Contemporary Art in Gyumri, the vibrant art realities in Yerevan, the Golden Lion that the Armenian Pavilion was awarded at the 56th Venice Biennale in 2015, and many other achievements of recent years made our task easier. The very name of the triennial is inspired by the avant-garde magazine published in 1924, called STANDARD (STANDART in Armenian transcription)", mentions Vartan Karapetyan, President of the Armenian Arts Council.

Adelina Jouberyan Phon Fürshtenberg has been chosen by the Armenian Arts Council as the principal curator for the first "Standard" Triennial. She is the curator of the Golden Lion awarded Pavilion of Armenia at the 56th Venice Biennale.

The idea of "Standard" is inspired by the French Surrealist writer and poet Rene Daumal's (1908-1944) unfinished novel "The Mount Analogue".

"As a symbol of a poetic research and temporary experience, "The Mount Analogue" is a meditation on the pursuit of knowledge – based on the concept that the essence of a creative mind is directly related to who one is and what one experiences. The result of this art experience is a series of art exhibitions, encounters and direct collaborations, site-specific works and performances", Vartan Karapetyan says.



Armenia needs Eurasian Union membership, insists Ruling Party

President Serzh Sargsyan's Republican Party (HHK) has dismissed an opposition leader's calls for Armenia to leave the Russian-led Eurasian Economic Union (EEU).

Edmon Marukyan, a pro-Western leader of the opposition Yelk alliance, advocated an exit from the EEU last week after Russia stopped recognizing the validity of driving licenses issued by Armenia and other countries where Russian is not an official language.

A Russian law which took effect on June 1 banned foreign nationals with driving licenses issued by their home countries from working as drivers in Russia. The State Duma, the Russian lower house of parliament, passed last week another law which waived the restriction for citizens of those countries, including EEU members Kyrgyzstan and Belarus, where the Russian language has an official status.

Marukyan said that the Russian laws run counter to EEU regulations on a common labor market set up by the bloc's member states. The EEU's executive body has reportedly given the same assessment, telling Moscow to scrap the ban on Armenian driving licenses.

Reacting to Marukyan's statements, HHK spokesman Eduard Sharmazanov said late on Thursday: "If there are political forces that agitate for the exit from the EEU, they had better come up with concrete alternatives and facts, rather than speak on the emotional plane."

Sharmazanov claimed that the Sargsyan administration's controversial decision to join the EEU was based on "clear calculations as to what our farmers, investors, tourism sector and the economy [as a whole] will gain." He said that the



Armenian economy has already benefited from better access to the Russian and other ex-Soviet markets.

"We have increased our exports by 23 percent [in 2017] and a large part of them went to EEU countries," Sharmazanov told reporters. "The number of tourists [visiting Armenia] has gone up by about 30 percent. We must not make political statements without serious corroborations."

Sargsyan unexpectedly announced his decision to seek membership in the EEU in September 2013 shortly after Armenia and the European Union completed negotiations on a far-reaching Association Agreement. The foreign policy U-turn, which scuttled the planned deal with the EU, was widely attributed to Russian pressure.

Marukyan's stance on the EEU has not yet been officially backed by Yelk's leadership. The bloc consisting of three opposition parties holds 9 seats in Armenia's 105-member parliament.

Lukashevich: Kasprzyk's Office should be expanded



There is a great need to expand the office of the Personal Representative of the OSCE Chairman-in-Office Andrzej Kasprzyk, to increase its monitoring capabilities on the contact line of troops, Russia's permanent representative to the

OSCE Alexander Lukashevich said during a Moscow-Vienna space bridge on July 19, APA reports.

"Unfortunately, such resolutions cannot be achieved due to the contradictory positions of the parties to the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict and the absence of a compromise," he said. "I think that in the near future it is hardly possible to do more than the OSCE Minsk Group does by actively working with the parties to the conflict."

He recalled that the co-chairs have recently held a meeting with the Azerbaijani and Armenian foreign ministers in Brussels.

"There are some suggestions that the presidents of these countries can meet. The OSCE Minsk Group co-chairs are actively working with the parties to the conflict, but the co-chairmen are not wizards, and they cannot establish the necessary level of security in the region. The first and foremost is to maintain the dialogue, to make sure the parties do not go over to military operations, to make sure no serious problem arises against the efforts to resolve this protracted conflict," added Lukashevich.

Russian-Armenian Investors said to finance first projects in Armenia

An investment fund set up recently by three dozen wealthy Russian entrepreneurs of Armenian descent will start financing business projects in Armenia this autumn, a senior government official in Yerevan said on July 17.

The fund called the Investors Club of Armenia (ICA) was officially set up in March at a ceremony in Yerevan attended by Prime Minister Karen Karapetyan. The latter has warm rapports with its key founders, notably the Armenian-born billionaire Samvel Karapetyan (no relation).

The Armenian government signed a memorandum of understanding with the ICA in April. Minister for Economic Development Suren Karayan said at the time that the fund's investments in the Armenian economy should total around \$300 million this year.

According to one of Karayan's deputies, Hovannes Azizyan, the ICO will likely launch its first investment projects in October or November. "The projects to be implemented by the Club will mainly target the areas of energy and renewable energy," he told a news conference. "Now discussions are underway on the possibility of the Club's involvement in some manufacturing sectors as well."

Azizyan said that the Russian-Armenian investors are particularly interested in hydropower and solar energy. The government, he said, expects them to finance, among other things, the construction of medium-sized hydroelectric plants.

One of those plants would be built in Samvel Karapetyan's native Lori province. The Armenian Energy Ministry estimates that work on the 76-megawatt facility would cost

roughly \$150 million.

Azizyan would not be drawn on the amount of funding which the ICA has set aside for its first projects. "When the projects are finalized we will give information about the investment package," he said.

Foreign direct investment in the Armenian economy has rapidly declined in recent years. Government data shows that it stood at a modest \$130 million in 2016.

Prime Minister Karapetyan has repeatedly promised to attract more than \$3 billion in investments in the coming years since he was appointed as prime minister in September. The former business executive, who lived and worked in Russia from 2011-2016, has said that at least \$830 million of the sum will be invested in 2017.

The Russian-Armenian businessmen voiced strong support for the 53-year-old premier's ambitious reform agenda when he paid an official visit to Moscow in January. Samvel Karapetyan reaffirmed that backing at the official launch of the ICA in March.

In addition to his extensive business interests in Russia, the tycoon owns Armenia's national electric utility, largest thermal power plant, and a shopping mall in Yerevan. His Tashir Group is due to open another sprawling trade center in the Armenian capital in September.

According to "Forbes" magazine estimates, Samvel Karapetyan's personal fortune is currently worth \$3.5billion, meaning that he is most probably the richest ethnic Armenian in the world.

President holds consultation on Armenian-Indian economic cooperation agenda



Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the Republic of Armenia to the Republic of India Armen Martirosyan reported on July 18 to President Serzh Sargsyan on the Armenian-Indian cooperation agenda and the steps taken to boost exchanges in the prospective areas.

Held as part of the series of consultations with the President of the Republic of Armenia on the economic component of Armenia's foreign policy, the meeting was attended by the heads of those ministries and government agencies responsible for coordination of cooperation in the areas of mutual interest.

Noting that this year marks the 25th anniversary of establishment of diplomatic relations between Armenia and India, the President considered it as a good opportunity to summarize the achievements and highlight the opportunities of bilateral cooperation, especially as the economic component is concerned.

According to President Sargsyan, all the necessary preconditions are in place in this respect, as the two countries have managed to turn the deeply-rooted friendly relations into strong ties of partnership over the past few years.

"Despite the present high level of the Armenian-Indian dialogue, which is anchored on strong historical ties and traditions, I think we have not yet fully tapped the potential inherent in these relations. India is one of the fastest growing economies in the world and, therefore, we need to advance the cooperation with that country, first and foremost, as regards the economic constituent. Indeed, the Armenian-Indian intergovernmental commission has a crucial role to play in this matter with updated and more targeted agenda items ranging from information technologies to agriculture, diamond processing and tourism.

We have several good examples of cooperation. Here, I would like to single out the Yerevan State University-hosted Armenian-Indian Center of Excellence for ITC ((Information and Telecommunications) technologies, which is doing a great job.

We are prioritizing the program of introduction of educational programs aimed at creating an integrated computer network between schools in Armenia as implemented in cooperation with India and the ITC Excellence Center.

Tavush and Vayots-Dzor Marzes will largely benefit from the connection to the Center's network of the hardware available in the local schools. Generally, a huge work has been done in India: they have built up a wealth of long experience and enjoy significant capacity in this area. Therefore, taking into account India's po-

tential, we should intensify cooperation in this field.

I also want to mention our cooperation in education and science. You may know that more than a thousand Indian students are currently studying in Armenia's universities. Along with mastering professional skills and knowledge in Armenia, they are getting acquainted with our culture and history. Back to their homeland, they will complement the ranks of our friends. This is a very important factor, and we have huge opportunities to develop cooperation in this direction.

Calling at the Yerevan State Medical University a few days ago, I got acquainted with their programs: they are prepared to increase the number of students here and expand cooperation in healthcare and education, in general.

I think we have considerable opportunities to cooperate in diamond cutting, jewelry, and we have to continue work in this direction. We should avail ourselves of the opportunity to cooperate in the field of pharmaceuticals, where India boasts great achievements. They are a major supplier, and we must show our capabilities to get them involved in the Armenian market.

We certainly have great potential of interaction in the field of agriculture. As far as I know, a working group is up, and reciprocated visits have been paid over the past few years. Here, too, cooperation can be effective, in particular, as regards agricultural machinery.

We must definitely endeavor towards the development of tourism. This country with a huge population may offer great opportunities in the field of tourism. Mr. Martirosyan, I am urging you to address these issues more thoroughly in your report. We must be sure of what we need to do in specific spheres so that we could avoid voicing such low figures next time: I mean in the sphere of trade, where the potential is too great," the President of Armenia said.

After hearing Ambassador Martirosyan's report, the President issued a number of recommendations, which will be included in the agenda of the Armenian-Indian intergovernmental commission.

Armenian IT growth hits record high

The rapid growth of Armenia's information technology (IT) sector employing thousands of engineers accelerated to 38.2 percent last, according to government data.

The tech industry had already expanded by an average of over 20 percent annually in the previous decade, making it the fast-est-growing sector of the Armenian economy. According to government estimates, the country's 500 or so mostly small and medium-sized IT firms earned over \$550 million in combined revenue in 2015.

The sector is dominated by the Armenian branches of U.S. tech giants like as Synopsys, National Instruments, Mentor Graphics and VMware. But its steady expansion is also increasingly driven by homegrown Armenian companies.

The most successful of these startups is PicsArt, one of the world's leading mobile photo editing and sharing applications. The company now has more than 350 employees in Armenia and boasts 90 million active monthly users worldwide.

Another, smaller startup founded in 2013 attracted \$5 million in funding from two U.S. venture capital firms earlier this year. The company called Teamable develops special software used by businesses for hiring skilled workers. Like PicsArt, Teamable has offices not only in Yerevan but also in San Francisco

Another Armenian firm, SoloLearn, won this month the Grand Prize of Facebook's annual "Apps of the Year" event, which attracted 900 submissions from 87 countries. SoloLearn offers a free online app for people interested in learning computer programming.

Karen Vartanyan, chairman of Armenia's Union of Information Technology Enterprises (UITE), stressed the growing importance of such startups. "Our local products are increasingly emerging and proving a success in the international market," he told RFE/RL's Armenian service (Azatutyun.am).

Vahan Shakaryan, the executive director of the Yerevan-based company Technology and Science Dynamics manufacturing smartphones and tablet computers, said the sector's has been rapidly developing because it is export-oriented. He also cautioned: "Booms are possible in economics. They key thing is to at least stay at the same level after they are over. It's quite a challenge."







For Vartanyan, the key challenge is a continuing lack of skilled IT personnel in Armenia. "Our growth is now stunted by a serious shortage of personnel," he said. "The education system is in tatters."

Industry executives have long complained about the inadequate professional level of many graduates of IT departments of Armenia universities. According to their estimates, there are now between 2,000 and 4,000 job vacancies in the sector employing about 15,000 people.

Successive Armenian governments have pledged to tackle this problem. Vartanyan in-

sisted, however, that there is still no "comprehensive, strategic cooperation" on the matter between the authorities and IT companies.

In January, Prime Minister Karen Karapetyan met with a team of government officials and tech executives that proposed a wide-ranging reform of engineering education in Armenia. One of those executives said only half of 1,300 IT students graduating from Armenian universities each year are qualified enough to work in the sector without undergoing further training

Aliyev Family's Financial Role in Shipping Weapons to Terrorists

Last week I wrote about the sensational revelations by Bulgarian investigative journalist Dilyana Gaytandzhieva in Trud newspaper, who reported on leaked documents that Azerbaijan's state-run Silk Way Airlines has shipped under diplomatic cover 350 planeloads of heavy weapons and ammunition to terrorist groups around the world during the last three years.

A report by Radio Free Europe's (RFE) Azeri investigative reporter Khadija Ismayilova, who has been jailed for her disclosures of Azerbaijan government's human rights abuses, has revealed in a 2010 report on President Ilham Aliyev's daughter, Arzu Aliyeva's part ownership of a company that is linked to Silk Way Airlines. This fact explains how the airline managed to get all the diplomatic clearances to ship such large quantities of weapons to terrorists.

It turns out that Silk Way Airlines belongs to SW Holding, a group of companies that "enjoys a near-complete monopoly of airline service," including mid-flight meals served by Sky Catering, and taxi service run by Airport Gate, both of which are owned by SW Holding. In addition, technical maintenance of the national carrier's planes and helicopters are carried out by Silkway Technics, and "multiple other companies controlling everything from Traveler assistance to ticket sales to duty-free stores are all owned by SW Holding," according to Ismayilova.

SW Holding also owns Silk Way Bank, which is owned by President Aliyev's then 21-year old daughter Arzu Aliyeva and Zarifa Hamzayeva, wife of president of Azerbaijan's AZAL state airline company, according to RFE's Azerbaijani service. Silk Way Airlines is also a part owner of the Silk Way Bank.

Interestingly, Ismayilova reports that "the rise of SW Holding, which has seamlessly absorbed many of AZAL's former businesses, has raised questions about dubious privatization practices in Aliyev's Azerbaijan. It also serves to underscore how the political elite continues to use close friends and family members to preserve its hold on the country's most valuable assets—despite Azerbaijani laws that list nepotism by state officials as an offense punishable by up to 12 years in jail."

President Ilham Aliyev is simply continuing the practice started by his father Heydar Aliyev, who after ruling Azerbaijan for two decades passed the Presidential baton to his son. In a constitutional referendum in 2009, term limits on the President were abolished making Ilham Aliyev President for Life. Not to take any chances, he recently appointed his wife, Mehriban Aliyeva, as Vice President, to become his possible successor.

As I had reported earlier, based on an article in The Washington Post, President Aliyev's preteen son, Heydar, was the legal owner of nine luxury mansions in Dubai purchased for \$44 million. President's two daughters, Arzu and Leyla, also own property in Dubai. The three children together own property in Dubai worth \$75 million. Obviously this is not money they earned nor did their parents. President Aliyev's annual salary is \$230,000. Ismayilova estimates President Alyev's wealth to be "in tens of millions of dollars." This is surely an underestimate, given

the lack of concrete figures. However, just the fact that Aliyev's three children own property in Dubai worth \$75 million, President Aliyev's wealth could be safely estimated to be in the hundreds of millions of dollars if not in the billions of dollars! Contrary to Azerbaijani law, neither President Aliyev nor his wife have declared their net worth.

Under Azerbaijani law, public officials are prohibited from owning businesses, while family members are exempt from this restriction, a loophole exploited by the Aliyevs to hide their earnings in their children's holdings. Just Arzu Aliyeva's part ownership of the Silk Way Bank is worth over \$12 million. According to RFE, "presidential secretary Azer Gasimov confirmed that Arzu Aliyeva was one of the owners of the Silk Way Bank."

Gulu Khalilov, the spokesperson for the State Committee on Privatization of State Property, told RFE that he had no information on the privatization of AZAL, the state airline company, including its holdings, like AZAL Bank. RFE was told that none of the legal procedures for privatization were followed.

"In the meantime, SW Holding has slowly but steadily acquired nearly all of AZAL's former companies, including the insurance firm AZAL Sigorta, which is now co-owned by SW Holding and the two daughters of Jahangir Asgarov, the president of AZAL and the husband of Zarifa Hamzayeva, the current co-owner of Silk Way Bank," according to Ismayilova. "SW Holding has also been the sole contractor on a number of high-profile AZAL projects, including airport-construction deals in Lankaran, Ganja, and Zagatala worth a total of \$150 million."

President Aliyev and his family must be held responsible as part owners of a state-run airline that ships sophisticated weapons to terrorists around the world. On July 7-8, 10-11, 12-13 and 17-18,

four rescue squads of the Center of Conducting Special Purpose Rescue Operations of the RS Rescue Forces Department of the RA MES conducted overnight campaigns to Mount Ara, on topic "Organization and implementation of search and rescue operations in the mountains".

The purpose of the campaigns was to improve the knowledge and practical skills of rescuers in difficult relief conditions.

In the highlands, forty-three rescuers carried out search and rescue operations, moving across various mountain landscapes, and after making long passes and overcoming difficult places including river crossings. Through group support, rock climbing, rising and landing with the injured was carried out, overnight stay by setting up tents and livelihood implementation was organized.

The RA Ministry of Emergency Situations regularly organizes

similar drill-campaigns, highlighting the preparedness of the rescuers for any difficult situation and, if necessary, providing timely assistance to mountaineers. Often, mountain tourism participants lag behind the group or get lost and being unable to orientate in an unfamiliar location, they get into panic.

The drill-campaigns allow the rescuers to quickly conduct search operations

in familiar site and take the lost citizens to a safe place.

In the near future, it is also planned to organize a campaign-drills to Mount Aragats.





Makaravank Monastery: One of the Most Significant Architectural Complexes of Medieval Armenia

Makaravank is a 10th-13th century church complex adjacent to the Achajur village of Tavush Province of Armenia (with the town of Ijevan as the province center, 150 km away Yerevan) located on the slope of Paitatap Mountain.

Makaravank Monastery is one of the most significant architectural complexes of medieval Armenia. The Monastery consists of four churches and a gavit (entrance hall) that was surrounded by high defense walls in the past.



There are also two cemeteries, arched gates, fountain and ruins of many other premises in the Monastery's yard.

From the 14th century this Monastery has stopped serving religious services due to unknown reasons, and, according to specialists, this was the first time when a Monastery stopped serving.

The oldest structure there is Makaravank's 10th century cross-winged domed church with annexes in the corners which differs from the ordinary structures of this type by rich carved ornamentation on the wall of the altar dais and on the framings of the main windows of the interior.

Why the Monastery called Makaravank? According to a legend, church was built by a master named *Makar* and his only son. Son was a mason and the father – a builder. As the church walls were becoming higher and higher, one day the Master decided not to go down from the walls so to sleep on the church walls. One day Makar noticed that the stones were of different size and decorations were poorer than those he was getting before. He decided to ask the son what was the reason, but someone down answered that the son was sick. Makar demanded to bring his son to him, no matter in what condition the latter was, but they did not fulfill the demand. So he realized that his son was already dead and threw himself down from the wall. He was buried under a wall of the

church that remained unfinished, and from that time they started to call the Monastery Makarayank

There is also another legend according to which the Monastery was once called *Agravavank* ("Monastery of Ravens").

The story has it that one day, when the workers (or monks-?) of the Monastery were having lunch, a snake sneaked into the soup. At that minute a raven was flying above them, and it saw the snake and tried to warn the men about danger. The men, however, didn't understand the raven's warning. And then "heroic" raven flew down like a stone and threw itself straight into the boiling soup. Only after cleaning the pans they found the snake. That is why they called the Monastery after the bird who saved their lives by sacrificing its own.

The oldest church in Makaravank Monas-



tery built with red tufa stone was established in the 8-9th centuries.

To the east from this church Abbot *Hovhannes* built St. Astvatsatsin (Holy Mother of God) Church in 1198, in memory of his parents and brothers. There is a carving inside a small circle on St. Astvatsatsin church wall, - a man's face depicted there. It is said to be Master Makar's face, however there is another version, according to which the image resembles Jesus Christ.

This church has unique high-relief sculptures depicting birds, lions as well as a battle between an eagle and a dragon.

To the north from the church ruins of an ancient small chapel could be found.

The main church of the Monastery was built in 1205 by *Vardan*, son of Prince *Bazaz*. This church is also richly decorated from the interior with eight-pointed stars and octagons between them arranged in two rows, covered with various floral motifs, creating unusual bouquets, all kinds of fishes and birds and also sphinxes and sirens.

They are considered to be unique examples of the architecture in the medieval Armenia.

The shield of Prince *Vache Vachutian* who built the gavit in 1224, is also unique and depicts two eagles. Passing through the gate in the circuit wall, the gavit is on the left. The facade of the gavit bears sculptures of a sphinx and a lion fighting a bull.

In the Monastery's yard a big stone with a

round hole can be found. They say this stone a magic as it is believed that here all dreams come true when someone passes through the stone.

There is a small picnic area not far away from the Monastery. Visitors can bring their own food and have a nice time in the wonderful forest.

In terms of its architectural style, the Monastery is similar to Gandzasar, Noravank, Aghtamar, and a number of other churches.

The best time to visit Makaravank is in late spring or in summer when the forest is blossoming.
